Felix Auger-Aliassime | Age: 25 | ATP World No. 5 (Career-High) | 2025: 50-24 (3 Titles) | Career: 266-171 (8 Titles)

> Finished 2025 season at career-high No. 5 after winning titles in Adelaide, Montpellier and Brussels and advancing to US Open SF, Nitto ATP Finals SF and ATP Masters 1000 Paris final during the season.

> Earned personal-best 60 wins during breakout 2022 season, including career-long 16-match win streak with 3 titles in as many weeks at Florence, Antwerp and Basel.

> Also in 2022, won Rotterdam title to snap 0-8 start to career in singles finals, swept team titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup and recorded victories over No. 1 Alcaraz and former No. 1s Djokovic, Murray and Nadal.

> At 2021 US Open, became 1st Canadian men's singles semi-finalist in tournament history (since 1881) and reached 2024 Madrid final to become 1st Canadian ATP Masters 1000 finalist on clay in series history (since 1990).

> As an 18-year-old in 2019, became youngest Top-25 player since Hewitt, 18, in 1999, youngest ATP 500 finalist in series history at Rio de Janeiro (since 2009), and youngest semi-finalist in Miami tournament history (since 1985).

NOTE: Auger-Aliassime opened the season with 6-4 6-4 over Zhang and is now on a 25-2 run vs. players ranked outside Top-2 since August (25-7 overall). Canada will win the group and advance to their 1st United Cup QF with one match win vs. Belgium. He earned 41 wins on hard-courts last year, second-most on ATP Tour (de Minaur - 43).

Zizou Bergs | Age: 26 | World No. 42 | Career-High No. 39 | 2025: 31-27 (2 Finals) | Career: 54-65 (2 Finals)

> Former World No. 12 junior broke into Top 200 in July 2021, Top 100 in June 2024 and achieved career-high No. 39 in October 2025 after reaching 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF in Shanghai.

> Advanced to 2024 Roland Garros 3R as Q, 2025 US Open 3R, and upset No. 9 Rublev for biggest win of career to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 3R at 2025 Miami.

> Defeated Ramos-Vinolas for 1st ATP Tour win at 2020 Antwerp as 528th-ranked WC and advanced to ATP Tour finals at 2025 Auckland and 2025 's-Hertogenbosch.

> Earned 2022 Wimbledon WC after defeating former World No. 8 Sock for 2022 Ilkley Challenger title as Q.

> Also won Challenger titles at 2021 St. Petersburg-1 as Q, 2021 Lille as Q, 2021 Almaty, 2023 & 2024 Tallahassee, 2023 Drummondville and 2023 Yokkaichi.

NOTE: Bergs is 1-10 vs. Top 10 (d. No. 9 Rublev at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Miami), aiming to record the biggest win of his career. He bids to be the first Belgian man to record a win at United Cup in his fourth attempt after losing to Kuzmanov and Sakellaridis in 2023 RR and to Zhang on Saturday.



Victoria Mboko (CAN) vs Elise Mertens (BEL)

Victoria Mboko | Age: 19 | WTA World No. 18 | Career-High No. 18 (Nov 2025) | 2025: 20-10 (2 titles) | Career: 21-11 (2 titles)

- > Competing in her first year on Tour in 2025, she lifted her first title at WTA 1000 Montreal – a fairytale run on home soil as an 18-year-old wildcard, registering her first career Top 10 win over No.2 Gauff along the way
- > Went on to claim a second title in 2025 at WTA 250 Hong Kong
- > Started the 2025 season ranked outside Top 300 and ended the season at a career-high ranking of No.18
- > Won her first WTA main draw match in 2025 as a wild card at Miami (d. Osorio)
- > Best career Tour-level doubles result is QF run at Tokyo 2025 (w/Andreeescu)
- > Voted 2025 WTA Newcomer of the Year

NOTE: Mboko is aiming for her seventh consecutive match win on Tour after ending the 2025 season by winning the title at Hong Kong. A win today would be her third career Top 20 win after defeating No. 2 Coco Gauff and No. 12 Elena Rybakina on the way to claiming the Montreal title last year.

Elise Mertens | Age: 30 | WTA World No. 19 | Career-High No. 12 (Nov 2018) | 2025: 36-20 (2 titles) | Career: 292-188 (10 titles)

- > Won two titles in 2025 at Singapore and 's-Hertogenbosch to mark ninth and tenth career singles WTA titles; also reached the final at Hobart for second consecutive year
- > Finished the 2025 season ranked inside the singles Top 20 for a fourth year after 2018, 2019 and 2020
- > Career best Grand Slam result is semifinal at 2018 Australian Open (l. eventual champion Wozniacki)
- > The former doubles World No.1 (May 2021) ended the 2025 season with a doubles ranking of No.5
- > Lifted a fifth Grand Slam doubles trophy in 2025 at Wimbledon with Veronika Kudermetova; the pair then went on to win the year-end WTA Finals title for a second time together after 2022
- > Owns 23 doubles titles including five Grand Slams and two WTA Finals

NOTE: Has a 7-3 career match record at Tour level against players from Canada with her most recent victory over Leylah Fernandez at Dubai last year.

