LEXUS ATP HEAD2HEAD: TUESDAY SINGLES MATCHES

CENTER COURT

1R: [Q] Mackenzie McDonald (USA) vs Tomas Martin Etcheverry (ARG) First Meeting

Mackenzie McDonald | Age: 30 | World No. 110 | Career-High No. 37 | 2025: 10-16 (9x 2R) | Career: 115-141 (1 Final)

> Broke into Top 50 in February 2022 and achieved career-high No. 37 in October 2023 after undergoing right hamstring surgery in 2019 and falling out of Top 250 in 2020.

> Defeated former champions Kyrgios and Nishikori en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2021 Washington, then won 1st ATP Tour title in doubles at 2022 Tokyo w/Melo.

> Upset defending champion and World No. 2 Nadal in 2023 Australian Open 2R for biggest win of career and No. 7 Rublev en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Toronto.

> Advanced to 2018 Wimbledon 4R as No. 103 and 2021 Australian Open 4R as No. 192, becoming lowest-ranked player in Australian Open 4R since No. 248 Canas in 2004.

> Qualified for 2013 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati at age 18 by defeating USC legend Johnson, then went on to win 2016 NCAA singles and doubles titles for UCLA.

NOTE: McDonald seeks third Top 60 win of the season (2-11) after defeating No. 39 Davidovich Fokina in ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells 1R in March and No. 42 Monfils in London/Queen's Club 1R in June. American rallied from a set down to defeat both Trungelliti in Q1 and Mochizuki in Q2 and qualify for an ATP Tour event for 5th time in 2025.

T. M. Etcheverry | Age: 26 | World No. 60 | Career-High No. 27 | 2025: 24-29 (Hamburg SF) | Career: 89-101 (3 Finals)

> Former World No. 12 junior broke into Top 200 in June 2021 and Top 100 in April 2022, achieving career-high No. 27 in February 2024.

> At 2023 Roland Garros, earned 1st two Top 20 wins of career over No. 19 de Minaur in 2R and No. 16 Coric in 3R and reached the quarter-finals without losing a set.

> Defeated clay-court champions Fognini, F. Cerundolo, Lajovic and Baez en route to 1st ATP Tour final at Santiago and J. Cerundolo and Garin en route to 2nd ATP Tour final at 2023 Houston.

> Earned personal-best 31 wins in 2024, highlighted by Lyon final, where he held 1 MP against Mpetshi Perricard.

> Posted Challenger records of 49-19 in 2021 and 41-16 in 2022, highlighted by clay-court titles at 2021 Perugia, 2021 Trieste and 2022 Concepcion-2.

NOTE: Etcheverry bids to be the second Argentine to record 25 wins this season after F. Cerundolo (38) to achieve the feat for third straight year (30 in 2023, 31 in 2024). He is 7-0 vs. players ranked outside Top 50 on hard courts since July and owns 3-12 record vs. Americans on tour-level, including 1-7 on hard courts in his career.

2R: Sebastian Korda (USA) vs Damir Dzumhur (BIH)

First Meeting

Sebastian Korda | Age: 25 | World No. 52 | Career-High No. 15 | 2025: 20-17 (Adelaide Final) | Career: 145-96 (2 Titles)

> Achieved career-high No. 15 in August 2024, joining Petr Korda (No. 2 in 1998) to become only father-son duo to rank inside Top 20 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973).

> Earned biggest wins of career en route to ATP Masters 1000 SFs over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 Shanghai and No. 4 Zverev at 2024 Montreal.

> Did not drop a set en route to 2021 Parma title and captured 2024 Washington title, 32 years after his father, Petr, won in 1992, becoming 1st father-son duo to win the same ATP Tour event.

> Advanced to 2020 Roland Garros 4R as Q and 2021 Wimbledon 4R, becoming 3rd men's player in Open Era to reach 4R in debut at both events (Borg in 1973, Pernfors in 1986).

