MIAMI OPEN PRESENTED BY ITAU TALKING POINTS

- Fourth round action at the **Miami Open presented by Itau** will see 16 players battle for 8 quarter-final spots in Miami, including 7 of the Top 10 seeds, highlighted by most recent champions: No. 1 seed **Carlos Alcaraz**, who lifted the Miami title in 2022 and reigning champion and No. 3 seed **Daniil Medvedev**. There are no Americans in the fourth round of Miami for only the second time in tournament history (2016).
- Alcaraz meets No. 23 seed **Lorenzo Musetti**, with the Spaniard leading 2-1 in their **Lexus ATP Head2Head**. The 2022 champion is on an 8-match winning streak, still aiming to become the first player since **Roger Federer** in 2017 to capture titles at Indian Wells and Miami in the same season, while Musetti looks for the 2nd-biggest win of his career, after defeating No. 1 **Novak Djokovic** in Monte-Carlo last year.
- Medvedev faces left-handed German **Dominik Koepfer**, who will be seeking his biggest win of career. The World No. 4 defeated Koepfer en route to 2 of his 3 US Open finals and will be looking to stay on the path to defend the title for the first time in his career after winning his 20 tour-level titles at 20 different locations.
- Former finalists, 2018 runner-up **Alexander Zverev** and 2021 & 2023 runner-up **Jannik Sinner** also seek a return to the Miami quarter-finals. Zverev faces **Karen Khachanov** for the first time since defeating him in the 2021 Tokyo Olympics final, while Sinner looks to avenge the loss from 2021 Atlanta against unseeded **Christopher O'Connell**, as the 29-year-old Australian looks for his 1st Top 10 win (0-7).
- On **Grandstand**, No. 11 seed **Grigor Dimitrov** brings a 4-0 **Lexus ATP Head2Head** lead as he takes on 2021 Miami champion and No. 8 seed **Hubert Hurkacz**. Dimitrov looks to reach his 1st Miami QF to complete the set of quarter-finals at all ATP Masters 1000 events, while Hurkacz attempts to reach his 3rd Miami QF.
- In Shanghai last October, **Fabian Marozsan** defeated **Alex de Minaur** en route to becoming the first Hungarian to reach an ATP Masters 1000 QF since the series began in 1990. On Tuesday, de Minaur seeks revenge, aiming to become the first player on the ATP Tour this season to earn 20 wins.

Dominik Koepfer | Age: 29 | World No. 50 | Career-High No. 49 | 2024: 8-5 (2 QFs) | Miami: 3-0 (2024 4R)

> Improved year-end ranking in 6 straight seasons (2016-21), breaking into Top 100 in 2019 and Top 50 in 2021, earning career-high No. 49 in March 2024.

> Did not drop a set en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2021 Acapulco and 2nd SF at 2023 Los Cabos.

> Qualified and made ATP Masters 1000 main draw debut at 2020 Rome, where he earned biggest win of career over No. 9 Monfils en route to 1st ATP Tour QF.

> Posted 6 wins en route to 2019 US Open 4R as Q, then reached 3R at Roland Garros, Wimbledon, Tokyo Olympics and ATP Masters 1000 Paris in 2021.

> Earned finance degree and was a 2-time All-American at Tulane University in New Orleans (2013-16).

NOTE: Koepfer is 1-15 vs. Top 10 players (after 1-1 start) and 0-7 vs. Top 5, looking for the biggest win of his career to reach his 8th ATP Tour QF (2-5), second on ATP Masters 1000 level (2020 Rome, l. to Djokovic).

Daniil Medvedev | Age: 28 | World No. 4 | Career-High No. 1 | 2024: 16-3 (2 Finals) | Miami: 16-4 (2023 Title)
 > Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in 2004.
 > Six-time Grand Slam finalist owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.
 > Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).
 > Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.
 > Won 18 of his 20 singles titles on hard courts and all 20 of his titles at different events, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami and 2023 Rome, his 1st career clay ATP Tour title.

NOTE: Medvedev is looking for 350th win of his career (349-139) to reach 19th ATP Masters 1000 QF (13-5), 16th on hard courts. He aims to defend a title for the first time in his career, previously coming one match away at 2020 Nitto ATP Finals, 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Paris, and 2023 Vienna. He is 22-1 vs. players ranked outside of Top 20 since Wimbledon.

