CINCINNATI OPEN TALKING POINTS

- World No. 1 and defending champion Jannik Sinner attempts to extend his 23-match winning streak on hard courts as Italian, who turns 24 on Saturday, meets Adrian Mannarino. Sinner is also on a 20-match winning streak vs. Frenchmen and aims to advance to his 5th quarter-final of 2025. Mannarino bids to be 1st Frenchman to defeat a World No. 1 since Monfils d. No. 1 Medvedev at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells.
- No. 2 seed Carlos Alcaraz leads the ATP Tour in wins (50) and titles (5) this season and faces lucky loser Luca Nardi. 22-year-old, who reached the final in his last six events, aims to tie Bruguera for 4th-most ATP Masters 1000 QFs among Spaniards in series history and pass Musetti to hold most ATP Masters 1000 wins this season. Nardi seeks 2nd Top 10 win of career after defeating No. 1 Djokovic at 2024 Indian Wells as LL and bids to be the first man to defeat Alcaraz before the final since Goffin in Miami 2R in March.

- German Alexander Zverev's third-round match vs. Brandon Nakashima was suspended due to rain
 yesterday, just before Zverev served for the match at 6-4 *5-4. If 28-year-old Zverev closes it out and ties
 Roddick for 10th-most ATP Masters 1000 wins in series history (157), he would return to Grandstand later
 today, as he seeks revenge in a rematch of last week's Toronto SF vs. World No. 12 Karen Khachanov.
- There are seven fourth-round matches scheduled on Wednesday, while American No. 2 Ben Shelton meets
 Roberto Bautista Agut in a third-round encounter that was initially scheduled in P&G Center Court's night
 session on Tuesday. Shelton is on a 7-match winning streak after capturing his 1st ATP Masters 1000 title in
 Toronto last week. No. 22 Jiri Lehecka awaits the winner in the only 4R match scheduled on Thursday.
- In a rematch of their **Cincinnati Open** SF last year, American No. 3 **Frances Tiafoe** meets World No. 9 **Holger Rune**. Tiafoe saved 2 MPs to win that match, advancing to his 1st ATP Masters 1000 final and becoming first American men's finalist in Cincinnati since Isner in 2013. Rune seeks his 100th hard-court win and 1st Top 20 win since beating No. 2 Alcaraz in Barcelona final, Spaniard's sole loss on clay in 2025 (22-1).
- World No. 4 Taylor Fritz takes on qualifier Terence Atmane, as Fritz, who is the only player to reach R16 at all 4 ATP Masters 1000 events on hard courts this season, aims to be the fourth American man to reach 3+ Cincinnati Open QFs in this century after Roddick (6), Fish (4) and Isner (3). World No. 136 Atmane bids to be lowest-ranked man to earn a Top-5 win since No. 276 Monfils defeated No. 4 Tsitsipas at 2023 Montreal.
- Also on Court 3, 2021 finalist and World No. 11 Andrey Rublev takes a 0-1 Lexus ATP Head2Head deficit into his fourth-round match vs. Argentine Francisco Comesana. Comesana defeated Rublev in Wimbledon 1R last year and will attempt to advance to his 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF. World No. 28 Felix Auger-Aliassime meets Benjamin Bonzi, as Canadian No. 1 looks to join Alcaraz and Sinner as only men born in 2000s to reach 10 ATP Masters 1000 QFs with Rune also attempting to reach his 10th QF on Wednesday.

Frances Tiafoe | Age: 27 | World No. 14 | Career-High No. 10 | 2025: 24-17 (Houston Final) | Cincinnati: 13-8 ('24 F) > Former World No. 2 junior achieved career-high No. 10 in June 2023 after lifting 3rd title in Stuttgart, saving 1 MP vs. Struff in the final to own ATP Tour titles on clay, grass and hard courts.

- > Joined Fritz in Top 10 to be 1st American duo in Top 10 of PIF ATP Rankings since Fish and Isner in May 2012.
- > Defeated 4-time champion Nadal en route to 2022 US Open SF, becoming that event's 1st American men's semifinalist since Roddick in 2006 and returned to US Open SF in 2024, losing to Fritz in all-American match.
- > Rallied from 3-5 in third set and saved 2 MPs vs. Rune to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at 2024 Cincinnati.
- > Won 1st ATP Tour title as 20-year-old at 2018 Delray Beach and remains youngest American champion since Roddick, 19, at 2002 Houston and 2nd ATP Tour title at 2023 Houston.
- > Parents emigrated from Sierra Leone in 1996 and father was Head of Maintenance at Junior Tennis Champions Center in Maryland, where Frances and his twin brother Franklin trained as kids.

NOTE: Tiafoe seeks his fifth ATP Masters 1000 QF, first since reaching Cincinnati final last year (I. to Sinner). He is 13-39 vs. Top 10, 0-3 in 2025, aiming to earn first Top 10 win since defeating No. 5 Medvedev at Laver Cup last September. Last year, he saved 2 match points vs. Rune in SF to reach his 1st ATP Masters 1000 final.

