DAY 6 TALKING POINTS

- Four-time champion **Novak Djokovic** takes a 6-0 **Lexus ATP Head2Head** lead into his encounter with **Cameron Norrie**, as 38-year-old Serbian bids to become the oldest man to reach US Open 4R since Connors, 38, in 1991. Record holder for most Grand Slam men's singles titles (24) and wins (394), aims to pass Federer for most hard-court wins at this level (191), while Norrie looks to record first Top 10 win at Grand Slam level (0-10).

- World No. 2 **Carlos Alcaraz** leads the ATP Tour in wins (56) and titles (6) this season and is currently on a 41-2 run since April. At 22 years and 3 months, Spaniard aims to record his 80th Grand Slam match wins (79-13) and meets 23-year-old **Luciano Darderi**. Alcaraz aims to record 20th win at US Open (19-3), he would become fifth man born since 1990 to record 20 wins at 3 or more Grand Slams after Dimitrov, Sinner, Thiem and Zverev.

- In American action on **Louis Armstrong Stadium**, World No. 4 **Taylor Fritz** takes on qualifier **Jerome Kym**, as last year's finalist aims to continue his campaign to become first American men's Grand Slam champion since Roddick in 2003. World No. 6 **Ben Shelton** is 14-2 during this year's summer hard-court swing and meets 37-year-old **Adrian Mannarino**, who seeks first Top 10 win at Grand Slam level (0-22). World No. 17 **Frances Tiafoe** attempts to advance to US Open 4R to become the only man to reach 4R of this event every year this decade (since 2020) and faces qualifier **Jan-Lennard Struff** on **Grandstand**.

LUCIANO DARDERI

US Open Stats

- > Playing in his second US Open main draw, making his debut last year, losing to Baez in 1R.
- > He is seeded at a Grand Slam for the first time in career after winning back-to-back titles in Bastad and Umag in July.
- > Defeated Hijikata 6-2 6-1 6-2 in 1R and WC Spizzirri in 6-0 7-6(3) 2-6 6-4 in 2R to record back-to-back tour-level wins on hard courts for the first time in his career.
- > Former Top-10 junior also played in boys' singles in 2019, losing to Blu Baker in 2019 1R.
- > One of 4 Italian men in US Open 3R (also Cobolli, Musetti, Sinner), tied for most in tournament history after 4 also advanced last year (Arnaldi, Cobolli, Musetti, Sinner).
- > 23-year-old is 0-2 vs. Top 10, looking for biggest win of career to be first Italian man to earn a Top-2 win at US Open.
- > Contesting his second Grand Slam 3R after Wimbledon earlier this year (l. to Thompson) and attempts to reach his first fourth round at this level.
- > Attempts to be the first man to defeat Alcaraz before the championship match of any event played since April.

Career Highlights

- > Former Top 10 junior started 2024 season as No. 128, then broke into Top 100 in February, Top 50 in May and achieved career-high No. 32 in August.
- > Captured his 1st ATP Tour title at 2024 Cordoba, defeating Bagnis in 3rd final between two qualifiers since the ATP Tour was established in 1990.
- > In 2025, won Bastad and Umag titles in back-to-back weeks in July after Marrakech title in April, becoming one of three players to win 3 tour-level titles in 2025 (also Alcaraz - 6, Bublik - 3).
- > Owns 90-61 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning titles at 2023 Todi, 2023 Lima-2 and 2024 Perugia.

- > Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings in February 2020 after earning 3 singles and 3 doubles titles to start the season.
- > Born in Argentina, started tennis at age 4 with his father Luciano Enrique, a former tennis player and current coach.

