First Meeting

DAY 3 TALKING POINTS

- First-round play in the bottom half of the draw concludes on Tuesday with 20 men's matches on the schedule.
- Four of the Top 10 seeds lead the way: No. 2 Daniil Medvedev, No. 4 and last year's finalist Casper Ruud,
 No. 6 Holger Rune and No. 9 Taylor Fritz. Former Top 10 players Gael Monfils and Richard Gasquet as well as five other Frenchmen are also in action.
- In the second match on Court Philippe Chatrier, **Medvedev** takes on qualifier **Thiago Seyboth Wild**, who is making his Roland Garros debut after losing in the first round in qualifying the last three years. The 23-year-old Brazilian is playing in his second career Grand Slam tournament (2020 US Open, 1R).
- This season Medvedev is the ATP Tour leader in titles (5), finals (6) and wins (39). He captured his first career clay-court title at ATP Masters 1000 Rome (d. Rune) and it was his personal-best fifth title of the season and 20th in his career (in 20 different events). Last year Medvedev didn't win his 40th match of the season until October.
- In the evening session, **Monfils** makes his 16th Roland Garros appearance as he faces **Sebastian Baez**. Monfils suffered a plantar fascia rupture in his right foot (vs. Draper in 3R) last August in Montreal and was sidelined until March. He retired in the 1R of Miami due to a wrist injury. He is 0-4 this season and ranked No. 394. He has an injury protected ranking of No. 35. Baez is the No. 2 Argentine and one of 10 in this year's main draw.
- On Court Suzanne Lenglen, **Ruud** meets Swedish qualifier **Elias Ymer**. The Norwegian has the most clay wins (81) on the ATP Tour since the beginning of 2020. This season he is 11-5 on clay and he won his 10th career title in Estoril. Ymer is 0-3 vs. Top 10 opponents and 1-8 lifetime in Grand Slam tournaments with 2R here in 2018.
- In the third all-Frenchmen first-round match at Roland Garros, **Gasquet** and **Arthur Rinderknech** square off. Gasquet is making his 20th Roland Garros appearance and closing in on 600 career wins (598). He is the all-time wins leader among Frenchmen in the Open Era. Rinderknech is looking for his first Roland Garros victory (0-3).
- On Court Simonne Mathieu, two-time Roland Garros semi-finalist **Alexander Zverev** takes on **Lloyd Harris**, who missed the last six months last season with a wrist injury. Zverev suffered a season-ending right ankle injury vs. Nadal in last year's semi-final. Since returning in January he is 16-14 this season with SFs in Dubai and Geneva.
- Next on is Rune and American Christopher Eubanks, who is making his Roland Garros debut. One year ago
 Rune came into Paris ranked No. 40 and he reached the quarter-finals in his debut (I. to Ruud). He comes in
 ranked a career-high No. 6 and 13-3 on clay this season with a repeat title in Munich and runner-up efforts at ATP
 Masters 1000 events in Monte Carlo and Rome. Eubanks is looking for his first Top 10 victory (0-2).

THIAGO SEYBOTH WILD

Roland Garros Stats

- > Brazilian is making his Roland Garros debut after successfully navigating through qualifying over Bellier in Q1, Berankis in Q2 and Koepfer in Q3 to join compatriot Monteiro in the main draw.
- > Previously failed to win a Roland Garros match in qualifying three times, losing in Q1 the last three years (2020-22).
- > Playing in 2nd career Grand Slam main draw (I. to Evans in 2020 1R) and facing his 2nd Top 10 opponent (I. to No. 3 Zverev in 2022 Davis Cup tie).

Career Highlights

- > Former Top-10 junior achieved career-high No. 106 in 2020 after reaching 2nd Challenger final of career at Aix-en-Provence.
- > Captured 2020 Santiago title as 19-year-old WC (d. Ruud), becoming 1st ATP Tour champion born in 2000s and youngest Brazilian champion in Open Era.
- > One week before Santiago, saved 3 MPs to beat Davidovich Fokina in 2020 Rio de Janeiro 1R as WC longest ATP Tour match at 3:50 since 2009 Madrid SF (Nadal d. Djokovic in 4:03).
- > Also earned 1st ATP Tour win of career on home clay, defeating E. Ymer in 2019 Sao Paulo 1R as WC.
- > Has a 84-71 career record on ATP Challenger Tour (73-58 on clay with 3 titles).
- > Ended junior career by beating fellow #NextGenATP player Musetti for 2018 US Open boys' singles title.