Holger Rune | Age: 22 | World No. 9 | Career-High No. 4 | 2025: 26-15 (Barcelona Title) | Cincinnati: 6-3 (2024 SF) > Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 100 in January 2022, Top 50 in May 2022 and Top 10 in November 2022, becoming highest-ranked Dane in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), peaking at No. 4 in August 2023.

- > Captured 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Paris title at age 19 by becoming 1st player since start of ATP Tour in 1990 to earn 5 Top-10 wins at an event other than Nitto ATP Finals.
- > From 2022 Paris to 2023 Rome, compiled an 18-5 record in 6 ATP Masters 1000 events, also posting runner-up results in Monte-Carlo and Rome.
- > Went on a 7-match winning streak vs. Top 5 opponents for 7-1 start to career vs. Top 5 (now 8-14), including wins over No. 1 Alcaraz at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Paris and No. 1 Djokovic at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome.
- > Ended 2022 season on 19-2 run (2-2 in finals) after going 1-6 from January-February and 0-7 from June-July.
- > Upset 2021 finalist Tsitsipas at 2022 Roland Garros to become 1st Danish man to reach QF in tournament history (since 1925) and to reach any Grand Slam QF in Open Era (since 1968).

NOTE: Rune aims to record 100th hard-court win of his career (99-58) to become 2nd Dane to achieve the feat in Open Era (Carlsen - 164). He seeks 10th ATP Masters 1000 QF (6-3), second of 2025 after run to Indian Wells final. He is down to No. 11 on PIF ATP Live Rankings and needs to reach SF for a chance to remain inside Top 10.

Jannik Sinner | Age: 23 | World No. 1 (Career-High) | 2025: 28-3 (2 Titles) | Cincinnati: 9-3 (2024 Title)

- > Unranked to begin 2018, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager, broke into Top 10 at age 20 in 2021 and became 1st Italian World No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 22 in 2024, remaining at top of rankings since (61 weeks).
- > At 2024 Australian Open, defeated 10-time champion Djokovic in SF and rallied from 2 sets down in final vs. Medvedev to be 2nd Italian men's singles Grand Slam champion in Open Era (Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros).
- > Joined Federer at 2003-04 Wimbledon and Nadal at 2005-06 Roland Garros as only men this century to successfully defend 1st Grand Slam title at 2024 Australian Open.
- > Captured 2024 US Open title to join Djokovic, Federer and Wilander as only players to win both hard court Grand Slam titles in a season.
- > Became 11th man in Open Era to reach singles finals of all 4 Grand Slams and stopped Alcaraz's 20-match winning streak at the event to win 2025 Wimbledon title after missing 3 match points in 2025 Roland Garros final vs. Alcaraz.
- > Boasts most titles of any Italian in Open Era (20), including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2023 Toronto, 2024 Miami, 2024 Cincinnati and 2024 Shanghai.
- > Led Italy to 2023 and 2024 Davis Cup titles, first since 1976, became 1st Italian to win Nitto ATP Finals title in Turin in 2024 and Next Gen ATP Finals title in Milan in 2019.

NOTE: Sinner is on a 9-match winning streak after winning Wimbledon in July and 6-match winning streak in Cincinnati after winning last year's title. He is 38-0 vs. players ranked outside Top 50 since losing to No. 66 Lajovic in Cincinnati 2R two years ago on Italian's 22nd birthday and seeks 16th ATP Masters 1000 QF (11-4).

Adrian Mannarino | Age: 37 | World No. 89 | Career-High No. 17 | 2025: 8-9 (Cincinnati 4R) | Cincinnati: 11-9 ('23 QF) > Ended 12 straight years in Top 75 of PIF ATP Rankings (2013-24) and became the oldest man to break into Top 20 at age 35 in PIF ATP Rankings history, achieving career-high No. 17 in January 2024.

- > Captured 1st ATP Tour title in 7th final of career at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch, 2nd title in 11th final of career at 2022 Winston-Salem.
- > Posted personal-best 43 wins in 2023, highlighted by ATP Tour titles in Newport, Astana and Sofia.
- > Earned first Top 5 win over No. 5 Cilic to reach biggest final of career at 2017 Tokyo and biggest win of career over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch.
- > Reached Australian Open 4R in 2022 and 2024 and Wimbledon 4R in 2013, 2017 and 2018, but owns 0-22 record vs. Top-10 players at Grand Slams.

NOTE: Mannarino is 0-2 vs. World No. 1s in his career, aiming to become the second oldest player to defeat a World No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973). He attempts to advance to his 3rd ATP Masters 1000 QF after 2017 Montreal and 2023 Cincinnati. He is No. 71 on <u>PIF ATP Live Rankings</u> and would rise to No. 63 with a win.

