COURT PATRICE DOMINGUEZ

Pedro Martinez (ESP) vs Adrian Mannarino (FRA)

First Meeting

Pedro Martinez | Age: 28 | World No. 77 | Career-High No. 36 | Career: 84-119 (1 Title) | Montpellier: 1-1 (2024 2R)
 > Broke into Top 50 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Santiago in February and Top 40 in May 2022, before achieving career-high No. 36 in February 2025.
 > Defeated No. 16 Bautista Agut at 2021 Kitzbuhel en route to 1st SF and final and No. 8 Ruud for biggest win of career en route to 2024 Estoril final.
 > Led all players by qualifying for 6 tour-level events in 2020, including Australian Open, Rio de Janeiro, Rome and Roland Garros.
 > Also in 2020, earned 1st tour-level win at Australian Open (d. Koepfer), posted 1st ATP Masters 1000 win at Rome (d. Querrey) and advanced to 1st Grand Slam 3R at Roland Garros.
 > Reached 8 of his 14 career Challenger finals on home clay in Spain, highlighted by 2020 Marbella, 2021 Seville, 2023 Maspalomas, 2024 Girona and 2024 Valencia titles.

NOTE: Martinez seeks first tour-level win since defeating No. 11 Rune in Davis Cup in September and first ATP Tour win indoors since defeating No. 14 Rune to reach Rotterdam QF last February. He began his season by winning his 8th Challenger title in Bangalore, before losing to eventual finalist Djokovic in Australian Open 1R.

Adrian Mannarino | Age: 37 | World No. 70 | Career-High No. 17 | Career: 316-361 (5 Titles) | Montpellier: 5-7 ('22 QF)
 > Ended 13 straight years in Top 75 of PIF ATP Rankings (2013-25) and became the oldest man to break into Top 20 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 35, achieving career-high No. 17 in January 2024.
 > Captured 1st ATP Tour title in 7th final of career at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch, 2nd title in 11th final of career at 2022 Winston-Salem.
 > Posted personal-best 43 wins in 2023, highlighted by ATP Tour titles in Newport, Astana and Sofia.
 > Earned first Top 5 win over No. 5 Cilic to reach biggest final of career at 2017 Tokyo and biggest win of career over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch.
 > Reached Australian Open 4R in 2022 and 2024 and Wimbledon 4R in 2013, 2017 and 2018 and posted win over No. 6 Shelton via RET to reach 2025 US Open 4R, after 0-22 start vs. Top-10 at Grand Slams.

NOTE: Mannarino aims to record first win since defeating Berrettini in ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai 1R last October (0-8 across all levels since). 37-year-old, who is making his 8th main draw appearance in Montpellier, also aims to earn an ATP Tour win in an 18th different season (2008, 2010-25).

[WC] Arthur Gea (FRA) vs Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard (FRA)

First Meeting

Arthur Gea | Age: 21 | World No. 168 (Career-High) | Career: 1-2 (2026 Aus. Open 2R) | Montpellier: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Former Top-10 junior broke into Top 200 at career-high No. 168 in February 2026 after defeating No. 19 Lehecka for biggest win of career to reach Australian Open 2R, losing to former champion Wawrinka in 5 sets.
 > Made ATP Tour debut at 2025 Marseille as Q, losing to countryman Grenier in 1R, and Grand Slam main draw debut at 2026 Australian Open after losing 14 games in 6 sets in qualifying.
 > Advanced to 1st Challenger final at 2026 Noumea, defeating Rodionov for his 1st title at Challenger level.
 > Peaked at No. 8 in juniors in 2023, advancing to 2023 US Open boys' singles semi-final and partnered with Djuric to reach 2023 Wimbledon boys' doubles final.

NOTE: Gea is on a 9-1 run across all levels to start the season, winning his 1st Challenger title in Noumea and coming from qualifying to reach Australian Open 2R (d. No. 19 Lehecka in 1R), lone loss to Wawrinka in fifth set tie-break. Carpentras-native seeks first ATP Tour win on home soil and second Top 100 win of his career.