DANIIL MEDVEDEV

Roland Garros Stats

- > Since beginning with an 0-4 record at Roland Garros from 2017-20, has compiled a 7-2 record, reaching the quarter-finals in 2021 (I. to Tsitsipas) and 4R last year (I. to Cilic).
- > He went 9-0 in sets to reach the 4R last year as the No. 2 seed before losing to No. 23 Cilic in straight sets.
- > In first three appearances, lost to a Frenchman each time: retiring to Bonzi in 2017, I. to Pouille in 2018 and Herbert in 5 sets in 2019.
- > Reached 2014 Roland Garros boys' singles 3R (I. to Luz) and boys' doubles QF partnering Khachanov (I. to Miedler/Santillan).



Career Highlights

- > Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in 2004.
- > Four-time Grand Slam finalist owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.
- > Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).
- > Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.
- > Won 18 of his 20 singles titles on hard courts and all 20 of his titles at different events, including 6 ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami and 2023 Rome, which was his 1st career clay title. He is 1 of of 6 players with 6 or more different ATP Masters 1000 titles (since 1990), joining Djokovic (9), Federer (8), Agassi (7), Murray (7) and Nadal (7).
- > Reached 5 consecutive tour-level finals for 2nd time in his career in 2023 with titles in Rotterdam, Doha and Dubai, final at Indian Wells, which ended a 19-match winning streak, and title in Miami, after a 6-tournament streak in August to October 2019 (Washington F, Montreal F, Cincinnati W, US Open F, St. Petersburg W, Shanghai W).

GAEL MONFILS

Roland Garros Stats

- > Frenchman is making his 16th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, holding a 13-2 record in first round at the tournament, losing to No. 10 Canas in 2005 debut and No. 49 Bublik in 2020.
- > The 36-year-old has reached the Roland Garros fourth round 8 times (2006, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2019), the quarter-finals 4 times (2008, 2009, 2011, 2014) and beat No. 5 Ferrer in 2008 to advance to his only semi-final. > Won the boys' singles event in 2004 as the No. 1 seed beating Kuznetsov in the final.

Career Highlights

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 6 in 2016 and has finished in Top 10 twice in 2016 (at No. 7) and in 2019 (at No. 10) and has overall ranked 8 times in year-end Top 20.
- > Married former WTA No. 3 Elina Svitolina in 2021.
- > Owns 11 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500s at 2016 Washington, 2019 Rotterdam and 2020 Rotterdam.
- > Reached at least 1 final in 18 straight seasons (2005-22), including ATP Masters 1000s at 2009 Paris, 2010 Paris and 2016 Monte Carlo.

- > Earned 525 career victories, highlighted by biggest wins over No. 1 Nadal at 2009 Doha and No. 1 Medvedev at 2022 Indian Wells, as well as career-long win streaks of 12 matches and 25 sets in 2020.
- > Advanced to 2008 Roland Garros and 2016 US Open SFs after winning junior titles at Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon in 2004.

SEBASTIAN BAEZ

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 22-year-old Argentine made his Roland Garros debut last year, defeating Lajovic in 4 sets.
- > Led 2-0 in sets and held a MP in the deciding set before losing to eventual semi-finalist World No. 3 A. Zverev in 2R.
- > Reached 2018 Roland Garros boys' singles final before losing the championship match to Tseng and partnered Seyboth Wild to reach the boys' doubles semi-final the same year.

Career Highlights

- > Achieved career-high No. 30 ranking in April 2023 soon after capturing 2nd ATP Tour title on home soil at 2023 Cordoba after entering tournament with 6 straight losses and 17 losses in previous 18 matches.
- > Beat No. 8 Rublev for biggest win of career to reach 3rd ATP Tour final at 2022 Bastad (I. to F. Cerundolo).
- > Defeated Ramos-Vinolas en route to 1st final at 2022 Santiago and 1st title at 2022 Estoril, as well as for 1st Grand Slam main draw win at 2022 Australian Open.
- > Broke into Top 300, 200 and 100 in 2021, posting 6-3 record in Challenger finals to tie 4 other players for 2nd-most titles in a season behind Griekspoor's 8 in 2021.
- > Became World No. 1 junior in March 2018 and went on to reach Roland Garros boys' singles final and win boys' doubles gold medal at Youth Olympics w/Diaz Acosta in his hometown of Buenos Aires.