CARLOS ALCARAZ

US Open Stats

- > Alcaraz is playing in US Open main draw for the fifth straight year, reaching at least the quarter-final stage in first three appearances (2021 QF, 2022 Title, 2023 SF) before losing to van de Zandschulp in 2R last year.
- > In 2023, became the youngest men's No. 1 seed (20Y 3M) in tournament history and reached the semi-finals in his title defense, before losing to Medvedev.
- > Beat No. 7-ranked Ruud in 2022 final in 4 sets to become 1st teenager to capture US Open men's title since Sampras in 1990 (19 years, 28 days). Afterwards became the 28th World No. 1 (and youngest) in the history of the PIF ATP Rankings (since 1973). Became 1st man to win US Open title in 1st or 2nd appearance since Pancho Gonzales in 1948 (2nd).
- > En route to title, earned 5-set wins over [15] Cilic in 4R, [11] Sinner in QF in 5h, 15m - saved 1 MP and [22] Tiafoe in SF. Was 1st man to save match point en route to US Open title since Wawrinka in 2016 (1 vs. Evans in 3R). Has 5-0 record in 5-set matches at Flushing Meadows.
- > Spent 20H 19M on court – most through 6 US Open matches on record (since 1999) to reach US Open final, where he spent 3H 20M vs. Ruud.
- > Finished the tournament with 23 hours, 39 minutes on court, most by a US Open champion on record (since 1999). The previous record was 2012 champion Murray with 21 hours, 51 minutes.
- > Made US Open debut ranked No. 55 at 18 in 2021 and became youngest men's quarter-finalist at this event since Thomaz Koch, 18, at 1963 US Championships (Amateur Era) and youngest at Grand Slam since 18-year-old Chang at 1990 Roland Garros.
- > In 2021, won 5th-set TB vs. No. 3 Tsitsipas in 3R to earn his first Top 3 win (retired in QF due to upper right leg injury) to be the youngest man to earn Top 10 win at a Grand Slam since Ancic, 18, beat No. 9 Federer at 2002 Wimbledon.
- > Owns 19-2 record at Grand Slams this season, reaching Australian Open QF (l. to Djokovic), saved 3 championship points to win Roland Garros (d. Sinner) and reached Wimbledon final (l. to Sinner).
- > 22-year-old Spaniard leads the ATP Tour in wins (56) and titles (6) this season and has advanced to the final of all 7 events played since losing to Goffin in ATP Masters 1000 Miami 2R in March.
- > Owns 19-1 record vs. Italians since the start of 2024 season, lone loss to No. 1 Sinner in 2025 Wimbledon final and aims to be the second youngest man to record 20 Grand Slam wins in a season in this century after Nadal in 2007-08.
- > On a 41-2 run since April, highlighted by titles in Monte-Carlo, Rome, Roland Garros, Queen's Club and Cincinnati.
- > If he matches or betters Sinner's result at US Open, he will return to World No. 1 for first time since September 2023.
- > He is on an 8-match winning streak after winning ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati earlier this month and earned wins over Opelka 6-4 7-5 6-4 in 1R and Bellucci 6-1 6-0 6-3 in 2R.

