### ROLEX PARIS MASTERS TALKING POINTS

- ATP Tour returns to **Rolex Paris Masters** for the first edition at the **Paris La Defense Arena**, including three former champions floating in the draw: **Karen Khachanov** (2018), **Daniil Medvedev** (2020) and **Alexander Zverev**, who defeated Frenchman **Ugo Humbert** in the final last year. German will attempt to become the second man to successfully defend a title in tournament history after **Novak Djokovic** won 3 titles in 2013-15.
- World No. 1 **Carlos Alcaraz** leads the ATP Tour in wins (67) and titles (8) this season, including lifting titles at ATP Masters 1000 events in Monte-Carlo, Rome and Cincinnati. He is on a 17-match winning streak at this level and bids to become the first man since Djokovic in 2016 to win 4 ATP Masters 1000 titles in one season. He would be second Spanish champion in tournament history after **David Ferrer** won 2012 edition.

- Jannik Sinner** arrives to Paris on a 21-match winning streak on indoor hard courts, including title win in Vienna last week. Making his fourth appearance at the event, Italian will aim to complete the set of quarter-finals at all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events, as he still searches for his first title at M1000 level this year.

- Four spots remain for **Nitto ATP Finals** qualification, as Americans **Taylor Fritz** and **Ben Shelton** look in prime position to become first American duo to qualify since Blake and Roddick in 2006. Both players will look for deep runs in Paris to clinch the spot. Fritz reached the final in Turin last year, while Shelton bids to make his year-end finals debut. The pair leads tournament-high 10 Americans in the singles main draw.
- World No. 6 **Alex de Minaur** leads the ATP Tour in hard court wins this season (40) and continues to look for his 1st ATP Masters 1000 title. **Lorenzo Musetti** is No. 8 in [PIF ATP Race to Turin](#) and aims to secure his spot to join countryman Sinner in front of home crowd in Turin, while he is chased by World No. 9 **Casper Ruud** and No. 10 **Felix Auger-Aliassime**, who aim for big runs in Paris to snatch the remaining spots.
- In Shanghai earlier this month, cousins **Valentin Vacherot** and **Arthur Rinderknech** played in the third unseeded ATP Masters 1000 final in series history, as Monegasque No. 1 Vacherot became the lowest-ranked champion at this level as World No. 204. Both enter Paris as wild cards and could meet again in second round this week if they win their opening rounds (Vacherot vs. Lehecka, Rinderknech vs. Marozsan).
- 43-year-old **Nicolas Mahut** announced plans to retire after **Rolex Paris Masters** this year, as 2019 doubles champion of this event makes his 19th and final appearance by pairing with **Grigor Dimitrov**, who is back from injury sustained at Wimbledon, 25 years after debuting as a doubles wildcard at 2000 Paris with Arnaud Clement. In his doubles career, Mahut won all 4 Grand Slam tournaments and peaked at World No. 1 in 2016.

**Luciano Darderi** | Age: 23 | World No. 27 | Career-High No. 26 | 2025: 29-25 (3 Titles) | Paris: 0-1 (2024 1R)

- > Former Top 10 junior started 2024 season as No. 128, then broke into Top 100 in February, Top 50 in May and achieved career-high No. 26 in September 2025 after runs to 3R of Wimbledon and US Open.
- > Captured his 1st ATP Tour title in Cordoba, defeating Bagnis in 3rd final between two qualifiers since the ATP Tour was established in 1990.
- > In 2025, won Bastad and Umag titles in back-to-back weeks in July after lifting Marrakech title in April.
- > Owns 95-61 Challenger record (4-3 in finals) with titles at 2023 Todi, 2023 Lima-2, 2024 Perugia and 2025 Genoa.
- > Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings in February 2020 after earning 3 singles and 3 doubles titles to start the season.
- > Born in Argentina, started playing tennis at age 4 with his father Luciano Enrique, a former tennis player and current coach.

**NOTE:** Darderi bids to record 30 wins in a season for first time in career to become fourth Italian man this season to achieve the feat. He seeks first ATP Masters 1000 win since Rome and 3rd Top 100 win on hard courts (2-22) after wins over No. 21 Tabilo at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati and No. 40 Martinez at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Miami.

**Arthur Cazaux** | Age: 23 | World No. 62 | Career-High No. 58 | 2025: 14-14 (Kitzbuhel Final) | Paris: 1-1 (2024 3R)

- > After peaking at No. 4 in juniors in 2020, broke inside Top 100 in January 2024 after defeating No. 8 Rune for biggest win of career en route to Australian Open 4R and achieved career-high No. 58 in October 2025.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2025 Gstaad and 1st final at 2025 Kitzbuhel in back-to-back weeks.
- > Defeated countryman Mannarino in ATP Tour main draw debut at 2021 Geneva as 18-year-old WC and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2021 Roland Garros as WC.
- > Owns 79-40 Challenger record (4-5 in finals), winning titles at both 2022 and 2023 Nonthaburi-2 as Q, 2024 Noumea and 2025 Jinan.
- > Went 122-48 on ITF Junior Circuit, highlighted by run to 2020 Australian Open boys' singles final.

