DAY 7 TALKING POINTS

Last year's Roland Garros finalist No. 4 **Casper Ruud**, No. 6 **Holger Rune** and No. 9 **Taylor Fritz** are the highest seeds remaining in the bottom half of the Roland Garros draw. In addition, No. 12 seed **Frances Tiafoe** and No. 15 **Borna Coric** are in third round action on Saturday.

- In the second match on Court Philippe Chatrier, **Rune** takes on No. 231-ranked qualifier **Genaro Alberto Olivieri**, who is the lowest-ranked player to reach the third round this year. Coming into Paris the 24-year-old Argentine had never played in the main draw of a tour-level tournament and he was 0-4 in qualifying going back to last year. Rune is trying to reach the Roland Garros fourth round for the second year in a row (QF in 2022 debut).
- Back on for the evening session is two-time Roland Garros semi-finalist **Zverev**, who brings a 6-1 ATP Head2Head record against **Tiafoe**. This is their first meeting on clay. The German is trying to reach the fourth round for the sixth straight year while Tiafoe is playing in the third round for the first time in eight appearances.
- On Court Suzanne Lenglen, **Ruud** plays **Zhang Zhizhen**, who is the first Chinese man to reach the third round at Roland Garros since Kho Sin-Khie in 1937. Kho also 4R in 1936. Zhang is trying to post his second career Top 10 win (d. No. 10 Fritz in Madrid 4R). Ruud is 13-5 on clay this season and has the most clay wins (83) since 2020.
- Next on are **Fritz** and **Cerundolo**, who is one of four Argentines in the third round. Fritz is trying to reach the 4R for the first time. His mother, Kathy May, is a two-time Roland Garros quarter-finalist (1977-78). Americans **Marcos Giron** and **Tiafoe** are also in action on Saturday. Cerundolo is 5-7 against Top 10 players (3-3 in 2023).
- On Court Simonne Mathieu, **Yoshihito Nishioka** meets Brazilian [Q] **Thiago Seyboth Wild**. The Japanese No. 1 is trying to reach his second straight Grand Slam fourth round. Coming into this year, his best Slam result in 26 tournaments was 3R at 2020 Australian Open. Seyboth Wild aims to become the first Brazilian to reach Roland Garros 4R since Thomaz Bellucci in 2010 (I. to No. 2 Nadal).
- Last on are **Daniel Altmaier** and **Grigor Dimitrov**, who are both looking to reach the fourth round at Roland Garros for the second time after doing it together in 2020. Altmaier saved two match points in his five-set win over No. 8 seed Sinner while Dimitrov has not lost a set in his first two matches.

HOLGER RUNE

Roland Garros Stats

> In his 2nd Roland Garros, he successfully opened his campaign by defeating No. 74 Eubanks in four sets in 1R, before receiving a walkover by Monfils in 2R.

> Last year in Roland Garros debut became first Danish man to reach QFs in tournament history (since 1925).

> He was first Danish man to reach a Grand Slam QF-or better since Jan Leschly in 1967 US Championships (SF).

> Earned straight-set wins over No. 14 seed Shapovalov, Laaksonen, Gaston and 4-sets over No. 4 Tsitsipas before falling to eventual finalist No. 8 Ruud in 4 sets.

> With Alcaraz reaching QFs last year, it was first Grand Slam quarter-final with two teenagers since 1994 Roland Garros (19-year-olds Hendrik Dreekmann and Andrei Medvedev).

> Captured 2019 Roland Garros boys' singles title by beating American Kodat, who defeated Alcaraz in 1R.

Career Highlights

Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 100 in January 2022, Top 50 in May 2022 and Top 10 in November 2022, becoming highest-ranked Dane in Pepperstone ATP Rankings history (since 1973). Reached career-high No. 6 in May.
Captured 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Paris title (d. Djokovic in F) at age 19 by becoming 1st player since start of ATP Tour in 1990 to earn 5 Top-10 wins at an event other than Nitto ATP Finals.