Maya Joint | Age: 19 | WTA World No. 32 | Career-High No. 32 (Oct 2025) | 2025: 32-20 (2 titles) | Career: 33-22 (2 titles)

- > Won first two WTA Tour titles in 2025, at Rabat on clay (d. Cristian in final) and at Eastbourne on grass (d. Eala in final); also reached two additional semifinals at Hobart and Hong Kong
- > In 2025 broke into the Top 100 in March, followed by the Top 50 in June and finished season at career high ranking of No.32
- > Registered first Top 20 career win in 2025 at Merida (as a qualifier, d. No.20 Vekic) and now owns three Top 20 wins (d. No.12 Tauson at Seoul; d. No.17 Shnaider at Beijing)
- > Claimed first Tour doubles title at Rabat 2025 (w/Kalashnikova)
- > Made Tour-level main draw debut as a qualifier at US Open 2024 (d. Siegemund for first career main draw win before falling to No.14 seed Keys); also played at Merida 2024 (lost in opening round); finished the 2024 season ranked No.119

NOTE: Australia's top ranked WTA player is featuring at United Cup for the first time. Looking for her second career win over a player from Czech Republic after defeating Linda Fruhvirtova at Wuhan last season.

Barbora Krejcikova | Age: 30 | WTA World No. 63 | Career-High No. 2 (Feb 2022) | 2025: 16-9 (3 QFs) | Career: 154-92 (8 titles)

- > Owns 8 career singles trophies including two Grand Slam titles at Wimbledon 2024 and Roland Garros 2021
- > Missed first 5 months of 2025 due to back injury and made season debut at Strasbourg in May; in singles, posted three QF finishes at Eastbourne, US Open and Seoul. In doubles, won 20th career Tour title at Seoul (w/Siniakova)
- > Finished 2024 at No.10 in the year-end rankings for a 2nd consecutive and qualified for the WTA Finals where she advanced to the semifinals (l. Zheng); reached a career-high ranking of No.2 in February 2022
- > She has completed the Career Golden Slam in doubles after winning 2018 Roland Garros, 2018 Wimbledon, 2021 Tokyo Olympics, 2022 Australian Open and 2022 US Open (all w/Siniakova)
- > Owns 20 WTA doubles titles including seven Grand Slam trophies as well as 3 mixed doubles Grand Slam titles (all at Australian Open - 2019, 2020 and 2021); also won the 2021 WTA Finals with Siniakova
- > Rose to WTA Doubles World No.1 for the first time on October 22, 2018

NOTE: Making United Cup debut this year. Of 16 main draw match wins in 2025, 11 came on hardcourts, highlighted by quarterfinal run at US Open. Has not been beaten by a player from Australia since 2022 when she was defeated by Ajla Tomljanovic at Wimbledon; her two other career losses were to World No. 1 Ashleigh Barty in 2021 at Cincinnati and Wimbledon (career record of 4-3 against Australian players).

Alex de Minaur | Age: 26 | ATP World No. 6 (Career-High) | 2025: 56-24 (Washington Title) | Career: 305-180 (10 Titles)

- > Two-time Next Gen ATP Finals runner-up achieved career-high No. 6 in July 2024 before becoming 1st Australian to qualify for Nitto ATP Finals in singles since Hewitt in 2004.
- > Earned personal-best 56 wins in 2025 and captured 10 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500 championships at 2023 and 2024 Acapulco and 2025 Washington, where he saved 3 championship points vs. Davidovich Fokina.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2020 US Open immediately after winning 1st ATP Tour doubles title at 2020 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati w/Carreno Busta in team debut and at same venue.
- > Six-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist, including at four consecutive events from 2024 Roland Garros to 2025 Australian Open and advanced to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF, SF and final at 2023 Toronto.
- > Playing for Australia, he went 6-1 in Davis Cup play during the 2022 season, leading Australia to its 1st final since 2003 and defeated No. 2 Nadal in 2023 and No. 1 Djokovic in 2024 at United Cup.
- > Son to a Uruguayan father and Spanish mother, splits time between Australia and Spain, and speaks English, Spanish and French.