Musetti will need to close the gap in Forehand Shot Quality if he's to trouble Alcaraz. Musetti hit 44% of his forehands from 2m+ behind the baseline compared to Alcaraz's 28%, add to that the 80 mph to 77 mph advantage in avg. speed Alcaraz had on the forehands to create both the difference in Shot Quality and the dominance In Attack.

Carlos Alcaraz | Age: 20 | World No. 2 | Career-High No. 1 | 2024: 14-3 (Indian Wells Title) | Miami: 12-2 (2022 Title)

> Youngest and first teenage World No. 1 and year-end No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), making record rise from No. 32 at end of 2021 to No. 1 at age 19 in September 2022, then remaining atop rankings through end of season.
 > Became third Spanish man in Wimbledon history to win the singles title after Nadal (2008, 2010) and Santana (1966), defeating 7-time champion Djokovic in a 5-set battle for his 2nd Grand Slam title.
 > Beat Ruud in 2022 US Open final for No. 1 ranking, becoming youngest men's champion at US Open since Sampras, 19, in 1990 and at any Grand Slam event since Nadal, 19, at 2005 Roland Garros.
 > Became youngest ATP 500 champion at 2022 Rio de Janeiro (177 events since 2009) and 3rd-youngest ATP Masters 1000 champion at 2022 Miami (299 events since 1990).

- > Youngest player to defeat both Nadal and Djokovic and 1st to do so at same clay-court event, beating them on back-to-back days en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2022 Madrid.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2021 US Open, becoming youngest men's quarter-finalist at US Open since Koch, 18, in 1963 (Amateur Era) and at any Grand Slam since Chang, 18, at 1990 Roland Garros.

NOTE: Alcaraz comes into the match on an 8-match winning streak after capturing his 5th ATP Masters 1000 title in Indian Wells last week. He owns a 11-2 record in R16 of ATP Masters 1000 events in his career and is 24-1 vs. players outside Top 20 on hard courts since the start of 2023 (l. to No. 45 Safiullin at ATP Masters 1000 Paris).

- Lorenzo Musetti** | Age: 22 | World No. 24 | Career-High No. 15 | 2024: 7-8 (Adelaide QF) | Miami: 4-3 (2024 4R)
- > Former World No. 1 junior earned personal-best 34 wins in 2022, then broke into Top 20 in January 2023 and achieved career-high No. 15 in June.
 - > Defeated 19-year-old Alcaraz in 2022 Hamburg final at age 20, marking youngest ATP Tour final since 2005 Bastad (19-year-old Nadal d. 19-year-old Berdych).
 - > At 2023 Monte Carlo, earned 1st 6-0 6-0 victory at an ATP Masters 1000 event since 2016 over Nardi in 2R before upsetting No. 1 Djokovic in 3R for biggest win of career to reach 2nd ATP Masters 1000 QF.
 - > Did not drop a set en route to 2nd ATP title at 2022 Naples, defeating countryman and United Cup teammate Berrettini in final on home soil.
 - > Advanced to 2021 Roland Garros 4R (l. to No. 1 Djokovic from 2 sets up) and 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Paris QF (d. No. 4 Ruud in 3R).
 - > Reached 2018 US Open boys' singles final, won 2019 Australian Open boys' singles title and defeated Wawrinka at 2020 Rome to become 1st player born in 2002 to win an ATP Tour match.

NOTE: Musetti is 5-19 vs. Top 10 players, aiming to break a 10-match losing streak against them since defeating No. 1 Djokovic at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo (1-4 vs. Top-2). He aims to reach his 3rd ATP Masters 1000 QF after reaching the stage at 2022 Paris and 2023 Monte-Carlo.

- Alexander Zverev** | Age: 26 | World No. 5 | Career-High No. 2 | 2024: 16-5 (2 SFs) | Miami: 15-8 (2018 Final)
- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal.
 - > Led ATP Tour with 6 titles in 2021 and leads all players born since 1990 with 21 career titles, defeating No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and 2021 Nitto ATP Finals championships.
 - > Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.
 - > Defeated Djokovic at 2017 Rome and Federer at 2017 Montreal for 1st and 2nd of his 5 ATP Masters 1000 titles.
 - > Joined Murray and Thiem as 3rd player to defeat Djokovic on hard (3 times), Federer on grass (2016 Halle SF) and Nadal on clay (2021 Madrid QF).

