Marc-Andrea Huesler (SUI) vs [8] Daniel Altmaier (GER) **Altmaier Leads 1-0**

23 Roland Garros (France) Clay R128 Daniel Altmaier 6-3 6-4 6-4

Marc-Andrea Huesler | Age: 27 | World No. 88 | Career-High No. 47 | 2023: 10-19 (6 times in 2R) | Event: 3-1 (2020 SF)
> Swiss No. 1 broke into Top 100 at age 26 in July 2022, then achieved career-high No. 47 in February 2023
> Boasts 80-61 Challenger record (5-1 in finals), including clay-court titles in 2022 at Mexico City and Aguascalientes.
> Defeated 2021 champion Ivashka and 2021 finalist M. Ymer en route to 2022 Winston-Salem SF as Q
> Qualified at Halle, Wimbledon, Bastad, Winston-Salem and ATP Masters 1000 Paris in 2022.
> Beat #NextGenATP players Musetti in SF and Rune in final en route to 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Sofia.

NOTE: Huesler aims to equal personal-best 11 wins in a single season (2022 – 11). In 2020, came from qualifying to record 1st of 3 career ATP Tour SFs, earning biggest win of career over No. 12 Fognini in 2R.

Daniel Altmaier | Age: 24 | World No. 51 (Career-High) | 2023: 10-15 (2 times in QF) | Event: 3-1 (2021 SF)
> Finished at No. 100 in 2021 year-end rankings, then achieved career-high No. 51 in July 2023 after defeating No. 7 Rublev for biggest win of career at 2023 Hamburg to reach his 7th ATP Tour QF.
> Ended 2022 season with 13 wins in his last 14 Challenger matches, including back-to-back titles at Lima-2 and Guayaquil before earning 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Madrid as a LL.
> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SFs of career in back-to-back weeks at Umag and Kitzbuhel in July 2021.
> Made Grand Slam qualifying debut at 2020 Roland Garros and earned 6th win of tournament over No. 8 Berrettini to reach 4R and beat another Italian No. 9 Sinner en route to 2023 Roland Garros 3R.
> Hits a one-handed backhand and says that his idols growing up were fellow one-handers Federer and Wawrinka.

NOTE: 9 of 10 tour-level wins Altmaier recorded this season came on clay, highlighted by quarter-final appearances at ATP Masters 1000 Madrid (l. to Coric) and Hamburg (l. to Zhang).

[WC] Thiago Seyboth Wild (BRA) vs [Q] Dennis Novak (AUT) **First Meeting**

Thiago Seyboth Wild | Age: 23 | World No. 117 | Career-High No. 106 | 2023: 2-2 (Roland Garros 3R) | Event: 0-1 (2021 1R)
> Former Top-10 junior achieved career-high No. 106 in 2020 after reaching 2nd Challenger final of career at Aix-en-Provence.
> Upset World No. 2 Medvedev at 2023 Roland Garros in five sets to record his first career Grand Slam match win and first tour-level win in 15 months.
> Captured 2020 Santiago title as 19-year-old WC (d. Ruud), becoming 1st ATP Tour champion born in 2000s and youngest Brazilian champion in Open Era.
> One week before Santiago, saved 3 MPs to beat Davidovich Fokina in 2020 Rio de Janeiro 1R as WC – longest ATP Tour match at 3:50 since 2009 Madrid SF (Nadal d. Djokovic in 4:03).
> Also earned 1st ATP Tour win of career on home clay, defeating E. Ymer in 2019 Sao Paulo 1R as WC.
> Has an 89-73 career record on ATP Challenger Tour (3-2 in finals), winning titles at 2019 Guayaquil, 2023 Vina del Mar and 2023 Buenos Aires.
> Ended junior career by beating fellow #NextGenATP player Musetti for 2018 US Open boys' singles title.

NOTE: Seyboth Wild earned all 11-career tour-level wins on clay and earned both tour-level wins this year at Roland Garros, defeating No. 2 Medvedev in 1R and Pella in 2R (l. to Nishioka in 3R).

Dennis Novak | Age: 29 | World No. 166 | Career-High No. 85 | 2023: 0-2 (Wimbledon 1R) | Event: 3-7 (2015, 2018-19 2R)
> Broke into Top 100 and achieved career-high No. 85 in early-2020 prior to ATP Tour hiatus due to COVID-19.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour QF at 2020 Cologne-1 and defeated No. 17 Fognini for biggest win of career at 2021 ATP Cup.
> Came within 1 win of qualifying for all 4 Grand Slams in 2018, reaching Wimbledon 3R and also qualifying at Australian Open and US Open.
> Earned 3 wins in Match TB en route to 2016 Kitzbuhel doubles final with lifelong friend Thiem (born 6 days apart in same town of Wiener Neustadt).
> Owns 122-108 Challenger record (3-4 in finals), winning titles at 2019 Taipei, 2019 Bratislava-2 and 2023 Nonthaburi-1.