Career Highlights

- > Youngest and first teenage World No. 1 and year-end No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), making record rise from No. 32 at end of 2021 to No. 1 at age 19 in September 2022, then remaining atop rankings through end of season and later earning a total of 36 weeks.
- > Beat Ruud in 2022 US Open final for No. 1 ranking, becoming youngest men's champion at US Open since Sampras, 19, in 1990 and at any Grand Slam event since Nadal, 19, at 2005 Roland Garros.
- > Earned fifth set wins over Sinner in SF and Zverev in final to capture 2024 Roland Garros, becoming the youngest man to win a Grand Slam title on all three surfaces.
- > Saved 3 championship points and rallied from 2 sets down for 1st time in career to defeat Sinner in longest Roland Garros final in tournament history (5H29M) to defend the title in 2025.
- > Defeated 7-time champion Djokovic in 2023 and 2024 Wimbledon finals to be the second man in Open Era to win his first 4 Grand Slam finals after Federer (7) and went on a 20-match winning streak at Wimbledon before losing in 2025 final for his 1st loss in a Grand Slam final (after 5-0 start).
- > At 2024 Paris Olympics, became the youngest man to play in a Olympic final in Open Era, earning silver medal (l. to Djokovic).
- > Became youngest ATP 500 champion at 2022 Rio de Janeiro (since 2009) and 3rd-youngest ATP Masters 1000 champion at 2022 Miami (since 1990).
- > He is 8-1 in ATP Masters 1000 finals, only loss at 2023 Cincinnati, where he fell to Djokovic in a 3h49m final (held 1 MP), longest best-of-3 final in ATP Tour era (since 1990).
- > Won Monte-Carlo and Rome in 2025 to join Nadal, Djokovic, Kuerten and Rios as only players to win 3 different ATP Masters 1000 events on clay in series history (since 1990).
- > Youngest player to defeat both Nadal and Djokovic and 1st to do so at same clay-court event, beating them on back-to-back days en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2022 Madrid.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2021 US Open, becoming youngest men's quarter-finalist at US Open since Koch, 18, in 1963 (Amateur Era) and at any Grand Slam since Chang, 18, at 1990 Roland Garros.

NOVAK DJOKOVIC

US Open Stats

- > Making 19th US Open appearance since debut in 2005, only missing tournament twice (2017, 2022). Owns 4-6 record in US Open finals and in 2023 became the oldest US Open champion in Open Era.
- > Looks for sole all-time record for most Grand Slam titles (25) and attempts to tie Connors, Federer and Sampras for most US Open men's singles titles in Open Era (5).
- > Avenged 2021 final loss to Medvedev in 2023 final, winning in straight sets. Only lost two sets all event to Djere in 3R, rallying from two sets down for the 8th time in career.
- > In 2021, lost to Medvedev in final 6-4 6-4 6-4, falling short of becoming 1st man to win a singles calendar Grand Slam since Rod Laver in 1969.
- > Owns Open Era record for most US Open men's singles finals (Djokovic 10, Lendl 8, Sampras 8, Connors 7, Federer 7).
- > En route to 2021 final, he posted wins after losing opening set against Nishikori in 3R, [WC] Brooksby in 4R, [6] Berrettini in QF and [4] A. Zverev in SF. Entered 2021 season with 31-36 Grand Slam record after losing 1st set (went 10-1 in 2021 Grand Slam tournaments). It marked 1st time in his career in any tournament he posted 4 wins from a set down.
- > Captured US Open titles in 2011 (d. No. 2 Nadal), 2015 (d. No. 2 Federer), 2018 (d. No. 3 Del Potro) and 2023 (d. No. 3 Medvedev). Saved 2 match points and rallied from 2 sets down vs. Federer in 2011 SF en route to 1st US Open title.
- > Winner of 92 US Open matches – 2nd in Open Era (Connors 98, Djokovic 92, Federer 89, Agassi 79, Lendl 73).
- > Making 80th Grand Slam main draw appearance, only trailing F. Lopez and Federer (both 81) in men's singles history.
- > He is 53-1 vs. players outside Top 30 at US Open (l. to No. 48 Verdasco in 2005 3R), 21-0 after winning 1st set this season and bids to tie Federer for most Grand Slam fourth rounds in history (69).
- > All-time Grand Slam match win leader also aims to pass Federer for most hard court wins in Grand Slam history (191).
- > Bids to be the fifth oldest man to reach US Open 4R in Open Era after Gonzales, 41, in 1969 (also at 40, in 1968); Ulrich, 39, in 1968; Rosewall, 39, in 1974 (also at 38 in 1973) and Connors, 38, in 1991.