NOTE: de Minaur is 6-3 at United Cup in singles, including wins over No. 1 Djokovic in 2024 and No. 2 Nadal in 2023. Australian No. 1 led the ATP Tour in hard-court wins last season (43) and aims to record an ATP Tour win for 10th consecutive year (since 2017) after losing to No. 12 Ruud in his opening match of the season.

Jakub Mensik | Age: 20 | ATP World No. 18 | Career-High No. 16 | 2025: 33-20 (Miami Title) | Career: 62-41 (1 Title)
> Former World No. 2 junior broke into Top 100 in February 2025 and earned career-high No. 16 in August 2025 soon after becoming fourth man in series history to win 1st ATP Tour title at Masters 1000 event in Miami.
> Also in Miami, defeated No. 4 Fritz and 6-time champion No. 5 Djokovic to join Alcaraz as only teenagers to earn multiple Top 5 wins in one event this century and became 1st Czech ATP Masters 1000 champion since 2005.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour QF, SF and final at 2024 Doha by defeating former champions Murray, No. 5 Rublev and Monfils, becoming 1st man born in 2005 or later to play in an ATP Tour final.
> In tour-level debut, reached 3R at 2023 US Open as Q, becoming youngest man to reach Grand Slam 3R since Nadal at 2004 Aus. Open and youngest at US Open since Santoro in 1990, losing to Fritz on 18th birthday.
> Also advanced to Grand Slam 3R at 2024 US Open, losing to Borges after holding 3 MPs, 2025 Australian Open, losing to Davidovich Fokina after squandering 2 MPs and 2025 Wimbledon.
> Posted 85-28 record on ITF Juniors circuit, highlighted by reaching 2022 Australian Open boys' singles final.

NOTE: Mensik is 8-8 vs. Top 10 in career and seeks first Top 10 win since defeating No. 7 Draper, No. 4 Fritz and No. 5 Djokovic en route to ATP Masters 1000 Miami title in March. Youngest man inside Top 20 of PIF ATP Rankings defeated No. 12 Ruud on Monday to begin his 2026 season.

> Broke into Top 200 in January 2022 and Top 100 in October 2023, achieving career-high No. 17 in July 2025 after defeating former finalist Cilic to reach 1st Grand Slam QF at Wimbledon.
> Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Baez to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Bucharest and former champion Rublev to capture biggest title of his career at 2025 Hamburg.
> Earned wins over Shelton as No. 15 en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2024 Geneva and as No. 14 to reach 1st final at 2024 Washington and beat No. 9 Rune via RET for 1st Top 10 win at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.
> Saved 3 MPs vs. Giron to win ATP Tour main draw debut 3-6 7-6 7-6 at 2021 Parma as 429th-ranked WC.
> Defeated former-World No. 3 Wawrinka at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai, 21 years after his father and coach, Stefano, defeated the Swiss at Brindisi Challenger in 2003.
> Peaked at No. 8 in juniors and ended junior career by winning 2020 Roland Garros boys' doubles title w/Stricker.

NOTE: Cobolli is on a 4-match winning streak after ending 2025 season by leading Italy to their third consecutive Davis Cup title (3-0) and defeating Wawrinka in Perth on Sunday. He went 2-8 vs. Top 30 on hard courts last season, earning wins over No. 14 Humbert at United Cup vs. France and No. 14 Rublev in Beijing 1R.

Arthur Rinderknech | Age: 30 | ATP World No. 27 (Career-High) | 2025: 27-29 (Shanghai F) | Career: 101-111 (2 Finals)
> Broke into Top 50 in January 2022 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at Adelaide-2 and achieved career-high No. 27 in October 2025 after advancing to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final in Shanghai, losing to his cousin Vacherot in the final.
> Earned 1st Top 10 win in 15th attempt over No. 10 Shelton in 2025 Queen's Club 1R as LL before biggest wins of career over No. 3 Zverev in 2025 Wimbledon 1R and en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at 2025 Shanghai.
> Playing on indoor hard courts in fall 2022, saved 1 MP vs. No. 17 Schwartzman in Tel Aviv 2R, 9 MPs vs. No. 15 Carreno Busta in Gijon QF and 2 MPs vs. No. 16 Cilic in Basel 1R.
> Captured Challenger titles at 2020 Rennes, 2020 Calgary, 2021 Istanbul, 2022 Poznan, 2023 Zug and 2024 Lille.
> Five-time All-American at Texas A&M University (3 singles, 2 doubles), where he graduated from Mays Business School in 2018.

NOTE: Rinderknech is 9-5 vs. Top 30 players since June after going 3-19 against them since the start of 2023 season to June last year. He owns 1-2 singles record at United Cup, losing to Wawrinka in his opening match this year, earning lone win over No. 30 F. Cerundolo in 2023 RR.