NOTE: Zverev aims to reach his 27th ATP Masters 1000 QF (16-10) to tie Edberg, Raonic and Tsonga for 11th-most quarter-finals at this level since the series began in 1990. He attempts to advance to Indian Wells and Miami QFs in the same season for the first time in his career and earn his 250th hard court win of career (249-115).

Karen Khachanov | Age: 27 | World No. 16 | Career-High No. 8 | 2024: 12-5 (Doha Title) | Miami: 8-7 (2023 SF)
 > Broke into Top 10 and achieved career-high No. 8 in July 2019 after ending 2018 season at No. 11.
 > Upset Top-10 players Isner, A. Zverev, Thiem and Djokovic en route to 2018 ATP Masters 1000 Paris title, but went on a 23-match losing streak to Top 10 players (August 2019-March 2023), before beating No. 3 Tsitsipas en route to 4th ATP Masters 1000 SF at 2023 Miami, first since 2019 Montreal.
 > At 2018 Paris, became 1st unseeded ATP Masters 1000 champion since Nalbandian at 2007 Paris.
 > Advanced to QFs of all 4 Grand Slam events, highlighted by runs to 2022 US Open SF and 2023 Australian Open SF.
 > Entered 2020 Tokyo Olympics as No. 4 men's player on Team ROC and went on to earn silver medal (held in 2021).

NOTE: Khachanov is 12-48 vs. Top 10 players (0-1 in 2024), seeking first win since defeating No. 6 Rublev at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid and first Top 5 win since defeating No. 3 Tsitsipas in Miami 4R last year. He attempts to advance to his 8th ATP Masters 1000 QF (4-3), fourth since the start of 2023 (2023 Miami, Madrid, Paris).

Tomas Machac | Age: 23 | World No. 60 (Career-High) | 2024: 9-5 (Marseille QF) | Miami: 3-0 (2024 4R)
 > Former Top-20 junior broke into Top 100 in time for 2022 year-end rankings, then earned career-high No. 60 in March 2024 soon after reaching 3rd ATP Tour QF at Marseille.
 > Defeated former champion Sock en route to 1st ATP Tour QF at 2023 Houston.
 > Earned 1st Top 20 win over No. 17 Tiafoe en route to 1st Grand Slam 3R at 2024 Australian Open.
 > Representing Czech Republic, defeated Sousa to reach 2020 Tokyo Olympics 2R (held in 2021) and beat both Gasquet and Evans during 2021 Davis Cup Finals.
 > Boasts 110-54 Challenger record (6-5 in finals), including back-to-back titles at Orleans and Mouilleron le Captif in October 2023.
 > Says that his favourite sports team is Chicago Bulls and his hero is Michael Jordan, who played his last game as a Bull in 1998 – 2 years before Machac was born.

NOTE: Machac earned the biggest win of his career over No. 6 Rublev in 2R then beat 2-time champion Murray in 3R to advance to his 1st ATP Masters 1000 4R. A week after Lehecka became the first Czech in ATP Masters 1000 QF since 2017, Machac aims to join him and guarantee himself a Top 50 debut on Monday.

Matteo Arnaldi | Age: 23 | World No. 38 (Career-High) | 2024: 10-5 (Brisbane QF) | Miami: 3-0 (2024 4R)
 > Broke into Top 500 in September 2021, Top 200 in August 2022 and Top 100 in May 2023, achieving career-high No. 38 in January 2024.
 > Reached 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2023 Umag and 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2023 US Open.
 > Qualified to reach 3R at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid, defeating No. 4 Ruud for biggest win of career a week after earning first career ATP Tour win at 2023 Barcelona (d. Munar).
 > Owns 58-38 Challenger record (4-2 in finals), highlighted by 1st title on home soil at Francavilla al Mare.
 > Peaked at No. 22 in juniors, posting 80-42 singles record (3 titles) and 34-35 doubles record (2 titles).