> From 2022 Paris to 2023 Rome, compiled an 18-5 record in 6 ATP Masters 1000 events, highlighted by runner-up results in Monte Carlo (I. to Rublev) and Rome (I. to Medvedev). Had a 7-match winning streak vs. Top 5 opponents come to an end with loss to No. 3 Medvedev in Rome.

> Ended 2022 season on 19-2 run (2-2 in finals) after going 1-6 from January-February and 0-7 from June-July.

> Upset 2021 finalist Tsitsipas at 2022 Roland Garros to become 1st Danish man to reach QF in tournament history (since 1925) and to reach any Grand Slam QF in Open Era (since 1968).

> Captured 5th Challenger title of career at 2022 Sanremo (d. Passaro 6-1 2-6 6-4), then won ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo Q1 match on same day (d. Albot 6-2 6-3).

Roland Garros Stats

> Qualified to make his Grand Slam debut, defeating wild card Mpetshi Perricard in five sets in 1R and fellow qualifier Vavassori in 2R to join countrymen F. Cerundolo, Etcheverry and Schwartzman in the third round.

> Came to Roland Garros with a 0-3 record in Grand Slam qualifying, before defeating Laaksonen in Q1, Geerts in Q2 and Andreev in Q3 to make his tour-level debut.

> He rose 60 spots to No. 171 on the Pepperstone ATP Live Rankings and could advance up to No. 139 with a 3R win.

> Olivieri's best win of career came at 2022 Montevideo CH final, defeating No. 85 Etcheverry for his second and latest Top 100 win in November 2022.

Career Highlights

> Argentine qualified into his first career tour-level tournament at 2023 Roland Garros, dropping only one set in his three qualifying matches before defeating Mpetshi Perricard in 1R for first tour-level win.

> Prior to Roland Garros, lost in 1R qualifying in straight sets at 2022 Wimbledon and US Open and 2023 Aus. Open.

> During 2023, won ITF World Tennis Tour title on home soil in Tucuman. Has 7-9 Challenger record in 2023 with SF in Santiago and back-to-back QFs in Sarasota and Florianopolis.

> In 2022, closed season by capturing first ATP Challenger Tour title in Montevideo, URU (d. Etcheverry) and reached a career-high No. 190 in November 2022.

> Has a 53-54 career record on ATP Challenger Tour (44-46 on clay, 9-8 on hard) and on ITF World Tennis Tour, has a 152-101 record with 3 clay titles and 128-82 on the surface.

Roland Garros Stats

> German is making 8th straight Roland Garros main draw appearance and reached semi-finals past two years.

> He is No. 55 on the <u>Pepperstone ATP Live Rankings</u> and needs to win his 3R match to not drop out of the Top 50 for the first time since April 2016.

- > Defeated Harris and Molcan in straight sets to reach the third round for seventh time in eight appearances.
- > Last year suffered a season-ending right ankle injury vs. Nadal in second set of semi-final.
- > Reached 2021 SF after rallying from 2 sets down vs. countryman Otte in 1R (I. to Tsitsipas in 5 sets).
- > Also advanced to Roland Garros QFs in 2018 (I. to Thiem) and 2019 (I. to No. 1 Djokovic).
- > Owns 8-1 record in 5th sets at Roland Garros, including 3 consecutive wins in 2018 (d. Lajovic, Dzumhur, Khachanov).
- > Advanced to 2013 Roland Garros boys' singles final (I. to Garin).

Career Highlights

> Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 on 13 June 2022 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal. Returned in January 2023.

> Finished in Top 10 for 5 straight years from 2017-2021 with year-end best No. 3 in 2021.

> Led ATP Tour with 6 titles in 2021. He has 2nd-most titles (19) of all players born since 1990, behind Medvedev (20), defeating No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and 2021 Nitto ATP Finals titles.

> Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.

> Joined Murray and Thiem as 3rd player to defeat Djokovic on hard (3 times), Federer on grass (2016 Halle SF) and Nadal on clay (2021 Madrid QF)

FRANCES TIAFOE

Roland Garros Stats

> American is making his 8th Roland Garros appearance, earning first 3R appearance at the event, beating Krajinovic in 1R and Karatsev in 2R.

