Raphael Collignon | Age: 23 | World No. 122 | Career-High No. 119 | 2025: 0-0 | Marseille: 0-0 (Debut)

- > Achieved career-high No. 119 in January 2025 after winning his 2nd Challenger title in Lyon in November.
- > Made his tour-level debut in 2024 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage, losing to van de Zandschulp and Fonseca.
- > Defeated No. 84 van de Zandschulp to win 1st Challenger title at 2024 Luedenscheid and No. 97 Coric en route to 2nd title at Lyon (Décines-Charpieu).
- > Coached by Belgium's Davis Cup captain and former World No. 38 Steve Darcis.
- > Owns 105-42 ITF Tour record with 8 titles, 7 on clay at the M25 level (2022 Arlon, 2022 Marburg, 2022, 2024 Koksijde, 2024 Hammamet, 2024 Angers, and 2024 Kassel) and 1 on hard courts (2022 M15 Monastir).

**NOTE**: Collignon seeks his first tour-level win after losing to van de Zandschulp & Fonseca at 2024 Davis Cup and Fucsovics at 2024 Antwerp as WC. He looks for first win across all levels in 2025 (0-3).

**Hamad Medjedovic** | Age: 21 | World No. 96 | Career-High No. 94 | 2025: 1-1 (Davis Cup) | Marseille: 0-0 (Debut) > 2023 Next Gen ATP Finals champion broke into Top 100 in January 2025 after opting to miss Australian Open Q to win Challenger title at Oeiras-1 and achieved career-high No. 94.

- > Came through qualifying and upset 2015 champion Thiem en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2023 Gstaad and defeated countryman Djere to reach 1st ATP Tour final in Belgrade as WC.
- > Qualified for Grand Slam main draws at Roland Garros in 2023 and 2024, 2023 Wimbledon and 2024 US Open.
- > Owns 51-31 Challenger record (5-1 in finals) and joined Djokovic and Tipsarevic as 3rd Serbian teenager to win 3 Challenger titles, doing so at 2022 Luedenscheid, 2023 Szekesfehervar and 2023 Mauthausen.
- > Achieved career-high No. 9 in junior rankings after winning titles without dropping a set at 2019 Berlin Grade 1 and 2019 New Delhi Grade 2.

**NOTE:** Medjedovic made his lone final in most recent ATP Tour appearance at 2024 Belgrade (I. to Shapovalov) and claimed an indoor Challenger title at Oeiras-1 last month (d. Draxl). He would be the first Serbian match winner in Marseille since Krajinovic in 2018 (I. to Pouille in QF).

#### Otto Virtanen (FIN) vs [5] Sebastian Korda (USA)

First Meeting

Otto Virtanen | Age: 23 | World No. 98 | Career-High No. 91 | 2025: 0-2 (Aus. Open 1R) | Marseille: 0-0 (Debut) > Former Top 10 junior broke into Top 200 in November 2022 and Top 100 in October 2024 after saving 3 MPs to win 6th Challenger title in Brest and achieved career-high No. 91 in November 2024.

- > Made tour-level debut playing for Finland at 2020 Davis Cup, earning 1st 8 tour-level wins in Davis Cup play, including wins over No. 39 McDonald and No. 68 van de Zandschulp to lead Finland into 2023 SF.
- > Qualified for US Open in 2023 and 2024 and Wimbledon in 2024, earning 1st Grand Slam main draw win by defeating Purcell in Wimbledon 1R, then lost to No. 13 Paul in 5th set.
- > Owns 74-47 Challenger record (6-0 in finals), including 3 titles in 2024, in Pau, Lugano and Brest.
- > For 1st Challenger title at 2022 Bergamo, defeated current Top 50 players Zhang in 2R, Borges in SF and Struff in final
- > Peaked at No. 6 in juniors in 2018 after capturing 2018 Orange Bowl singles title and 2018 Wimbledon boys' doubles title w/Erel.

**NOTE**: Virtanen seeks biggest win of his career (0-5 vs. Top 30, defeated No. 39 McDonald and No. 47 Borges in Davis Cup indoor matches). He reached all 6 Challenger finals indoors and seeks 1st ATP Tour win since defeating Fognini in Almaty in October (I. to Khachanov in 2R).

**Sebastian Korda** | Age: 24 | World No. 23 | Career-High No. 15 | 2025: 3-2 (Adelaide Final) | Marseille: 1-1 (2024 2R) > Achieved career-high No. 15 in August 2024, joining Petr Korda (No. 2 in 1998) to become only father-son duo to rank inside Top 20 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973).