> Became World No. 1 junior by winning 2018 Australian Open boys' singles title 20 years after his father won Australian Open men's singles title.

NOTE: Korda looks for 29th tour-level quarter-final, sixth of the season, to tie Fritz and Shelton for most hard-court quarter-finals among Americans this season (6). 25-year-old is 10-2 vs. players ranked outside Top 50 since March.

Damir Dzumhur | Age: 33 | World No. 58 | Career-High No. 23 | 2025: 21-26 (2 SFs) | Career: 150-171 (3 Titles)

- > Broke into Top 100 in 2015 and Top 50 in 2017 before winning 3rd ATP Tour title at 2018 Antalya to achieve career-high No. 23.
- > Earned personal-best 36 victories in 2017, highlighted by biggest wins of career over No. 3 Wawrinka at Dubai and No. 4 A. Zverev at Shenzhen.
- > Advanced to Grand Slam 3R on 6 occasions, including at 2018 Roland Garros, where he led No. 3 A. Zverev by 2 sets to 1 and held 1 MP before losing.
- > First player to sweep both Russian titles in a single season, capturing St. Petersburg and Moscow championships in 2017.
- > Reached ATP Masters 1000 R16 on 3 occasions, including at 2016 Miami, where he defeated No. 5 Nadal in 2R.
- > Went 6-0 in finals on ATP Challenger Tour in 2024, tying with 5 other players for 2nd-most Challenger titles in a single season behind Griekspoor (8 in 2021).

NOTE: Dzumhur defeated Fearnley in 1R for 150th tour-level win of career (150-171) and now aims to record back-to-back wins for the first time since his run to Umag SF in July. He seeks 28th ATP Tour QF (10-17), fifth of 2025, and first on hard courts since 2022 Montpellier.

Novak Djokovic | Age: 38 | World No. 5 | Career-High No. 1 | 2025: 35-11 (Geneva Title) | Career: 1159-233 (100 Titles)

- > Record 7-time Nitto ATP Finals champion owns ATP/WTA record for most weeks at No. 1 (428), as well as PIF ATP Rankings records for most years ended at No. 1 (8) and most wins vs. Top 10 (262), finishing in Top 5 in 16 of last 18 years (2017 – No. 12, 2024 – No. 7).
- > All-time leader for most Grand Slam men's singles titles in history (24), including record 10 Australian Open titles, and is 1 of 3 men to hold all 4 Grand Slam championships at same time (also Budge, Laver).
- > Only player to win all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events since start of series in 1990, doing so multiple times for a record total of 40 titles.
- > Owns most Grand Slam match wins in history (397), 3rd-most men's singles titles in Open Era (100), 3rd-most men's singles wins in Open Era (1,159).
- > Earned gold medal at 2024 Paris Olympics, joining Agassi and Nadal as only men to win all 4 Grand Slam titles and Olympic title in singles.
- > Boasts winning records against both Federer (27-23) and Nadal (31-29), as well as win streaks of ATP Tour-record 43 matches (2010-11), ATP Masters 1000-record 31 matches (2011) and Open Era-record 30 Grand Slam matches (2015-16).

NOTE: Djokovic is playing in Greece for the first time in his professional career and aims to reach his 225th tour-level quarter-final in 25th different country. He is 27-0 after winning 1st set this season, 5-1 vs. left-handers, lone loss to Tabilo in Monte-Carlo 2R, and looks to advance to quarter-finals for his sixth consecutive event played.