G. Mpetshi Perricard | Age: 22 | World No. 57 | Career-High No. 29 | Career: 41-44 (2 Titles) | Montpellier: 0-0 (Debut)
> Began 2024 season as No. 205 and broke into Top 100 in May, Top 50 in July and achieved career-high No. 29 in February 2025.

- > Recorded 6-1 start to his career vs. Top 20 opponents, including wins over former champion No. 19 Auger-Aliassime and No. 14 Rune to win 2024 Basel title without dropping serve all tournament (60/60 service games won).
- > Saved a championship point to win 1st ATP Tour title in his hometown of Lyon in 2024 as No. 117-ranked WC.
- > Entered 2024 Wimbledon as LL, defeating No. 21 Korda in 1R for 1st Grand Slam main draw win en route to becoming 1st lucky loser to reach Wimbledon 4R since Norman in 1995.
- > Owns 54-33 Challenger record (5-0 in finals), winning titles at 2023 Leon, 2024 Nottingham, 2024 Cuernavaca, 2024 Acapulco and 2025 Bordeaux.
- > Peaked at No. 4 in junior rankings during 2021 season, after advancing to 2021 Roland Garros boys' singles SF (l. to Fils) and winning the boys' doubles title w/Fils.

NOTE: Mpetshi Perricard owns 12-7 tour-level record indoors (after 12-3 start), highlighted by 2024 Basel title. He began his season by advancing to quarter-finals of Brisbane and Auckland, before losing to Baez in Aus. Open 1R.

Roberto Bautista Agut | Age: 37 | World No. 89 | Career-High No. 9 | Career: 432-291 (12 Titles) | Event: 4-4 ('21 Final)
> Captured 12th ATP Tour title in Antwerp and 400th win of career in 2024 and ended 2019 at career-high No. 9.
> Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2019 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam SF at 2019 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-9 record in Grand Slam 4R matches.
> Defeated No. 1 Djokovic in 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai SF, 2019 Doha SF and 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R, as well as No. 1 Medvedev in 2022 Mallorca QF.
> Went 4-1 at 2022 ATP Cup and 6-0 at 2020 ATP Cup to lead Spain to finals after helping his country win 2019 Davis Cup.
> Played football for Villarreal C.F. until he was 14 years old.

NOTE: Bautista Agut looks for his first win since defeating O'Connell in Winston-Salem 2R last August (0-4 since). He is one of three former finalists in the field, reaching 2021 final (l. to Goffin) and at 37 years and 9 months would become the third oldest match winner in tournament history.

Christopher O'Connell | Age: 31 | World No. 119 | Career-High No. 53 | Career: 60-91 (2 SFs) | Montpellier: 0-0
> Unranked to begin 2019, broke into Top 200 in September 2019 and ended 2022 season at No. 78, before reaching career-high No. 53 in September 2023 after winning 5th Challenger title in Shanghai without losing a set.
> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 San Diego after reaching 1st ATP Tour QF at 2021 Atlanta as Q.
> Defeated No. 13 Schwartzman for biggest win of career and to reach 2022 Australian Open 3R as WC and No. 16 Zverev to advance to 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2023 Munich.
> Played 108 main draw and qualifying singles matches across all tours in 2019, posting 50-11 record on ITF World Tennis Tour with 3 titles in 10 finals.
> Stopped playing tennis in 2018 due to many injuries to clean boats with his brother and get away from tennis, deciding to come back to the sport in 2019.

NOTE: O'Connell bids to be the second Australian to record a main draw win in Montpellier after Millman in 2016 (d. Benneteau, Roger-Vasselin) and 2018 (d. Sugita). He seeks first ATP Tour win since beating No. 67 Dzumhur in ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai 1R in October.