**NOTE:** Cazaux is 4-13 vs. Top 30 in his career, including win over No. 19 Shelton in Paris 2R as LL to reach his 1st ATP Masters 1000 3R. He looks for his second Top 50 win of 2025 (1-9) after defeating No. 28 Baez in Australian Open and record his second ATP Masters 1000 match win this season after defeating Martinez in Shanghai 1R.

- > Broke into Top 200 in August 2022, Top 100 in June 2023 and earned career-high No. 36 in May 2024, becoming fourth Hungarian to break into Top 50 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973).
- > In ATP Tour debut, defeated No. 2 Alcaraz for biggest win of career en route to 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome 4R as Q and reached 1st QF at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai (d. No. 9 Ruud in 4R).
- > Upset No. 7 Rune in 2R and No. 10 de Minaur in 4R en route to 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Miami QF.
- > Earned 1st Grand Slam main draw win at 2023 US Open (d. Gasquet) and reached 3R at 2024 and 2025 Australian Open and advanced to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2025 Munich after 0-6 start in ATP Tour QFs.
- > Owns 55-30 Challenger record (3-1 in finals), winning titles at 2022 Banja Luka, 2023 Antalya and 2023 Perugia and losing to countryman Fucsovics in all-Hungarian final at 2022 Bratislava-2.

 > Posted 27-3 Challenger record in 2024 with titles in Nottingham 2, Lincoln, Rennes and Orleans, owning highest win percentage in a season at Challenger level since 2011 (min. 25 matches played).  
 > Peaked at No. 27 in junior rankings, highlighted by wins over future World No. 1s Alcaraz in 2018 Sanxenxo Grade 2 final by 6-2 4-6 7-6(12) and Sinner in 2017 Malta ITF U18 Grade 4 1R.  
 > Spent five-years playing college tennis for Texas Christian University, former team of countryman Norrie, becoming four-time ITA All-American and helped his team clinch the national championship in his final year.

**NOTE:** Fearnley is 1-7 vs. Top 20 after defeating No. 20 Machac in ATP Masters 1000 Marid 2R in April and seeks the biggest win of his career. He defeated Arnaldi and Hanfmann in straight sets to qualify and now aims to record second ATP Masters 1000 hard-court win of his career (d. Bonzi in Miami 1R).

 > Rallied from a set down in both SF (d. Fritz) and final (d. Rune) at 2023 Monte-Carlo to capture 1st ATP Masters 1000 title and defeated two-time defending champion No. 3 Alcaraz en route to 2nd title at 2024 Madrid.  
 > Defeated No. 3 Nadal at 2021 Monte-Carlo, No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Cincinnati and No. 1 Sinner at 2024 Montreal en route to ATP Masters 1000 finals and beat No. 1 Djokovic for 11th of 17 ATP Tour titles at 2022 Belgrade.  
 > Led tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.  
 > Ten-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist reached 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF and won gold medal in All-ROC mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).

> Peaked at No. 4 in junior rankings during 2021 season, after advancing to 2021 Roland Garros boys' singles SF (l. to Fils) and winning the boys' doubles title w/Fils.

**NOTE:** Mpetshi Perricard is playing in his 3rd indoor event of the year after reaching Brussels SF (d. No. 8 Musetti in QF) and losing in Basel 1R as defending champion last week to fall outside Top 50 for the first time since September last year. In most recent ATP Masters 1000 event, he defeated No. 4 Fritz for biggest win of career to reach R16 at this level for the first time in career.

> Former World No. 1 junior ended 2017 at career-high No. 3 after becoming 1st debutant to go 5-0 en route to Nitto ATP Finals title since McEnroe in 1978.  
> Top-ranked Bulgarian in history and only champion from his country, winning 9 titles including 2017 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati.  
> Surpassed 400 wins in September 2023, highlighted by biggest win over No. 1 Djokovic at 2013 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.  
> Advanced to Grand Slam SFs at 2014 Wimbledon, 2017 Australian Open and 2019 US Open, as well as 12 ATP Masters 1000 SFs, including finals at 2017 Cincinnati, 2023 Paris and 2024 Miami.  
> Posted 1st win in 8 meetings with Federer in 2019 US Open QF as World No. 78, becoming 2nd-lowest-ranked US Open men's semi-finalist in history (No. 174 Connors in 1991).

**NOTE:** Dimitrov is playing in his first match since retiring in Wimbledon 4R vs. No. 1 Sinner while leading 2 sets to 0 due to pectoral injury. 34-year-old Bulgarian is making his 13th appearance at the event and holds 12-0 record in his opening rounds, bidding to become the fourth man to record 25 wins in tournament history.