Career Highlights

- > Record breaking 7-time Nitto ATP Finals champion owns ATP/WTA record for most weeks at No. 1 (428), as well as PIF ATP Rankings records for most years ended at No. 1 (8) and most wins vs. Top 10 (261), finishing in Top 5 in 16 of last 18 years (2017 – No. 12, 2024 - No. 7).
- > All-time leader for most Grand Slam men's singles titles in history (24), including record 10 Australian Open titles, and is 1 of 3 men to hold all 4 Grand Slam championships at same time (also Budge, Laver).
- > Owns record for most wins vs. Top 10 in PIF ATP Rankings history, posting personal-best 31 Top 10 wins in 2015.
- > Only player to win all nine ATP Masters 1000 events since start of series in 1990, doing so multiple times for a record total 40 titles.

- > Defeated Alcaraz in gold medal match at 2024 Paris Olympics, joining Agassi and Nadal as the only men to win all 4 Grand Slam titles and become Olympic champion in singles.
- > Owns most Grand Slam match wins in history, 3rd-most men's singles titles in Open Era (100), 3rd-most men's singles wins in Open Era (1152).
- > Captured 100th tour-level title at 2025 Geneva, joining Connors (109) and Federer (103) as only men to achieve that feat.
- > Earned 370th match win at Grand Slams by defeating F. Cerundolo in 2024 Roland Garros 4R to set the all-time record for most Grand Slam match wins (now 394).
- > Boasts winning records against both Federer (27-23) and Nadal (31-29), as well as win streaks of ATP Tour-record 43 matches (2010-11), ATP Masters 1000-record 31 matches (2011) and Open Era-record 30 Grand Slam matches (2015-16).

CAMERON NORRIE

US Open Stats

- > British No. 2 is appearing in his 8th US Open main draw and since 2017 only skipped one edition, withdrawing last year due to elbow injury.
- > Defeated Korda 7-5 6-4 ret. in 1R and Comesana 7-6(5) 6-3 6-7(0) 7-6(4) in 2R to advance to his 5th US Open 3R.
- > In 2022, did not lose a set en route to 4R, defeating Paire in 1R, J. Sousa in 2R and No. 28 seed Rune in 3R, before losing to No. 9 seed Rublev in 4R.
- > Rallied from 2 sets down and saved 2 MPs to defeat No. 13 Schwartzman en route to 2020 US Open 3R (l. to Davidovich Fokina) and record 1st of 4 Top 20 wins at Grand Slam level.
- > Earned 1st Grand Slam win of career over Tursunov at 2017 US Open as Q (l. to No. 19 Carreno Busta in 2R).
- > Aiming to equal his best result at US Open (2022 4R) to advance to the fourth round for third consecutive Grand Slam event after Roland Garros (4R) and Wimbledon (QF).
- > He bids to be the first British man to reach 4R of three Grand Slams in one season since Murray in 2017.
- > Plays to avoid losing 7 matches vs. a single opponent for second time in career (6-8 vs. Fritz, 0-6 vs. Djokovic, 0-6 vs. Zverev) and aims to equal personal-best 10 Grand Slam match wins in a single season (9-3 in 2025, 10-4 in 2022).
- > He is 11-41 vs. Top 10, 1-3 in 2025 (d. No. 7 Musetti in Washington 2R), and owns 0-10 record vs. Top 10 at Grand Slam level, earning wins over No. 11 Ruud in 2024 Aus. Open 3R and No. 11 Medvedev in 2025 Roland Garros 1R.

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 10 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 8 in September 2022, joining Henman, Murray and Rusedski as 4th Top-10 British man in history.
- > Advanced to 13 ATP Tour finals from May 2021-February 2023, highlighted by 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title to become 1st British champion in 46-year tournament history.
- > Reached Grand Slam 4R, QF and SF for 1st time at 2022 Wimbledon, falling to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets.
- > Earned 52 wins in 2021 and 49 wins in 2022 before beating No. 2 Nadal at 2023 United Cup and No. 2 Alcaraz in 2023 Rio de Janeiro final for biggest wins of career.
- > Born in South Africa to a Scottish father and Welsh mother, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University, and has represented Great Britain since 2013.
