ABN AMRO OPEN TALKING POINTS

- Two-time finalist **Alex de Minaur** headlines the 53rd edition of **ABN Amro Open**, as the 26-year-old aims to become the first man in tournament history to advance to the Rotterdam final in three consecutive years. Australian No. 1 leads all players for most ATP 500 wins since the start of 2023 season (48) and posted tour-leading 43 hard court wins in 2025, highlighted by his run to ATP 500 Washington title.
- Three former champions return to Rotterdam Ahoy arena, as No. 2 seed **Felix Auger-Aliassime**, who won his 1st ATP Tour title at this venue in 2022, arrives on a 4-match winning streak following Montpellier title win on Sunday. No. 4 seed and 2023 champion **Daniil Medvedev** will attempt to capture multiple titles at an event for the first time after winning all 22 titles in different locations. 40-year-old **Stan Wawrinka**, who lifted his only indoor ATP Tour title in Rotterdam 11 years ago, received a WC to make his 8th main draw appearance.
- Dutch No. 1 **Tallon Griekspoor** is 18-4 on home soil since the start of 2023 season and is making his 9th main draw appearance in Rotterdam. No. 7 seed Griekspoor is the first Dutchman seeded at this event since No. 7 Schalken and No. 8 Verkerk in 2004. He leads 5 Dutchmen in the draw and is joined by **Botic van de Zandschulp**, **Jesper de Jong**, WC **Guy den Ouden**, who is making his ATP Tour debut, and 18-year-old **Mees Rottgering**, who became the youngest man to qualify for Rotterdam since Federer, 17, in 1999.

Roberto Bautista Agut | Age: 37 | World No. 85 | Career-High No. 9 | 2026: 1-3 (Montpellier 2R) | Rotterdam: 4-6 ('16 QF)

- > Captured 12th ATP Tour title in Antwerp and 400th win of career in 2024 and ended 2019 at career-high No. 9.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2019 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam SF at 2019 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-9 record in Grand Slam 4R matches.
- > Defeated No. 1 Djokovic in 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai SF, 2019 Doha SF and 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R, as well as No. 1 Medvedev in 2022 Mallorca QF.
- > Went 4-1 at 2022 ATP Cup and 6-0 at 2020 ATP Cup to lead Spain to finals after helping his country win 2019 Davis Cup.
- > Played football for Villarreal C.F. until he was 14 years old.

NOTE: Bautista Agut looks to record first Top 50 win since defeating No. 39 Norrie in ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati 2R last year. At 37 years and 9 months, Spaniard would become the second oldest match winner in tournament history.

Cameron Norrie | Age: 30 | World No. 26 | Career-High No. 8 | 2026: 5-3 (Aus. Open 3R) | Rotterdam: 3-2 (2022 QF)
 > Broke into Top 10 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 8 in September 2022, joining Henman, Murray and Rusedski as 4th Top-10 British man in history.
 > Advanced to 13 ATP Tour finals from May 2021-February 2023, highlighted by 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title to become 1st British champion in 46-year tournament history.
 > Reached Grand Slam 4R, QF and SF for 1st time at 2022 Wimbledon, falling to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets and advanced to his 2nd Grand Slam QF at 2025 Wimbledon, losing to eventual finalist Alcaraz.
 > Earned 52 wins in 2021 and defeated No. 1 Alcaraz at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Paris for biggest win of career.
 > Born in South Africa to a Scottish father and Welsh mother, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

NOTE: Norrie is making his third appearance in Rotterdam after reaching 2021 2R as Q and advancing to 2022 QF, losing to eventual champion Auger-Aliassime. 30-year-old aims to record 5 tour-level wins vs. an opponent for the third time in his career (6-8 vs. Fritz, 5-0 vs. Fucsovics).

Daniil Medvedev | Age: 29 | World No. 11 | Career-High No. 1 | 2026: 8-1 (Brisbane Title) | Rotterdam: 11-5 (2023 Title)
 > Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in 2004.
 > Six-time Grand Slam finalist owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.
 > Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).
 > Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.
 > Won 20 of his 22 singles titles on hard courts and all 22 of his titles at different events, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami and 2023 Rome, his 1st title on clay.

NOTE: Medvedev, who turns 30 on Wednesday, is one of three former champions in the draw (also Auger-Aliassime, Wawrinka). He is 8-0 in his opening rounds since losing to Frenchman Bonzi in US Open 1R last August.