- > Earned biggest wins of career en route to ATP Masters 1000 SFs over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 Shanghai and No. 4 Zverev at 2024 Montreal.
- > Did not drop a set en route to 2021 Parma title, then captured 2024 Washington title, 32 years after his father, Petr, won in 1992, becoming 1st father-son duo to win the same ATP Tour event.

- > Advanced to 2020 Roland Garros 4R as Q and 2021 Wimbledon 4R, becoming 3rd men's player in Open Era to reach 4R in debut at both events (Borg in 1973, Pernfors in 1986).
- > Became World No. 1 junior by winning 2018 Australian Open boys' singles title 20 years after his father won Australian Open men's singles title.
- > Father, Petr, peaked at No. 2 on ATP Tour; mother, Regina, peaked at No. 26 in WTA; sister, Nelly, became World No. 1 women's golfer in 2021; sister, Jessica, peaked at No. 8 in women's golf.

**NOTE**: Korda reached 3 of his 9 ATP Tour finals indoors (2022 Gijon, 2022 Antwerp, 2023 Astana) and seeks 1st indoor ATP Tour win since defeating No. 155 Grenier in Marseille 1R last year in tournament debut (I. to No. 13 Dimitrov in 2R).

# [7] Lorenzo Sonego (ITA) vs Botic van de Zandschulp (NED) First Tour-Level Meeting Other Meeting

24 ATP Masters 1000 Paris Q (France) Hard Q1 Lorenzo Sonego 6-3 5-7 7-5

**Lorenzo Sonego** | Age: 29 | World No. 35 | Career-High No. 21 | 2025: 6-4 (Aus. Open QF) | Marseille: 0-0 (Debut) > Earned personal-best 30 wins and achieved career-high No. 21 in 2021, sweeping Cagliari titles to become 1st Italian champion on home soil in singles since 2006 and in doubles since 2005 (w/Vavassori).

- > Broke into Top 50 after saving championship point vs. Kecmanovic to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Antalya.
- > At 2025 Australian Open, beat former champion Wawrinka and 2024 Next Gen ATP finalists Fonseca and Tien en route to 1st Grand Slam QF at age 29, to be oldest Italian quarter-finalist since Mulligan at 1970 Roland Garros.
- > Did not drop a set en route to 3rd singles title of career at 2022 Metz, including wins over former champions Simon and Hurkacz.
- > Upset No. 1 Djokovic 6-2 6-1 en route to 2020 Vienna final, becoming 1st lucky loser to defeat Djokovic and equaling fewest games ever conceded to Djokovic in a match.
- > Saved 1 MP vs. Thiem en route to 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Rome SF, becoming 1st Italian semi-finalist at Foro Italico since 2007 and 2nd since 1978.

**NOTE**: Sonego is on an 8-match winning streak vs. players ranked outside Top 50 (including ATP Tour qualifying) since losing to No. 102 Shapovalov at ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai and including win over No. 67 van de Zandschulp in ATP Masters 1000 Paris Q1. He is debuting in Marseille but won an indoor title in France at 2022 Metz (d. Bublik).

**Botic van de Zandschulp** | Age: 29 | World No. 85 | Career-High No. 22 | 2025: 0-3 (3x 1R) | Event: 0-0 (Debut) > Achieved new career-high ranking 14 times in 2022, peaking at No. 22 in August and ending 2nd straight season as No. 1 Dutchman.

- > At 2021 US Open, became 3rd men's qualifier to reach US Open QF in Open Era, 1st Dutchman to reach Grand Slam QF since 2004, and only player to take a set off eventual champion Medvedev.
- > In 2024, posted upsets over No. 3 Alcaraz in US Open 2R for biggest win of career and Nadal in Davis Cup Finals to end former World No. 1's career and help Netherlands advance to 1st Davis Cup final in history (since 1900).
- > In Munich, upset No. 7 Ruud en route to 1st ATP Tour final in 2022 and No. 10 Fritz to reach 2nd final in 2023, before squandering 4 championship points in 2023 final and losing to Rune on both occasions.
- > Went 11-1 in Grand Slam qualifying matches in 2021, qualifying at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open, while entering Wimbledon as LL (I. to Trungelliti in Q3).

**NOTE**: Van de Zandschulp aims to record his first win of 2025 and first since defeating Nadal and Altmaier to help Netherlands reach first Davis Cup final. He is 5-22 vs. Top 50 on tour-level since the start of 2024 season, including win over No. 3 Alcaraz at the US Open.