> After an 0-6 start at the event, defeated No. 52 Bonzi last year for lone win at Roland Garros prior to this year.

> Has reached 3R in Paris to complete the set of third round appearances at all 4 Grand Slam tournaments (best result: QF at 2019 Australian Open, 4R at 2022 Wimbledon and SF at 2022 US Open).

> Made his debut in 2015 as a 17-year-old wild card, losing to Klizan in 1R, a year after making his only appearance at boys' singles event at 2014 Roland Garros (I. to Choinski in 2R).

Career Highlights

> Former World No. 2 junior achieved career-high No. 11 in April 2023 after capturing second career ATP Tour title in Houston (d. Etcheverry). Did not drop a set in four matches.

> Posted 5-0 singles record to help Team USA win inaugural United Cup in January 2023.

> Advanced to personal-best SF at ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells in 2023 (I. to Medvedev).

> Defeated 4-time champion Nadal en route to 2022 US Open SF, becoming that event's 1st American men's semi-finalist since Roddick in 2006.

> Led Team World to 2022 Laver Cup title, teaming w/Sock to defeat Federer/Nadal in Swiss' final match before clinching cup with win over Tsitsipas.

> Won 1st ATP Tour title as 20-year-old at 2018 Delray Beach and remains youngest American champion since Roddick, 19, at 2002 Houston.

> Parents emigrated from Sierra Leone in 1996 and father was Head of Maintenance at Junior Tennis Champions Center in Maryland, where Frances and his twin brother Franklin trained as kids.

ZHANG ZHIZHEN

Roland Garros Stats

> The 26-year-old Shanghai native has yet to lose a set (5-0) in his Roland Garros main draw debut, earning first career Grand Slam win over Lajovic in 1R (ret.) and defeating [Q] Tirante to reach maiden 3R appearance.

> He aims to become first Chinese man to reach 4R at a Grand Slam event in Open Era (since 1968) and first since Kho Sin-Khie at 1938 Wimbledon. Kho also reached Roland Garros 4R in 1936. Wu Yibing reached 3R at US Open last year.
> Zhang will be aiming to earn biggest win of career (0-1 vs. Top-5 players) after earning first Top 10 win over No. 10 Fritz last month at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid 4R.

> Previously entered Roland Garros qualifying in 2021, defeating Giustino in Q1, but lost to Gojowczyk in Q2.

Career Highlights

> Became first Chinese player in Pepperstone ATP Rankings history to break into the Top 100 in October 2022.

> At Madrid in 2023 became the first Chinese player to reach the quarter-finals of an ATP Masters 1000 event (d. No. 13 Norrie in 3R, No. 10 Fritz in 4R, I. to Karatsev) and achieved career-high No. 69 in May 2023

> Qualified at 2021 Wimbledon, becoming 1st Chinese man to compete in main draw of that event in Open Era.

> Also qualified at 2022 US Open, joining fellow qualifier Wu as 1st Chinese men to compete in main draw of that event in Open Era.

> Advanced to ATP Tour QFs at 2017 Shenzhen as Q and 2022 Naples as Q.

> Owns 81-66 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), capturing most recent title at 2022 Cordenons.

CASPER RUUD

Roland Garros Stats

> Norwegian is making his 6th consecutive appearance and defeated [Q] E. Ymer in straight sets and [Q] Zeppieri in four sets to reach third round for the fifth year in a row.

> Aiming to reach 4R of a Grand Slam event for the fourth time (in 18th event), going on to reach final on two occasions.

> Entered Roland Garros last year as the World No. 8 before reaching 1st Grand Slam final (I. to Nadal).

> Previously reached 3R three times: in 2019 (I. to No. 3 Federer), 2020 (I. to No. 3 Thiem) and 2021 (I. to Davidovich Fokina in the deciding fifth set).



