Arthur Cazaux | Age: 23 | World No. 62 | Career-High No. 58 | 2025: 15-15 (Kitzbuhel Final) | Metz: 0-1 (2023 1R)

> After peaking at No. 4 in juniors in 2020, broke inside Top 100 in January 2024 after defeating No. 8 Rune for biggest win of career en route to Australian Open 4R and achieved career-high No. 58 in October 2025.

> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2025 Gstaad and 1st final at 2025 Kitzbuhel in back-to-back weeks.

> Defeated countryman Mannarino in ATP Tour main draw debut at 2021 Geneva as 18-year-old WC and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2021 Roland Garros as WC.

> Owns 79-40 Challenger record (4-5 in finals), winning titles at both 2022 and 2023 Nonthaburi-2 as Q, 2024 Noumea and 2025 Jinan.

> Went 122-48 on ITF Junior Circuit, highlighted by run to 2020 Australian Open boys' singles final.

NOTE: Cazaux seeks 3rd ATP Tour win on home soil this season after defeating Wawrinka in his hometown, Montpellier, and Darderi at ATP Masters 1000 Paris. He is one of 10 Frenchmen in the field, as they aim to win Metz for 14th time in 22 editions.

Adrian Mannarino | Age: 37 | World No. 60 | Career-High No. 17 | 2025: 13-14 (2x 4R) | Metz: 4-8 (2008 SF)

> Ended 12 straight years in Top 75 of PIF ATP Rankings (2013-24) and became the oldest man to break into Top 20 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 35, achieving career-high No. 17 in January 2024.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title in 7th final of career at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch, 2nd title in 11th final of career at 2022 Winston-Salem.

> Posted personal-best 43 wins in 2023, highlighted by ATP Tour titles in Newport, Astana and Sofia.

> Earned first Top 5 win over No. 5 Cilic to reach biggest final of career at 2017 Tokyo and biggest win of career over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch.

> Reached Australian Open 4R in 2022 and 2024 and Wimbledon 4R in 2013, 2017 and 2018, before posting 1st Top 10 win at a Grand Slam over No. 6 Shelton to reach 2025 US Open 4R.

NOTE: Mannarino made his tournament debut in 2008, reaching his first ATP Tour SF as a qualifier, and is looking for first win at the event since defeating Millot 10 years ago. He bids to be the third-oldest match winner in tournament history after Gasquet, 38, in 2024 (d. Monteiro) and Simon, 37, in 2022 (d. Goffin).

Terence Atmane | Age: 23 | World No. 69 | Career-High No. 61 | 2025: 7-9 (Cincinnati SF) | Metz: 0-0 (Debut)

> Broke into Top 200 in September 2023, before securing Top 100 debut in August 2025 after posting two Top 10 wins en route to ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati SF as Q, achieving career-high No. 61 in September.

> Made ATP Tour debut at 2023 Zhuhai as Q and beat Thompson at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai for 1st win.

> Qualified to make Grand Slam debut at 2024 Australian Open, taking a set off eventual finalist Medvedev in 1R.

> Went 11-1 in three-week span at Challenger events in September 2023, earning 1st final and title at Zhangjiagang after saving 6 MPs vs. Sun in 1R and 2nd title at Guangzhou, saving 3 MPs vs. Polmans in the final.

> Owns 19-10 Challenger record in 2025 with titles in Busan and Guangzhou and went 35-18 on Challenger level in 2023, including 19-5 record in tie-breaks in Challenger events that year.

> Reached career-high No. 20 on the ITF Juniors circuit, highlighted by run to 2020 Roland Garros boys' doubles QF w/Malgaroli.

NOTE: Atmane seeks 1st tour-level win on home soil and 1st ATP Tour win indoors (0-3). Frenchman earned 5 of his 7 ATP Tour wins this season by reaching his 1st ATP Tour SF at ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati, including wins over No. 4 Fritz and No.9 Rune.

Hugo Gaston | Age: 25 | World No. 101 | Career-High No. 58 | 2025: 7-17 (7 times in 2R) | Metz: 1-3 (2024 2R)
> Broke into Top 100 after reaching 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Paris QF as Q, then achieved career-high No. 58 in July 2022.
> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF, SF and final at 2021 Gstaad as World No. 155 and competed at Next Gen ATP Finals to end season.
> Saved 2 MPs to beat defending champion Baez at 2024 Kitzbuhel en route to 2nd ATP Tour final.
> At 2020 Roland Garros, became 1st Frenchman to reach 4R in tournament debut since Dominguez in 1971, defeating 2015 champion Wawrinka in 5 sets before falling in 5 sets to 2-time finalist Thiem.
> As 239th-ranked WC, became lowest-ranked player to reach Grand Slam 4R since No. 248 Canas at 2004 Australian Open and Roland Garros 4R since No. 283 Di Pasquale in 2002.
> Ended 2018 as World No. 2 junior after winning gold medal in boys' singles and bronze medal in both boys' doubles and mixed doubles at Youth Olympics.

NOTE: Gaston aims to record first ATP Tour win since defeating Bellucci at ATP Masters 1000 Toronto in July. He reached back-to-back Challenger finals in October, losing to Virtanen in Roanne and defeating Spizzirri in Brest.