Ugo Humbert | Age: 27 | World No. 36 | Career-High No. 13 | 2026: 5-4 (Adelaide Final) | Rotterdam: 0-3 ('21-'22, '24 1R)
> Broke into Top 20 in November 2023 and achieved career-high No. 13 in April 2024 soon after winning Dubai, joining Gulbis and Klizan as third player in Open Era to win 6th ATP Tour title in 6th final (now 7-4 in finals).
> Went on a 13-match winning streak on French indoor hard courts, capturing titles at 2023 Metz and 2024 Marseille and equaled biggest win of career over No. 2 Alcaraz en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at 2024 Paris.
> Upset No. 6 A. Zverev and No. 7 Rublev en route to 3rd of 7 career titles at 2021 Halle.
> Won 1st ATP Tour title at 2020 Auckland as 21-year-old to become youngest French champion since Gasquet, 21, at 2007 Mumbai and saved 4 MPs vs. Evans en route to 2nd ATP Tour title at 2020 Antwerp.
> Defeated former No. 3 Thiem 6-3 6-0 to win 7th Challenger title of career at 2022 Rennes and in May 2023 earned 8th and 9th Challenger titles in Cagliari and Bordeaux in a 3-week span.

NOTE: Humbert is 29-38 vs. Top 20 (12-11 on indoor hard), aiming to record 2nd Top 20 win of the season after defeating No. 15 Davidovich Fokina in Adelaide SF. 27-year-old seeks first win in Rotterdam after opening round losses to Chardy in 2021, Norrie in 2022 and Ruusuvuori in 2024.

Valentin Royer (FRA) vs [Q] Christopher O'Connell (AUS)

First Meeting

Valentin Royer | Age: 24 | World No. 57 | Career-High No. 56 | 2026: 0-4 (4 times in 1R) | Rotterdam: 0-0 (Debut)
> Broke Top 200 in May 2024, Top 100 in August 2025 and achieved career-high No. 56 in November 2025 soon after defeating No. 14 Rublev for biggest win of career en route to 1st ATP Tour final in Hangzhou.
> Made tour-level debut at 2025 Roland Garros as WC, losing to Galan in 5 sets, before defeating No. 26 Tsitsipas in 2025 Wimbledon 1R via RET (6-3 6-2 ret.) as Q for first Grand Slam main draw win.
> Posted 34-11 Challenger record in 2025, highlighted by 14-0 run to win back-to-back titles in Kigali before losing to Coric in Zadar final.
> Peaked at No. 8 in the junior rankings, finishing his junior career by earning 3rd place at 2019 ITF World Tennis Tour Junior Finals (l. to Rune in SF).

NOTE: Royer looks for first ATP Tour win since defeating Collignon in Basel 1R in October (0-7 since). 24-year-old was ranked No. 193 on February 10th last year (+136 spots), before winning his 1st tour-level match at Wimbledon in June (d. Tsitsipas) and advancing to his 1st ATP Tour final in Hangzhou in September.

Christopher O'Connell | Age: 31 | World No. 119 | Career-High No. 53 | 2026: 0-2 (2x 1R) | Rotterdam: 0-0 (Debut)
> Unranked to begin 2019, broke into Top 200 in September 2019 and ended 2022 season at No. 78, before reaching career-high No. 53 in September 2023 after winning 5th Challenger title in Shanghai without losing a set.
> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 San Diego after reaching 1st ATP Tour QF at 2021 Atlanta as Q.
> Defeated No. 13 Schwartzman for biggest win of career and to reach 2022 Australian Open 3R as WC and No. 16 Zverev to advance to 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2023 Munich.
> Played 108 main draw and qualifying singles matches across all tours in 2019, posting 50-11 record on ITF World Tennis Tour with 3 titles in 10 finals.
> Stopped playing tennis in 2018 due to many injuries to clean boats with his brother and get away from tennis, deciding to come back to the sport in 2019.

NOTE: O'Connell aims to record first ATP Tour win since defeating Dzumhur in ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai 1R in October. Last week, 31-year-old played in his first indoor match of the season, losing to Bautista Agut in Montpellier 1R after holding 2 MPs.

Luka Pavlovic | Age: 25 | World No. 219 | Career-High No. 184 | 2026: 0-0 (Aus. Open Q1) | Rotterdam: 0-0 (Debut)
> Earned 1st ranking point in 2016, broke into Top 500 in June 2024 and Top 200 in July 2025 after run to 3rd Challenger final in Brasov, achieving career-high No. 184 later that month.
> Qualified for his ATP Tour debut at 2026 Rotterdam after wins over B. Harris in Q1 and Medjedovic in Q2, saving 1 MP and converting his 8th match point to win 10-8 in final set tie-break.
> Owns 31-24 Challenger record (0-3 in finals), advancing to finals at 2024 Sibiu, 2025 Mexico City and 2025 Brasov.

