Zsombor Piros | Age: 24 | World No. 121 | Career-High No. 109 | 2023: 3-1 (Umag 2R) | Sofia: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 300 in November 2021, Top 200 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 109 in July 2023 just before recording first ATP Tour win at Umag by defeating O'Connell in 1R.
 > Owns 89-64 Challenger record (4-2 in finals) with titles at 2022 Tampere, 2022 Gwangju, 2023 Split and 2023 Oeiras-3.
 > Earned biggest win of career over No. 30 Marin Cilic at Davis Cup Finals in 2021 Madrid.
 > Captured 7 of 8 tour-level wins playing for Hungary in Davis Cup where he owns 7-4 singles record.
 > Defeated Oliel to capture the Australian Open boys' singles title in 2017, becoming the second Hungarian to record a Grand Slam boys' singles title after Fucsovics at 2010 Wimbledon.

NOTE: Piros aims to win 2nd ATP Tour match of his career. He is 8-6 on tour-level, 5-3 on hard courts.

Fabian Marozsan | Age: 24 | World No. 62 | Career-High No. 61 | 2023: 10-7 (Shanghai QF) | Sofia: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 200 in August 2022, Top 100 in June 2023 and earned career-high No. 61 in October 2023 soon after reaching 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Shanghai.
 > In ATP Tour debut, qualified and defeated No. 2 Alcaraz for biggest win of career en route to 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome 4R.
 > Earned first Grand Slam main draw win over Gasquet at 2023 US Open in five sets (l. to Mannarino in 2R).
 > Owns 55-30 record on Challenger tour (3-1 in finals), winning titles at 2022 Banja Luka, 2023 Antalya and 2023 Perugia and losing to compatriot Fucsovics in 2022 Bratislava-2 final.
 > Began playing tennis at age 5 and credits his father for teaching him everything about the sport.

NOTE: Marozsan owns a 4-2 record in opening rounds this season. He is 10-8 on tour-level in career (5-5 on hard courts).

Roberto Carballes Baena | Age: 30 | World No. 61 | Career-High No. 49 | 2023: 19-23 (Marrakech Title) | Sofia: 0-1 (2020 1R)
 > Former World No. 8 junior entered Top 50 at 30 years of age at career high No. 49 after coming from a set down three times to win 2nd ATP Tour title at 2023 Marrakech.
 > At 2018 Quito, became 1st Spanish qualifier to win an ATP Tour title since Almagro at 2006 Valencia.
 > Earned biggest win of career over No. 11 Shapovalov 8-6 in 5th after 5 hours to reach 2020 Roland Garros 3R.
 > Defeated Goffin for 1st ATP Tour win en route to 2014 Casablanca SF as Q.
 > Boasts 233-151 Challenger record (11-8 in finals), including clay-court titles at 2022 and 2023 Seville.

NOTE: Carballes Baena seeks his 20th tour-level win on hard courts in his career (19-36). He aims to break a 4-match tour-level losing streak, seeking first win since defeating No. 4 Rune at US Open 1R for biggest win of career.

Albert Ramos Vinolas | Age: 35 | World No. 94 | Career-High No. 17 | 2023: 11-25 (Gstaad Final) | Sofia: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Achieved career-high No. 17 in 2017 and has finished each of last 12 seasons in Top 100 (2011-22).

- > Played in 12 finals on ATP Tour, winning clay-court titles at 2016 Bastad, 2019 Gstaad, 2021 Estoril and 2022 Cordoba.
- > Advanced to 3R, 4R and QF of a Grand Slam for 1st time at 2016 Roland Garros.
- > Reached QF, SF and final of an ATP Masters 1000 event for 1st time at 2017 Monte Carlo, earning biggest career win over No. 1 Murray in 3R from 0-4 down in 3rd set.
- > Defeated defending champion and World No. 3 Federer in 2015 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai 2R for 1st win in 16 tries vs. Top 10.

NOTE: Ramos-Vinolas aims to break an 11-match tour-level losing streak on the surface, seeking 1st tour-level hard court win since defeating No. 23 Musetti at 2022 Basel 1R.