ELIAS YMER

Roland Garros Stats

- > Swede is playing in his 3rd Roland Garros main draw, all as a qualifier (2015, 2018, 2023).
- > Defeated No. 104 Sela in 2018 first round for only Roland Garros and Grand Slam main draw win (1-8).
- > Entered qualifying at the event for the 9th consecutive time (2015-23) and owns a 12-6 record in qualifying.
- > Younger brother Mikael lost in first round on Sunday to No. 17 seed Musetti.



Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 200 in 2015, achieved career-high No. 105 in 2018 and ended 5 straight seasons as No. 1 Swede before being passed by little brother Mikael (2014-18).
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF at 2016 Gstaad and 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 Pune as Q.
- > Made history as a teenager in 2015, becoming 2nd man on record to qualify for all 4 Grand Slam events in a calendar year (also Dancevic in 2011).
- > Captured 2016 Stockholm doubles title in team debut w/M. Ymer as 954th-ranked WC (d. Pavic/Venus 6-1 6-1).
- > Achieved career-high No. 5 in junior rankings, highlighted by run to 2012 Orange Bowl final (I. to Djere).
- > Has 158-123 career record on ATP Challenger Tour with 6 titles (105-66 on clay with 3 titles, 53-54 on hard with 3 titles).

CASPER RUUD

Roland Garros Stats

- > Norwegian is making his 6th straight appearance and he's never lost in the opening around (5-0).
- > Entered Roland Garros last year as the World No. 8 before reaching 1st career Grand Slam final (I. to Nadal).
- > Previously reached 3R three times: in 2019 (I. to No. 3 Federer), 2020 (I. to No. 3 Thiem) and 2021 (I. to Davidovich Fokina in the deciding fifth set).

Career Highlights

- > Top-ranked Norwegian in history rose from No. 7 to career-high No. 2 after falling to Alcaraz in 2022 US Open final with No. 1 ranking at stake.
- > Has improved year-end Pepperstone ATP Rankings for 7 consecutive seaons from No. 1,126 in 2016 to No. 3 in 2022.
- > First Norwegian to win an ATP Tour title (10), play at Nitto ATP Finals (2021 SF, 2022 final), and reach both a Grand Slam final (2022 Roland Garros, US Open) and an ATP Masters 1000 final (2022 Miami).
- > Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.
- > Former World No. 1 junior leads ATP Tour since start of 2020 season in clay-court wins (81), finals (11) and titles (9).
- > Defeated No. 4 A. Zverev on a hard court for biggest win of career en route to 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Miami final (I. to Alcaraz).

RICHARD GASQUET

Roland Garros Stats

- > Frenchman is making his 20th Roland Garros appearance and is 14-5 in 1R matches, after going 0-3 in his first three showings (2002-04).
- > His 115 Grand Slam wins is 3rd-most among Frenchmen behind Tsonga (121) and Monfils (118).
- > Reached the Roland Garros fourth round in five attempts (2011-13, 2015-16), defeating No. 6 Nishikori in only Top 10 win at the event (1-12) to reach the quarter-finals in 2016 (I. to No. 2 Murray).
- > At 598 tour-level wins, he could become the first Frenchman to reach the 600 milestone in Open Era. And become fourth active player (behind Nadal-1,068, Djokovic-1,052 and Murray-725).

Career Highlights

- > Former World No. 1 junior reached career-high No. 7 in 2007 and finished 4 years in Top 10 overall (2007, 2012-13, '15).
- > Defeated Top-5 players in 5 sets to reach SFs at 2007 Wimbledon (d. Roddick in QF), 2013 US Open (d. Ferrer in QF) and 2015 Wimbledon (d. Wawrinka in QF).
- > Owns 16 titles, qualified at Nitto ATP Finals in 2007 and 2013, and reached ATP Masters 1000 finals at 2005 Hamburg, 2006 Toronto and 2012 Toronto.
- > Won ATP Tour debut as 15-year-old at 2002 Monte Carlo (d. Squillari), earned biggest career win at 2005 Monte Carlo (d. No. 1 Federer) and posted 500th career win at 2018 Monte Carlo (d. M. Zverev).
- > Remains youngest match winner since start of ATP Tour in 1990 and owns 598 wins overall most among Frenchmen in Open Era (since 1968). Looking to join Nadal, Djokovic and Murray as only active players on ATP Tour with at least 600 wins.