NOTE: Novak defeated compatriot Schwarzler in Q1 and Monteiro in Q2 to make his 8th main draw appearance at the event. He aims to record his 1st tour-level win since 2022 Wimbledon (d. Bagnis in 1R, l. to Kubler in 2R).

[7] Dusan Lajovic (SRB) vs Zhang Zhizhen (CHN)

Zhang Leads 1-0

Dusan Lajovic | Age: 33 | World No. 66 | Career-High No. 23 | 2023: 17-14 (Banja Luka Title) | Event: 11-7 (2016 SF)
> Achieved career-high No. 23 after defeating future World No. 1 Medvedev to reach 1st ATP Tour singles final at 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo.
> Entered Monte Carlo as World No. 48 and became lowest-ranked finalist at that event since No. 53 Arazzi in 2001.
> Captured 2nd ATP Tour title at 2023 Banja Luka, defeating World No. 1 Djokovic in QF for biggest win of career and No. 6 Rublev in the final.
> Won 1st ATP Tour singles title at 2019 Umag, doubles title at 2015 Istanbul w/Albot and team title at 2020 ATP Cup as member of Team Serbia.
> Advanced to Grand Slam 4R on 2 occasions: 2014 Roland Garros and 2021 Australian Open.
> Qualified 12 times at ATP Masters 1000 events, including en route to 2018 Madrid QF.

NOTE: Lajovic has reached the quarter-finals in Kitzbuhel 5 times in previous 7 main draw appearances and earned 15 of his 17 ATP Tour wins this year on clay.

Zhang Zhizhen | Age: 26 | World No. 53 | Career-High No. 52 | 2023: 11-11 (Hamburg SF) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)
> Became the first Chinese player in Pepperstone ATP Rankings history to break into Top 100 in October 2022 before achieving career-high No. 52 in July 2023 after reaching 4th ATP Tour QF at 2023 Eastbourne.
> At 2023 Roland Garros, became the first Chinese male player to reach the third round at the event in Open Era.
> Won 3 consecutive matches in the deciding set tie-break to become the first Chinese player in ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final at 2023 Madrid, defeating No. 10 Fritz for biggest win of career.
> Qualified at 2021 Wimbledon, becoming 1st Chinese man to compete in main draw of that event in Open Era.
> Also qualified at 2022 US Open, joining fellow qualifier Wu as 1st Chinese men to compete in main draw of that event in Open Era.
> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2023 Hamburg and ATP Tour QFs at 2017 Shenzhen as Q, 2022 Naples as Q, 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid and 2023 Eastbourne.

NOTE: Zhang reached his 1st ATP Tour SF at 2023 Hamburg last week (l. to Djere) after becoming the highest-ranked Chinese player in Pepperstone ATP Rankings history at No. 52 earlier this month.

Facundo Bagnis | Age: 33 | World No. 135 | Career-High No. 55 | 2023: 2-9 (2 times in 2R) | Event: 0-2 (2016-17 1R)
> Achieved career-high No. 55 in 2016 and broke back into Top 100 in 2021 after advancing to 1st ATP Tour final at Santiago.
> Celebrated 31st birthday by competing in 1st ATP Tour SF at 2021 Cordoba as Q after earning 6 wins.
> Advanced to Grand Slam 3R for 1st time at 2021 US Open after entering event with 1-10 record on hard courts.
> In Grand Slam main draw debut, defeated Benneteau 18-16 in 5th at 2014 Roland Garros as Q.
> Boasts 346-205 Challenger record (16-13 in finals), posting 6-0 finals record in 2016 – tied for 2nd-most titles in a single season behind Griekspoor's 8 in 2021.

NOTE: Bagnis came from a set down to defeat Neuchrist in Q1 and Gakhov in Q2 to qualify for an ATP Tour event for the third time in as many weeks (Gstaad, Umag, Kitzbuhel).

Dominic Thiem | Age: 29 | World No. 116 | Career High No. 3 | 2023: 9-17 (2 times in QF) | Event: 14-8 (2019 Title)
> Achieved career-high No. 3 in March 2020 and remained in Top 5 until suffering right wrist tear in June 2021.
> Playing in his 4th Grand Slam final, defeated A. Zverev in 5th-set TB to win 2020 US Open title, becoming 1st player to win US Open final from 2 sets down since Gonzales in 1949 (Amateur Era).
> Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals each year from 2016-20, defeating No. 3 Federer and No. 2 Djokovic en route to 2019 championship match, then beating No. 2 Nadal and No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2020 final.
> Playing in his 3rd ATP Masters 1000 final, defeated 5-time champion Federer to win 2019 Indian Wells title.
> Went 9-3 from 2019-20 against Djokovic, Federer and Nadal, joining Murray as 1 of 2 players with at least 5 career wins over each member of Big 3.

NOTE: Thiem is 6-1 vs. left-handers in tour-level matches on clay since the start of the 2022 season (l. to Monteiro at 2023 Rio de Janeiro 1R) and beat Bagnis in Umag 1R last week.