Roberto Bautista Agut | Age: 35 | World No. 60 | Career-High No. 9 | 2023: 16-20 (Adelaide-2 Final) | Sofia: 6-1 (2016 Title)

- > Captured 10th and 11th ATP Tour titles of career in 2022, earned 300th win of career in 2020 and ended 2019 at career-high No. 9.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2019 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam SF at 2019 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-9 record in Grand Slam 4R matches.
- > Defeated No. 1 Djokovic in 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai SF, 2019 Doha SF and 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R, as well as No. 1 Medvedev in 2022 Mallorca QF.
- > Went 4-1 at 2022 ATP Cup and 6-0 at 2020 ATP Cup to lead Spain to finals after helping his country win 2019 Davis Cup.
- > Played football for Villarreal C.F. until he was 14 years old.

NOTE: Bautista Agut is one of the two former champions in the field (w/Huesler). He seeks his 10th hard court win of the season (9-11).

Miomir Kecmanovic | Age: 24 | World No. 56 | Career-High No. 27 | 2023: 25-29 (2 Finals) | Sofia: 1-1 (2021 2R)

- > Broke into Top 40 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2020 Kitzbuhel and achieved career-high No. 27 in January 2023.
- > Earned personal-best 38 wins in 2022, reaching Australian Open 4R, Roland Garros 3R and Wimbledon 3R.
- > Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 QFs at 2019 Indian Wells as LL, 2022 Indian Wells and 2022 Miami, equaling biggest win of career in 2022 Indian Wells 4R vs. No. 6 Berrettini.
- > Beat Ruud and Davidovich Fokina to reach 2019 Next Gen ATP Finals SF (l. to eventual champion Sinner).
- > Defeated Tsitsipas in 3rd-set TB to win 2015 Orange Bowl junior title, then ended 2016 as World No. 1 junior ahead of No. 2 Tsitsipas.

NOTE: Kecmanovic is 1-9 vs. Top 100 players in last 10 tour-level matches against them, equaling biggest win of career over No. 6 Rune at Stockholm 2R for lone win.

- > Achieved career-high No. 272 in November 2022 after defeating No. 74 Lehecka for biggest win of career at 2022 Sofia for his first ATP Tour win of career.
- > Made ATP Tour debut at 2017 Sofia as a wildcard (l. to Albot in 1R).
- > Owns 10-17 Challenger record and 175-96 on ITF Tour (7-2 in finals), with most recent titles at M15 Sozopol in back-to-back weeks.
- > Started playing tennis at age 6 because his father, uncle and grandfather played and was inspired as a youngster by watching VHS tapes of his father playing.
- > Tennis idols are countryman Grigor Dimitrov and Rafael Nadal.

NOTE: Lazarov seeks his 2nd ATP tour win against a Top 100 player in his career (d. No. 74 Lehecka at 2022 Sofia 1R). This is his 5th Sofia main draw appearance overall.

Pavel Kotov | Age: 24 | World No. 80 (Career-High) | 2023: 13-13 (Stockholm Final) | Sofia: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Earned 1st ranking point at age 16 in October 2015, broke into Top 100 in October 2022 and achieved career-high No. 80 in November 2023 soon after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at Stockholm.
 > Qualified and earned 1st ATP Tour win at 2022 Marrakech (d. Griekspoor in 1R), before returning in 2023 to reach 1st ATP Tour SF in Marrakech.
 > Qualified to make ATP Tour debut at 2020 St. Petersburg and Grand Slam debut at 2022 Roland Garros.
 > Owns 89-71 Challenger record (3-2 in finals), winning titles at 2021 Forli-3, 2022 Forli-3 and 2022 San Marino.
 > Went 83-47 on ITF Junior Circuit and peaked at No. 34 in junior rankings.

NOTE: Kotov earned 6 of 7 career tour-level hard court wins this season, including 4 on his way to 1st ATP Tour final at 2023 Stockholm in his last event.