NOTE: Arnaldi is playing in his first ATP Masters 1000 4R and aims to reach his 3rd quarter-final on the ATP Tour (2023 Umag, 2024 Brisbane). He rose 3 spots to No. 35 on the PIF ATP Live Rankings and would reach No. 32 with a 4R win.

Casper Ruud | Age: 25 | World No. 8 | Career-High No. 2 | 2024: 18-4 (2 Finals) | Miami: 8-4 (2022 Final)
 > Top-ranked Norwegian in history rose from No. 7 to career-high No. 2 after falling to Alcaraz in 2022 US Open final with No. 1 ranking at stake.
 > First Norwegian to win an ATP Tour title (10), play at Nitto ATP Finals (2021 SF, 2022 final), and reach both a Grand Slam final (2022 Roland Garros, US Open, 2023 Roland Garros) and an ATP Masters 1000 final (2022 Miami).
 > Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.

- > Former World No. 1 junior leads ATP Tour since start of 2020 season in clay-court wins (92), finals (13) and titles (9).
- > Defeated No. 4 A. Zverev on a hard court for biggest win of career en route to 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Miami final.

NOTE: Ruud earned his 50th ATP Masters 1000 win over Van Assche in 2R and his 100th hard court tour-level win over Davidovich Fokina in 3R. He aims to reach his 12th ATP Masters 1000 QF (7-4), second of 2024 and third since the start of 2023 season.

Nicolas Jarry | Age: 28 | World No. 23 | Career-High No. 18 | 2024: 10-7 (Buenos Aires F) | Miami: 3-3 (2024 4R)

- > Unranked to begin 2021, he earned a career-high No. 18 in January 2024 becoming the 7th Chilean to reach Top 20 since the start of PIF ATP Rankings (since 1973).
- > In 2023, came from a set down three times in five matches to win 2nd ATP Tour title in Santiago, his hometown, and upset double defending champion Ruud in QF and 2019 champion Zverev in SF to en route to 3rd title in Geneva.
- > Won 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Bastad without losing a set to reach No. 38, the mark that stood as his career-high until May 2023.
- > Saved 1 MP vs. No. 3 A. Zverev in 2019 Barcelona 2R, but squandered 2 MPs vs. A. Zverev in Geneva final one month later.
- > Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings after advancing to 2013 Roland Garros boys' doubles final with countryman Garin.
- > Parents, Allan and Cecilia, are former pro volleyball players; grandfather, Jaime Fillol, great-uncle, Alvaro Fillol, and uncle, Martin Rodriguez, are former ATP players.

NOTE: Jarry saved 2 MPs to defeat Draper in 2R in 2nd-longest match in tournament history (3h36m) and now seeks 2nd ATP Masters 1000 QF (2023 Shanghai). He is 8-11, including 1-0 in 2024, defeating No. 2 Alcaraz for biggest win of career in Buenos Aires SF last month.

Christopher O'Connell | Age: 29 | World No. 66 | Career-High No. 53 | 2024: 9-6 (Adelaide QF) | Miami: 3-2 (2024 4R)

- > Unranked to begin 2019, broke into Top 200 in September 2019 and ended 2022 season at No. 78, before reaching career-high No. 53 in September 2023 after winning 5th Challenger title at Shanghai without losing a set.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 San Diego after reaching 1st ATP Tour QF at 2021 Atlanta as Q.
- > Qualified at 6 tour-level events in 2022, including hometown tournament in Sydney.
- > Defeated No. 13 Schwartzman for biggest win of career and to reach 2022 Australian Open 3R as WC and No. 16 Zverev to reach 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2023 Munich.
- > Played 108 main draw and qualifying singles matches across all tours in 2019, posting 50-11 record on ITF World Tennis Tour with 3 titles in 10 finals.

NOTE: O'Connell is 0-7 vs. Top 10 players, looking for the biggest win of his career to become the first Australian to defeat Sinner since Duckworth at 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Toronto (Aussies are 3-20 vs. Sinner). He is playing in his first ATP Masters 1000 4R and could reach No. 47 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#) by reaching 1st QF.