> Captured ITF World Tennis Tour titles at 2021 M15 Pirot and 4 titles at Kursumlijska Banja (2 in 2023, 2 in 2024).

NOTE: Pavlovic saved 1 MP vs. No. 79 Medjedovic in Q2 to make his ATP Tour debut and now aims to record his third Top 100 win (also d. No. 53 Etcheverry at 2025 Braunschweig CH). He would be the third man ranked outside Top 200 to win a main draw match in Rotterdam in this decade (No. 309 Raonic in 2024, No. 317 Vavassori in 2025).

Botic van de Zandschulp | Age: 30 | World No. 65 | Career-High No. 22 | 2026: 3-3 (Aus. Open 3R) | Rotterdam: 2-5 ('22-'23 2R)
> Achieved new career-high ranking 14 times in 2022, peaking at No. 22 in August and ending 2nd straight season as No. 1 Dutchman.

> At 2021 US Open, became 3rd men's qualifier to reach US Open QF in Open Era, 1st Dutchman to reach Grand Slam QF since 2004, and only player to take a set off eventual champion Medvedev.

> In 2024, posted upsets over No. 3 Alcaraz in US Open 2R for biggest win of career and Nadal in Davis Cup Finals to end former World No. 1's career and help Netherlands advance to 1st Davis Cup final in history (since 1900).

> In Munich, upset No. 7 Ruud en route to 1st ATP Tour final in 2022 and No. 10 Fritz to reach 2nd final in 2023, before squandering 4 championship points in 2023 final and losing to Rune on both occasions.

> Went 11-1 in Grand Slam qualifying matches in 2021, qualifying at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open, while entering Wimbledon as LL (l. to Tringelliti in Q3).

NOTE: van de Zandschulp is making sixth consecutive Rotterdam main draw appearance, aiming to advance to 2R for the third time after defeating Zapata Miralles in 2022 1R and Halys in 2023 1R. In last two editions, Dutch No. 2 lost to eventual champions No. 4 Sinner in 2024 1R and No. 3 Alcaraz in 1R last year.

> Former World No. 1 junior began 2025 season ranked outside Top 500, broke into Top 300 in February, Top 200 in July and achieved career-high No. 132 in November before qualifying for Next Gen ATP Finals.

> Defeated Spaniards Landaluce and Jodar to become 1st Norwegian semi-finalist at Next Gen ATP Finals in 2025, before defeating former World No. 36 Herbert to qualify for Grand Slam main draw debut at 2026 Australian Open.

> Recorded wins over Rolis and Faria in Davis Cup before making ATP Tour debut at 2025 Bastad as Q, defeating Monteiro in 1R.

> Owns 37-20 Challenger record (4-0 in finals), defeating countryman Durasovic for 1st title at 2025 Glasgow in second all-Norwegian final in ATP Challenger Tour history (1998 Furth - Ch. Ruud d. Andersen).

> Peaked at No. 1 in juniors in July 2024 after runs to Roland Garros boys' doubles title w/Schwaerzler and Wimbledon boys' singles title to become first Norwegian man to win a Grand Slam singles title at any level.

NOTE: Budkov Kjaer is 0-12 vs. Top 100 players (including ATP qualifying), aiming to record the biggest win of his career. He is the second Norwegian to compete in Rotterdam main draw after Christian Ruud in 1995 (l. to Dosedel in 1R) and attempts to become the sixth teenager to earn a win in Rotterdam in this decade.

> Former World No. 3 junior advanced to 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals SF and reached No. 52 in 2019, before breaking into Top 50 in July 2025 and achieving career-high No. 33 in December 2025.

> Defeated countryman Alcaraz before falling to countryman Carreno Busta in 1st ATP Tour final at 2021 Marbella.

- > Recorded personal-best 31 wins in 2025 and advanced to Wimbledon 3R (d. No. 31 Bublik in 1R) and US Open 4R after 0-11 start to career in Grand Slam 2Rs.
- > Earned 2 Top-5 wins over No. 3 Zverev at 2019 Marrakech 2R and No. 3 Ruud at 2022 Tokyo 1R.
- > Owns 141-72 Challenger record (10-8 in finals), including most recent clay-court title at 2024 Bad Waltersdorf.
- > Reached 2014 Roland Garros boys' singles final and won boys' doubles title in 2015 with countryman Lopez San Martin.