> Broke into Top 200 in February 2020 and achieved career-high No. 144 in November 2021.
 > Qualified at US Open and Indian Wells in 2021, becoming 2nd Turkish man in Open Era to compete in a Grand Slam and ATP Masters 1000 main draw (also Ilhan).
 > Lost 1st 11 ATP Tour main draw matches of career before beating Berankis in 2020 Doha 1R as WC.
 > Owns 134-122 Challenger record, highlighted by 1st career title at 2020 Quimper.
 > Peaked at No. 52 on ITF Junior Circuit and posted 3-set win over future ATP No. 5 Rublev in 2013.

NOTE: Ilkel seeks his first ATP Tour win since 2020 Doha (d. Berankis in 1R). He is 9-29 overall on tour-level, 8 out of his 9 wins came on hard courts (8-15).

Dimitar Kuzmanov | Age: 30 | World No. 189 | Career-High No. 159 | 2023: 5-3 (Marrakech 2R) | Sofia: 1-7 (2021 2R)

> Earned 1st Pepperstone ATP Rankings point in 2009 at age 15, then achieved career-high No. 159 in 2022 at age 29.
 > Played No. 2 singles for Team Bulgaria at 2020 ATP Cup, defeating Cozbinov and Darcis for 1st ATP Tour wins of career.
 > Boasts 24-8 singles record for Bulgaria in Davis Cup play (12-6 in Group II, 10-0 in Group III)
 > Defeated 5 former or future Top-60 players without dropping a set en route to 1st Challenger title of career at 2021 Barcelona.
 > Peaked at No. 35 in juniors after ending career with runner-up finish at 2011 European Championships.

NOTE: Kuzmanov makes his 8th main draw appearance in Sofia in 8 years. He seeks Sofia 2R for the 2nd time in career, defeating No. 61 Musetti at 2021 1R for lone win (1-7).

Marton Fucsovics | Age: 31 | World No. 47 | Career-High No. 31 | 2023: 20-20 (Stuttgart SF) | Sofia: 3-2 (2019 Final)

> Achieved career-high No. 31 in 2019 and became highest-ranked Hungarian since No. 29 Taroczy in 1983.
 > Defeated 2-time defending champion Wawrinka en route to 1st ATP Tour title at 2018 Geneva, becoming 1st Hungarian champion since Taroczy at 1982 Hilversum.
 > Rallied for 5-set win over No. 7 Rublev at 2021 Wimbledon to become 1st men's quarter-finalist from Hungary at that event since Asboth in 1948.
 > Advanced to Grand Slam 4R on 3 other occasions, beating No. 5 Medvedev en route to 2020 Roland Garros 4R and to end 0-14 start to career vs. Top 10.
 > Became World No. 1 junior after capturing 2010 Wimbledon boys' singles title without dropping a set.

NOTE: Fucsovics is 12-8 in opening rounds this season, he owns a 5-2 record on tour-level against players ranked outside of Top 100 in 2023.

Terence Atmane | Age: 21 | World No. 134 | Career-High No. 132 | 2023: 1-2 (Shanghai 2R) | Sofia: 0-0 (Debut)

> Left-handed Frenchman broke into Top 500 in July 2022 and Top 200 in September 2023, earning career-high No. 132 in October 2023 after earning 1st ATP Tour win of career at ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai (d. Thompson in 1R).

- > Went 11-1 in three-week span at Challenger events in September 2023, earning 1st final and title at Zhangjiagang after saving 6 MPs vs. Sun in 1R and 2nd title at Guangzhou, saving 3 MPs vs. Polmans in the final.
- > Posted 33-16 Challenger record in 2023, including 18-4 record in tie-breaks at Challenger events and owns 99-54 career ITF Tour record highlighted by 5 titles, latest at 2023 M25 Anapoima in March.
- > Defeated No. 53 O'Connell for biggest win of career at 2023 Guangzhou CH QF en route to the title win.
- > Reached career-high No. 20 on the ITF Juniors circuit, highlighted by run to 2020 Roland Garros boys' doubles QF.

NOTE: Atmane seeks his biggest career win against Fucsovics (0-3 vs Top 50). This is his 3th ATP Tour main draw tournament, after making ATP Tour debut at Zhuhai and qualifying for ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai.