Jannik Sinner | Age: 22 | World No. 3 (Career-High) | 2024: 18-1 (2 Titles) | Miami: 15-3 (2021, 2023 Finals)
 > Unranked to begin 2018, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager and broke into Top 10 at age 20 in 2021, then reached career-high No. 3 in February 2024, becoming the highest-ranked Italian in PIF ATP Rankings history.
 > At 2024 Australian Open, defeated 10-time champion Djokovic in SF and rallied from two sets down in final against Medvedev to win his 1st Grand Slam title. Became 1st player to beat Djokovic in SF or later at the tournament.
 > Became the first Italian champion in Australian Open tournament history and second Italian man to win a Grand Slam title in Open Era (Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros).
 > Earned career-best 64 wins in 2023, setting the record for most wins by an Italian player in a single season in Open Era, highlighted by first ATP Masters 1000 title at Toronto.
 > As 19-year-old in 2021, became 1st teenager to win an ATP 500 title at Washington and 1st Italian finalist in tournament history of ATP Masters 1000 Miami (since 1985).

Dimitrov's Steal score of 44% (35% 52-wk avg.) was a big difference maker in this 3 setter, combined with 80% Conversion gives a 96% win probability on ATP Tour. Hurkacz will need to close that gap alongside another high Shot Quality Serve performance.

 > Surpassed 400 wins in September 2023, highlighted by biggest win over No. 1 Djokovic at 2013 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.
 > Advanced to Grand Slam SFs at 2014 Wimbledon, 2017 Australian Open and 2019 US Open, as well as 10 ATP Masters 1000 SFs.

 > Top Polish men's player in history appeared in Nitto ATP Finals in 2021 and 2023 and reached career-high No. 8 in January 2024.
 > Entered 2021 Wimbledon on 6-match losing streak, then reached 1st Grand Slam SF by defeating 8-time champion Federer 6-3 7-6(4) 6-0 in final singles match of Swiss' career.

- > Upset 5 seeds to win 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Miami title and saved a championship point to win 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai after losing in the 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Montreal final.
- > Also advanced to ATP Masters 1000 SFs at 2021 Paris, 2022 Miami and 2023 Cincinnati and captured ATP Masters 1000 doubles titles at 2020 Paris w/Auger-Aliassime and 2022 Miami w/Isner.
- > Defeated No. 1 Medvedev 6-1 6-4 in 63 minutes to win 5th ATP Tour singles title in 5th final at 2022 Halle (now 7-2 in finals).

- > Two-time Next Gen ATP Finals runner-up achieved career-high No. 9 in February 2024 soon after defeating No. 1 Djokovic at 2024 United Cup for biggest win of career.
 - > Earned personal-best 47 victories in 2022, then captured biggest of 8 ATP Tour titles in Acapulco in 2023 and 2024.
 - > Advanced to his first ATP Masters 1000 QF, SF and final at 2023 Toronto, losing to Sinner.
 - > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2020 US Open immediately after winning 1st ATP Tour doubles title at 2020 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati w/Carreno Busta in team debut and at same venue.

- > Broke into Top 200 in August 2022, Top 100 in June 2023 and earned career-high No. 57 in January 2024.
 - > In ATP Tour debut, qualified and defeated No. 2 Alcaraz for biggest win of career en route to 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome 4R, then reached QF at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai QF (d. No. 5 Ruud in 4R).
 - > Earned 1st Grand Slam main draw win at 2023 US Open (d. Gasquet) and reached 3R at 2024 Australian Open.
 - > Owns 55-30 record on Challenger tour (3-1 in finals), winning titles at 2022 Banja Luka, 2023 Antalya and 2023 Perugia and losing to compatriot Fucsovics in 2022 Bratislava-2 final.
 - > Began playing tennis at age 5 and credits his father for teaching him everything about the sport.

NOTE: Marozsan is playing in his 4th ATP Masters 1000 event, reaching the 4R on all four occasions (2023 Rome 4R, 2023 Shanghai QF, 2024 Indian Wells 4R, 2024 Miami). He will make a Top 50 debut on Monday, currently No. 47 on the [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#) and would move to No. 38 with a 4R win. He is 3-1 vs. Top 10 players in his career.