- > Broke into Top 200 in April 2022, Top 100 in March 2024, then achieved a career-high No. 67 in March 2025 after advancing to 1st ATP Tour QF in Dubai as LL.
- > Entered 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells as No. 123-ranked LL to become lowest-ranked player to defeat No.
- 1 Djokovic at an ATP Masters 1000 or Grand Slam event in his career.
- > Earned 1st ATP Tour win at 2022 Astana as Q after appearing in main draws of 2020 Antwerp as Q, 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Rome as WC and 2022 Hamburg as Q.
- > Owns 98-66 Challenger record (7-4 in finals), winning 1st title on home soil at 2022 Forli-1.
- > Coming from same hometown as Moto GP legend Valentino Rossi, he notes riding motorcycles as his biggest passion outside tennis.

NOTE: Nardi lost to Blockx in Q2 and now plays in his 2nd ATP Masters 1000 4R after 2024 Indian Wells, also as LL (I. to Paul). He is 1-4 vs. Top 10, defeating No. 1 Djokovic in 2024 Indian Wells 3R. He attempts to become second lucky loser to reach ATP Masters 1000 QF this year (Diallo in Madrid) and sixth in men's tournament history.

Carlos Alcaraz | Age: 22 | World No. 2 | Career-High No. 1 | 2025: 50-6 (5 Titles) | Cincinnati: 8-4 (2023 Final)

- > Youngest and first teenage World No. 1 and year-end No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), making record rise from No. 32 at end of 2021 to No. 1 at age 19 in September 2022, earning total of 36 weeks.
- > Beat Ruud in 2022 US Open final for No. 1 ranking, becoming youngest men's champion at US Open since Sampras, 19, in 1990 and at any Grand Slam event since Nadal, 19, at 2005 Roland Garros.
- > Won 2024 Roland Garros to become youngest man to win Grand Slam titles on all three surfaces and saved 3 championship points in longest final in tournament history to defend the title at 2025 Roland Garros.
- > Defeated 7-time champion Djokovic in 2023 and 2024 Wimbledon finals to be 2nd man in Open Era to win 1st four Grand Slam finals and became youngest Olympic men's finalist since 1904, earning silver medal at Paris Olympics.
- > Youngest player to defeat both Nadal and Djokovic and 1st to do so at same clay-court event, beating them on back-to-back days en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2022 Madrid.

NOTE: Alcaraz is on a 13-match winning streak at ATP Masters 1000 level after titles in Monte-Carlo and Rome earlier this year and is on a 35-2 run since April. He is 10-0 vs. players younger than him in professional matches and 16-1 vs. Italians since the start of 2024 season, lone loss to No. 1 Sinner in Wimbledon final this July.

Brandon Nakashima | Age: 24 | World No. 31 | Career-High No. 29 | 2025: 25-20 (2 SFs) | Cincinnati: 3-4 ('24-'25 3R) > Former World No. 3 junior broke into Top 50 in July 2022 and achieved career-high No. 29 in May 2025 after earning 100th career win en route to his biggest SF of career in Acapulco.

- > Defeated countryman Giron to win 1st ATP Tour title in hometown of San Diego in 2022 and ended season on 16-1 run in tiebreaks.
- > Played in back-to-back ATP Tour finals at Los Cabos and Atlanta as 19-year-old in 2021, becoming youngest American to reach multiple finals since Roddick in 2001-02.
- > Returned to Milan and went 5-0 to capture 2022 Next Gen ATP Finals title after reaching SF in 2021.

NOTE: Nakashima seeks biggest win of career and is 2-15 vs. Top 10 (1-4 vs. Top 5), defeating No. 5 Rune at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai and No. 8 Rublev at 2024 Barcelona (0-9 since). He aims to avoid 5th consecutive loss vs. an opponent for 2nd time (0-5 vs. Shelton) to reach his 6th ATP Masters 1000 R16, but still seeks 1st QF.

- > Rallied from a set down in both SF and final for 1st time in career at 2023 Monte-Carlo to capture 1st ATP Masters 1000 title and defeated two-time defending champion No. 3 Alcaraz en route to 2nd title at 2024 Madrid.
- > Defeated No. 3 Nadal at 2021 Monte-Carlo, No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Cincinnati and No. 1 Sinner at 2024 Montreal en route to ATP Masters 1000 finals and beat No. 1 Djokovic for 11th of 17 ATP Tour titles at 2022 Belgrade.
- > Led tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.
- > Ten-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist reached 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF and won gold medal in All-ROC mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).
- > Went 9-1 in singles and 4-1 in doubles at team events during 2021 season, sweeping titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

NOTE: Rublev seeks 15th ATP Masters 1000 QF (9-5), second of the season after run to Toronto QF last week. He could join Djokovic (11), Raonic (5), Medvedev (4) and Wawrinka (4) as only active players to reach 4+ men's singles QFs at this event (also Zverev) after playing in last 8 stage in Cincinnati in 2019, 2021 and 2024.
