SWISS OPEN GSTAAD TALKING POINTS

- Shapo Leads Strong Field: This year's Swiss Open Gstaad features four players in the Top 20 of the FedEx ATP Rankings, led by World No. 10 Denis Shapovalov, who is coming off his best Grand Slam result at Wimbledon where he reached the semi-finals (I. to Djokovic). The other seeds receiving a first round bye are: Roberto Bautista Agut, the 2018 finalist, Casper Ruud and Cristian Garin.
- **Former Champ**: The lone former champion in the draw is No. 8 seed **Feliciano Lopez**, who won the 2016 title. The 39-year-old Spaniard also was a finalist in 2006. He owns a 22-11 record in Gstaad.
- Former Finalists: No. 2 seed Roberto Bautista Agut was runner-up in 2018 (I. to Berrettini) and German Yannick Hanfmann was finalist in 2017 (I. to Fognini). Bautista Agut also was a semi-finalist in 2017.
- Home Crew: There are a tournament-high five Swiss players in the main draw, led by Marc-Andrea Huesler, who is appearing in his third Gstaad main draw (1-2). Three wild cards are making their first main draw showing: Johan Nikles, Leandro Riedi and Dominic Stephan Stricker. Sandro Ehrat was a qualifier.
- **#NextGenATP Players:** There are five #NextGenATP players (21-and-under) in the field, including Stricker (18), who is the youngest. Argentine **Juan Manuel Cerundolo (**19) captured his first ATP Tour title in Cordoba in March. The others are **Riedi (**19), **Hugo Gaston (**20) and **Thiago Seyboth Wild (**21).

First Meeting

Johan Nikles | Age: 24 | World No. 409 | Career-High No. 409 | 2021: 0-0 | Gstaad: 0-1 (2016 1R)

- > Appearing in his second career ATP Tour main draw and has played almost entirely on ITF Futures circuit with a 148-118 overall record and 4 clay titles.
- > Qualified into first Challenger in Amersfoort last week and reached 2R (I. to Rosol).
- > Has a 23-13 record in ITF Futures this season with title in Madrid (M15) in May and runner-up in Genova (M15) in June. Also SF in 2 other events and QF in 3 others.

NOTE: Made his ATP Tour debut in 2016 Gstaad as a wild card and lost to Youzhny in the first round.

Vit Kopriva | Age: 24 | World No. 249 | Career-High No. 249 | 2021: 15-11 (ATP Challenger Tour) | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut) > Making his ATP Tour main draw debut. Has a 35-33 career record on ATP Challenger Tour (26-24 on clay) and 166-100 on ITF circuit with 5 clay titles.

> This season has compiled a 15-12 Challenger record (12-9 on clay) with SF at St. Petersburg-1, Rome-1 and Braunschweig. Also QF in two other tournaments.

NOTE: Prior to qualifying in Gstaad, Kopriva attempted to qualify in one other ATP Tour event this season, in Belgrade-2, where he lost in the final round to Carballes-Baena.

Jozef Kovalik | Age: 28 | World No. 130 | Career-High No. 80 | 2021: 3-3 (Cordoba QF) | Gstaad: 0-1 (2016 1R)

- > Broke into Top 100 and achieved career-high No. 80 during 2018 season.
- > Qualified en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2018 Sofia and 2nd SF at 2018 Hamburg SF.
- > Earned biggest win of career over No. 6 Cilic in 2017 Chennai 2R as Q.
- > Qualified at 2016 Australian Open, 2017 Roland Garros and 2018 Roland Garros, but owns 0-9 Grand Slam main draw record.
- > Owns 5 Challenger titles overall, ending 2019 on 18-3 run with titles at Szczecin and Maia.
- > Has an 11-8 record on ATP Challenger Tour this season with SF in Istanbul and Belgrade along with two QFs.

NOTE: His best ATP Tour result this season is QF in Cordoba in March (I. to Bagnis).

Benoit Paire | Age: 32 | World No. 49 | Career-High No. 18 | 2021: 4-18 (Cordoba, Hamburg QF) | Gstaad: 1-1 (2012 2R)

- > Rose 99 spots during season to end 2015 at No. 19, then reached career-high No. 18 in January 2016.
- > Won 1st ATP Tour singles title (Bastad), 3 Challenger titles and 1 Futures title in 2015 to become 1st player to sweep titles at all 3 levels since Darcis in 2007.
- > Earned personal-best 34 wins in 2019, adding 2 more ATP Tour titles at Marrakech and Lyon.
- > Saved 2 MPs to beat Nishikori en route to 2015 US Open 4R, also reaching 4R at 2017 Wimbledon, 2019 Roland Garros and 2019 Wimbledon.
- > Defeated No. 3 Wawrinka for biggest win of career at 2017 Madrid, lobbst to Wawrinka in biggest of 9 career finals at 2015 Tokyo and teamed w/Wawrinka for lone doubles title at 2013 Chennai.

NOTE: Paire won back-to-back matches for the first time this season last week in Hamburg where he lost to Delbonis in QFs after holding 4 MPs. In March, he advanced to QF in Cordoba (1R bye, d. Jarry in 2R, I. to Coria).

Marc-Andrea Huesler (SUI) vs [8] Feliciano Lopez (ESP) 20 Kitzbuhel (Austria) Clay QF Marc-Andrea Huesler 6-4 6-3

Marc-Andrea Huesler | Age: 25 | World No. 162 | Career-High No. 142 | 2021: 0-1 (Cagliari 1R) | Gstaad: 1-2 (2018 2R)

- > Zurich native reached a career-high No. 142 on 25 January 2021 following QF at Istanbul Challenger.
- > Has a 6-7 career ATP Tour record and best result came in Kitzbuhel last year when he qualified and reached SFs (d. Fognini, Lopez, I. to Kecmanovic).
- > In only previous ATP Tour match this season, qualified and lost in 1R in Cagliari (I. to Broady).
- > Has a 6-10 record on ATP Challenger Tour with best result QF in Istanbul. Overall 41-38 in Challengers with 3 titles (2 coming on clay).

NOTE: Made ATP Tour debut in 2018 Gstaad and reached 2R (d. Almagro, I. to Bagnis).

Feliciano Lopez | Age: 39 | World No. 89 | Career-High No. 12 | 2021: 8-14 (Mallorca QF) | Gstaad: 22-11 (2016 Title) > Ended 19 straight years in Top 100 (2002-20) – 2nd-longest active streak behind fellow 39-year-old Federer's 22 (1999-2020).

- > Captured singles and doubles titles at 2019 London/Queen's Club as 37-year-old, becoming oldest player to sweep both titles at same event since Rosewall, 40, at 1975 Jackson.
- > Played in record 77th consecutive Grand Slam men's singles main draw at 2021 Wimbledon and is a 3-time Wimbledon quarter-finalist (2005, 2008, 2011).
- > Defeated No. 1 seeds and previous 3 champions to win 2016 Roland Garros doubles title w/M. Lopez
- > Counts victories over No. 1 Nadal (2010 London/Queen's Club) and No. 1 Djokovic (2016 Dubai) among his 38 Top-10 wins most among active players never ranked in Top 10.

NOTE: Lopez won his lone ATP Tour clay court singles title in 2016 Gstaad (d. Haase) and was runner-up in 2006 (l. to Gasquet).
