Borges Leads 1-0

Nuno Borges | Age: 27 | World No. 51 | Career-High No. 46 | 2024: 13-15 (2 QFs) | Mallorca: 0-0 (Debut)

> Became the 2nd Portuguese man to break inside Top 50 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973) in 2024, reaching career-high No. 46 in February 2024.

> Defeated No. 13 Dimitrov for biggest win of career to reach 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2024 Australian Open, becoming the first Portuguese in fourth round in tournament's history.

> Captured the Challenger title in Phoenix before winning a first-round qualifying match at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Miami within 24 hours.

> Advanced to 10 Challenger finals, winning titles at 2021 Antalya-3, 2022 Barletta, 2023 Monterrey, 2023-24 Phoenix and 2023 Maia in his hometown.

> Five-time All-American during 4-year college career at Mississippi State University, posting 31-match win streak that ended in his last match (l. to Jubb in 2019 NCAA singles final).

NOTE: Borges seeks his first tour-level grass win (0-4) and be the first Portuguese to win a main draw match in Mallorca. He is looking for his first ATP Tour win since defeating Passaro to reach ATP Masters 1000 Rome 4R.

Alex Michelsen | Age: 19 | World No. 61 | Career-High No. 60 | 2024: 11-16 (2 QFs) | Mallorca: 0-1 (2023 1R)

> Youngest American in Top 200 of the PIF ATP Rankings earned career-high No. 60 in May 2024 soon after becoming the youngest American in Grand Slam 3R since Young in 2007, reaching 3R at Australian Open.

- > Earned 1st ATP Tour win and reached 1st QF, SF and final at 2023 Newport, becoming the youngest American ATP Tour finalist since Fritz at 2016 Memphis.
- > Defeated No. 9 de Minaur for the biggest win of career in 2024 Los Cabos 2R, before squandering 3 MPs in QF against eventual champion Thompson.
- > Owns a 35-18 Challenger record (2-2 in finals), winning titles at 2023 Chicago and Knoxville.
- > Reached career-high No. 25 in ITF Juniors, highlighted by 2022 Wimbledon boys' doubles title w/Gorzny.
- > Started playing at the age of 3, hitting with his mother, former college player, every day until 15 years of age.

NOTE: Michelsen seeks his first ATP Tour grass win since reaching his first ATP Tour final at 2023 Newport (l. to Mannarino). At 19 years and 9 months, he aims to become the youngest main draw match winner at the event.

R. Bautista Agut | Age: 36 | World No. 83 | Career-High No. 9 | 2024: 10-12 (Hong Kong QF) | Mallorca: 4-2 (2022 Final)
 > Earned 400th win of career in 2024, captured 10th and 11th ATP Tour titles of career in 2022 and ended 2019 at career-high No. 9.
 > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2019 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam SF at 2019 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-9 record in Grand Slam 4R matches.
 > Defeated No. 1 Djokovic in 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai SF, 2019 Doha SF and 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R, as well as No. 1 Medvedev in 2022 Mallorca QF.
 > Went 4-1 at 2022 ATP Cup and 6-0 at 2020 ATP Cup to lead Spain to finals after helping his country win 2019 Davis Cup.
 > Played football for Villarreal C.F. until he was 14 years old.

NOTE: Bautista Agut earned latest of 4 wins over World No. 1s in Mallorca by defeating No. 1 Medvedev en route to 2022 final (l. to Tsitsipas). He is 19-4 in his opening round matches on grass in his career.

Taro Daniel | Age: 31 | World No. 85 | Career-High No. 58 | 2024: 8-14 (Auckland Final) | Mallorca: 0-1 (2022 1R)

- > Achieved career-high No. 58 in January 2024 after reaching 2nd ATP Tour final at Auckland.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SF and final en route to 1st title at 2018 Istanbul joining Nishikori as the only Japanese men to win a tour-level clay court title in Open Era.
- > Led all players by qualifying for 9 tour-level events in 2022, including Australian Open, ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells and ATP Masters 1000 Miami.
- > Also qualified at 2023 Acapulco and defeated No. 4 Ruud in 2R for biggest win of career.
- > Defeated 5-time champion Djokovic to reach 2018 Indian Wells 3R as Q and 5-time finalist Murray to reach 2022 Australian Open 3R as Q.
- > Won 17 of 21 tour-level and Challenger matches during 6-week span in 2016, defeating 2-time medallist Sock at Rio Olympics along the way.

NOTE: Daniel aims to record his first ATP Tour win on grass, 8 years after making grass tour-level debut at 2016 Wimbledon (0-7). He is on a 4-match losing streak, aiming to get first win since defeating Vukic at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.

R. Carballes Baena | Age: 31 | World No. 62 | Career-High No. 49 | 2024: 15-14 (Marrakech Final) | Mallorca: 1-2 (2023 2R)
> Former World No. 8 junior entered Top 50 at 30 years of age at career high No. 49 after rallying from a set down three times in five matches to win 2nd ATP Tour title at 2023 Marrakech.
> At 2018 Quito, became 1st Spanish qualifier to win an ATP Tour title since Almagro at 2006 Valencia.
> Defeated No. 11 Shapovalov 8-6 in 5th after 5 hours to reach 2020 Roland Garros 3R for 1st Top 20 win and defeated No. 4 Rune at 2023 US Open for 1st Top 10 win in 14th attempt.
> Defeated Goffin for 1st ATP Tour win en route to 2014 Casablanca SF as Q.
> Boasts 233-151 Challenger record (11-8 in finals), including clay-court titles at 2022 and 2023 Seville.

NOTE: Carballes Baena owns a 3-11 record on tour-level grass, with two wins coming last year at Mallorca (d. Ivashka) and Wimbledon (d. Arnaldi). He is 14-14 vs. fellow Spanish players after a 0-8 start.

P. Carreno Busta | Age: 32 | World No. 872 | Career-High No. 10 | 2024: 0-1 (Roland Garros 1R) | Mallorca: 2-2 (2021 SF)
> Winner of 7 singles and 4 doubles titles achieved career-high No. 10 in singles and No. 16 in doubles during 2017 season.
> Captured 2022 Montreal championship to become 15th different Spaniard to win an ATP Masters 1000 title since start of series in 1990.
> Defeated No. 1 Djokovic and No. 2 Medvedev en route to 2020 Tokyo Olympics bronze medal (held in 2021).
> Reached US Open SF and Roland Garros QF in both 2017 and 2020, as well as 2016 US Open doubles final with countryman Garcia-Lopez.
> Member of 2019 Davis Cup championship team and helped Team Spain reach ATP Cup finals in 2020 (5-1 in doubles) and 2022 (4-1 in singles).

NOTE: Carreno Busta played his first match in over 15 months at Roland Garros last month (l. to Navone in 1R) and is now seeking his first win since defeating Cachin in 2023 Australian Open 1R (l. to Bonzi in 2R).