Career Highlights

> Top-ranked Norwegian in history rose from No. 7 to career-high No. 2 after falling to Alcaraz in 2022 US Open final with No. 1 ranking at stake.

> Has improved year-end Pepperstone ATP Rankings for 7 consecutive seaons from No. 1,126 in 2016 to No. 3 in 2022.

> First Norwegian to win an ATP Tour title (10), play at Nitto ATP Finals (2021 SF, 2022 final), and reach both a Grand Slam final (2022 Roland Garros, US Open) and an ATP Masters 1000 final (2022 Miami).

> Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.

> Former World No. 1 junior leads ATP Tour since start of 2020 season in clay-court wins (83), finals (11) and titles (9).

> Beat No. 4 Zverev on a hard court for biggest win of career en route to '22 ATP Masters 1000 Miami final (I. to Alcaraz).

FRANCISCO CERUNDOLO

Roland Garros Stats

> The Argentine earned his first main draw victory at Roland Garros, defeating Munar in four sets and recorded a straightsets victory over [LL] Hanfmann in 2R to earn 50th career tour-level win.

> Aiming to reach fourth round at a Grand Slam event for the first time and owns a 5-7 record vs. Top 10 players in his career, 4-2 on clay and 0-2 at Grand Slam events.

> Made his debut in 2021 as a lucky loser ranked No. 117, falling to Monteiro in the first round.

> Last year came in ranked No. 45 and lost to Evans in straight sets in his opening round.

> Moved 3 spots to No. 20 on the Pepperstone ATP Live Rankings and could make a Top 20 debut next Monday.

Career Highlights

> Broke into Top 100 and achieved new career-high ranking 11 times in 2022, then reached career-high No. 23 on 29 May 2023 after reaching 3rd ATP Tour final in Lyon (I. to Fils).

> In July 2022 broke into Top 25 after defeating No. 5 Ruud en route to Bastad title and No. 8 Rublev en route to Hamburg SF.

> As World No. 103 at 2022 Miami, became lowest-ranked semi-finalist in 37-year tournament history and 1st player to reach SF in his ATP Masters 1000 main draw debut since Janowicz at 2012 Paris.

> Lost to countryman Schwartzman in 2021 Buenos Aires final as Q, 2022 Buenos Aires QF as Q and 2022 Rio de Janeiro SF as SE.

> Owns 73-36 Challenger record (5-1 in finals), highlighted by 17-2 run to end 2020 season with three clay itles.

> Father, Alejandro, also played pro tennis; younger brother, Juan Manuel, won 2021 Cordoba title; sister, Constanza, played for Argentine field hockey team that won gold medal at 2018 Youth Olympics.



TAYLOR FRITZ

Roland Garros Stats

> World No. 8 is making his 7th Roland Garros appearance and into third round for second time (I. to Sonego in 2020).

> Defeated compatriot Mmoh 6-2 6-1 6-1 in first round and ousted the last Frenchman in the draw Rinderknech, in 2R.

> Owns a 7-1 record vs. Argentines on tour-level since the beginning of 2019 season (0-4 prior to 2019), his only loss to Schwartzman at 2019 Los Cabos final.

> At 2015 Roland Garros reached the boys' singles final as the No. 2 seed, losing to compatriot Paul, before avenging the loss to defeat Paul at 2015 US Open boys' singles final.

Career Highlights

> Former World No. 1 junior won 5th ATP Tour title at 2023 Delray Beach to achieve career-high No. 5 and become 1st American in Top 5 since Roddick in September 2009.

> Defeated No. 2 Nadal en route 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF after beating him in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final to become that event's 1st American men's champion since Agassi in 2001.

> Advanced to 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2022 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam QF at 2022 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-7 record in Grand Slam 3R matches.

> Reached 1st ATP Tour final at 2016 Memphis as 18-year-old WC, becoming youngest American finalist since start of ATP Tour in 1990.

> Clinched inaugural United Cup for Team USA in 2023 after helping Team World capture 2022 Laver Cup.