ARTHUR RINDERKNECH

Roland Garros Stats

- > Frenchman is playing in his 4th consecutive Roland Garros and looking for his first win (0-3).
- > Lost in first round to Bedene in 2020, Cilic in 2021 and Bublik last year (1-9 in sets).
- > Reached the 2R at 3 Grand Slam events, 2022 Australian Open and 2021-22 US Open.
- > Made one main draw appearance at boys' event in 2012 and lost to 2013 Roland Garros boys' champion Cristian Garin in 1R.

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 50 in January 2022 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at Adelaide-2 (I. to Kokkinakis), then became No. 1 Frenchman and achieved career-high No. 42 in October 2022.
- > Playing on indoor hard courts in fall 2022, saved 1 MP vs. No. 17 Schwartzman in Tel Aviv 2R, 9 MPs vs. No. 15 Carreno Busta in Gijon QF and 2 MPs vs. No. 16 Cilic in Basel 1R.
- > In 2021, advanced to Kitzbuhel SF, reached 6 other ATP Tour QFs, and earned 1st 18 tour-level wins of career.
- > Captured Challenger titles at 2020 Rennes, 2020 Calgary, 2021 Istanbul as Q and 2022 Poznan.
- > Five-time All-American at Texas A&M University (3 singles, 2 doubles), where he graduated from Mays Business School in 2018.

ALEXANDER ZVEREV

Roland Garros Stats

- > Making 8th straight Roland Garros main draw appearance and reached semi-finals past two years.
- > Last year suffered a season-ending right ankle injury vs. Nadal in second set of semi-final.
- > Reached 2021 SF after rallying from 2 sets down vs. countryman Otte in 1R (I. to Tsitsipas in 5 sets).
- > Also advanced to Roland Garros QFs in 2018 (I. to Thiem) and 2019 (I. to No. 1 Djokovic).
- > Owns 8-1 record in 5th sets at Roland Garros, including 3 consecutive wins in 2018 (d. Lajovic, Dzumhur, Khachanov).
- > Advanced to 2013 Roland Garros boys' singles final (I. to Garin).

Career Highlights

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 on 13 June 2022 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal. Returned in January 2023.
- > Finished in Top 10 for 5 straight years from 2017-2021 with year-end best No. 3 in 2021.

Max Purcell Career Highlights

Francisco Cerundolo Career Highlights

Nicolas Jarry Career Highlights

- > In May 2023 captured 3rd career title in Geneva (d. Dimitrov), beat No. 4 Ruud in QF and afterwards climbed to a career-high No. 35 on 29 May.

- > Posted 30-28 Challenger record in 2022, including 1st title at Parm (d. Kovalik) and wins over former Top-20 players Janowicz and Paire.
- > Went 90-33 on ITF Junior Circuit, including wins over future Top-50 ATP players Draper, Musetti and Nakashima.

Grigor Dimitrov Career Highlights

- > Former World No. 1 junior ended 2017 at career-high No. 3 after becoming 1st debutant to go 5-0 en route to Nitto ATP Finals title (d. Goffin) since McEnroe in 1978.
- > Top-ranked Bulgarian in history and only champion from his country, winning 8 titles including 2017 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati (d. Kyrgios).
- > Surpassed 300 career wins in 2019, highlighted by biggest win over No. 1 Djokovic at 2013 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.
- > Advanced to Grand Slam SFs at 2014 Wimbledon, 2017 Australian Open and 2019 US Open, as well as 8 ATP Masters 1000 SFs.
- > Posted 1st win in 8 meetings with Federer in 2019 US Open QF as World No. 78, becoming 2nd-lowest-ranked US Open men's semi-finalist in history (No. 174 Connors in 1991).