Alejandro Tabilo | Age: 28 | World No. 89 | Career-High No. 19 | 2025: 12-16 (Chengdu Title) | Career: 69-71 (3 Titles)

- > Toronto-born Chilean broke into Top 100 in February 2022, achieving career-high No. 19 in July 2024 after defeating No. 1 Djokovic for biggest win of career en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF in Rome.
- > Won 1st ATP Tour title at 2024 Auckland as Q, becoming 1st Chilean to win a title on hard courts since Gonzalez in 2007 and became 1st Chilean to win a grass court title in Open Era at 2024 Mallorca.
- > On home soil, defeated countrymen Garin en route to 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2022 Santiago as WC and Barrios Vera en route to 2nd ATP Tour final at 2024 Santiago.
- > Earned 5-set wins over fellow South American Galan in Grand Slam main draw debut at 2020 Australian Open and over Italian Cobolli to reach 3R of 2024 Wimbledon.
- > Represented Canada throughout junior career, peaking at No. 29 in junior rankings during 2015 season.

NOTE: Tabilo is 3-9 vs. Top 10, earning two wins over Djokovic as No. 1 at 2024 Rome and No. 5 in Monte-Carlo in April this year and defeated No. 9 Musetti in Chengdu final in September. He seeks 11th ATP Tour QF to become the second man to record a 3-0 Lexus ATP Head2Head start vs. Djokovic after Federer (now Djokovic leads 27-23) and only player to have a current 3+ positive differential vs. Djokovic.

2R: [Q] Eliot Spizzirri (USA) vs [6] Nuno Borges (POR)
First Meeting

Eliot Spizzirri | Age: 23 | World No. 96 (Career-High) | 2025: 5-3 (Brussels QF) | Career: 6-6 (1 QF)

> Former World No. 20 junior was unranked in July 2023, breaking into Top 200 in February 2025, Top 100 in October 2025 and achieved career-high No. 96 in November 2025 soon after run to 1st ATP Tour QF in Brussels as Q.

> Made ATP Tour debut as unranked WC at 2023 Newport, earned 1st win at 2024 Newport over Tu in 1R and recorded 1st ATP Masters 1000 win over B. Harris in 2025 Miami 1R.

> Qualified for Grand Slam main draw debut at 2024 US Open as qualifying wildcard, defeating 2023 boys' singles champion Fonseca in Q3 (l. to Michelsen in 1R) and entered 2025 US Open as WC.

> Owns 56-33 Challenger record (2-3 in finals), winning titles at 2025 San Diego and 2025 Jingshan.

> In last year as junior, partnered w/Zink to take 2019 US Open boys' doubles title, teaming up with Zink again to capture 2023 Lexington CH title.

> Played college tennis at University of Texas, becoming ITA National Player of the Year in both 2023 and 2024.

NOTE: Spizzirri saved 3 consecutive MPs vs. Djere in 1R by rallying from 3-6 in second set tie-break to win 1-6 7-6(6) 6-2. He now seeks 2nd ATP Tour QF (0-1) after reaching the stage in Brussels last month and aims to record the biggest win of his career (0-4 vs. Top 50).

Nuno Borges | Age: 28 | World No. 47 | Career-High No. 30 | 2025: 29-30 (Auckland SF) | Career: 69-80 (1 Title)

> Became 2nd Portuguese man to break inside Top 50 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973) in 2024, achieving career-high No. 30 in September 2024 after saving 3 MPs vs. Mensik to reach US Open 4R.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2024 Bastad by joining Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Zeballos as only men to defeat Nadal in an ATP Tour final on clay.

> Defeated No. 13 Dimitrov to reach 2024 Aus. Open 4R, becoming 1st Portuguese player in fourth round in tournament's history and earned biggest win of career over No. 8 Ruud to advance to 2025 Roland Garros 3R.

> Advanced to 10 Challenger finals, winning titles at 2021 Antalya-3, 2022 Barletta, 2023 Monterrey, 2023-24 Phoenix and 2023 Maia, his hometown.

> Five-time All-American during 4-year college career at Mississippi State University, posting 31-match win streak that ended in his last match (l. to Jubb in 2019 NCAA singles final).

NOTE: Borges looks for his 7th ATP Tour QF (2-4), fourth of 2025 and first on indoor hard courts in his career. He bids to become the second Portuguese man to record 30 wins in a season in Open Era after J. Sousa (38 in 2015).
