ROLEX SHANGHAI MASTERS TALKING POINTS

- Four-time champion **Novak Djokovic** returns to **Rolex Shanghai Masters** for the first time since 2019. The 37-year-old Serb owns the most wins (34) and titles (4) in tournament history and will attempt to become the third man in Open Era to capture 100 tour-level titles and break the tie with **Roger Federer** for most titles on hard courts in history (71). Djokovic reached at least the quarter-final stage in all 9 previous appearances.
- Joining **Djokovic** is another former champion **Daniil Medvedev**, who lifted the title in 2019. The World No. 5 won 20 career titles in 20 different locations and will look to break the streak and win the same title twice for the first time in career. Last year's champion **Hubert Hurkacz** withdrew from Shanghai due to knee injury.
- World No. 1 **Jannik Sinner** and **Carlos Alcaraz** will battle in Beijing final on Wednesday but the pair is also on track to meet in Shanghai SF next week as well. **Sinner** leads the ATP Tour in wins (59) and titles (6) this season and could become the first player to win 3 ATP Masters 1000 titles in one season since **Rafael Nadal** in 2018 and join **Novak Djokovic** in 2015 as the only World No. 1s to win Shanghai title in event history.
- **Alcaraz** made his Shanghai debut last year, reaching the fourth round before losing to **Grigor Dimitrov**. The 21-year-old, who is a 5-time ATP Masters 1000 champion, could become the youngest Shanghai champion and first Spaniard to win the title. The 21-year-old is 47-9 this season, highlighted by ATP Masters 1000 title in Indian Wells and Grand Slam titles at Roland Garros and Wimbledon.
- Shanghai-native Chinese No. 1 **Zhang Zhizhen** leads five home players in the main draw. Zhang became the first Chinese player to reach Shanghai 4R last year before losing to eventual champion Hurkacz. Only Chinese ATP Tour champions **Shang Juncheng** and **Wu Yibing** are scheduled on Day 1, as Shang looks for first win in Shanghai, while Wu aims to capture first ATP Tour win of the season.
- **Buyunchaokete** entered the draw as a special exempt after his run to Beijing SF last week, where he earned first Top 20 win over No. 18 **Lorenzo Musetti** in 2R and No. 6 **Andrey Rublev** in QF. The 22-year-old Bu faces **Alex Michelsen** in 1R for a chance to meet No. 4 seed **Novak Djokovic** in the second round.

First Meeting

Wu Yibing | Age: 24 | World No. 564 | Career-High No. 54 | 2024: 0-2 | Shanghai: 1-2 (2018 2R)

- > Rose from No. 1,869 in March 2022 to No. 54 in May 2023 after missing March 2019-January 2022 due to injuries.
- > Saved 4 championship points vs. Isner at 2023 Dallas following SF win over No. 8 Fritz, becoming 1st Chinese man to win an ATP Tour title, reach an ATP Tour final and earn a Top-10 win.
- > Qualified at 2022 US Open and became 1st Chinese man to reach US Open 3R in tournament history (since 1881), falling to World No. 1 and defending champion Medvedev.
- > Posted 40-7 record in main draw and qualifying matches across all levels in 2022, winning 3 ATP Challenger Tour titles and an ITF World Tennis Tour title in Orange Park, FL, USA.
- > Swept 2017 US Open boys' singles title and boys' doubles title w/Hsu to become World No. 1 junior, then won Shanghai Challenger title a week later as 496th-ranked WC.

NOTE: Wu looks for his first tour-level win since defeating Lajovic in 2023 US Open 1R last year. He is playing in Shanghai for the first time since 2018, when he defeated compatriot Li in 1R, then lost to No. 12 Nishikori in 2R in three sets as No. 415-ranked WC. He bids to become the lowest-ranked match winner in tournament history.

Sumit Nagal | Age: 27 | World No. 83 | Career-High No. 68 | 2024: 5-13 (5 times in 2R) | Shanghai: 0-0 (2023 Q1)

- > Earned 1st ranking point at age 16 in 2013, broke into Top 200 in 2019 and Top 100 in February 2024 by winning 5th Challenger title in Chennai, achieving career-high No. 68 in July 2024.
- > Made ATP Tour debut on home soil at 2018 Pune as Q and Grand Slam debut at 2019 US Open as Q (l. to 5-time champion Federer in 1R), then reached 1st ATP Tour QF at 2021 Buenos Aires.
- > Defeated Arnaldi in 2024 Monte-Carlo 1R as Q to become the first Indian to earn an ATP Masters 1000 win on clay.
- > Owns 129-106 Challenger record (6-4 in finals), picking up titles at 2017 Bangalore, 2019 Buenos Aires, 2023 Rome, 2023 Tampere, 2024 Chennai and 2024 Heilbronn.
- > Peaked at No. 23 in juniors in 2015 and went 88-53 in juniors with wins over future Top 10 players Berrettini, Hurkacz, Shapovalov and Tiafoe, ending junior career by winning 2015 Wimbledon boys' doubles title w/Ly.

NOTE: Nagal looks for 2nd ATP Masters 1000 match win of career after defeating Arnaldi in Monte-Carlo 1R this April and become the first Indian man to record a main draw win at the event and first player representing India to win an ATP Masters 1000 match on hard courts since Gunneswaran reached 2019 Indian Wells 3R.

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 6 in 2016 and married former WTA No. 3 Elina Svitolina in 2021.
- > Owns 12 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500s at 2016 Washington, 2019 Rotterdam and 2020 Rotterdam.
- > Reached at least 1 final in 19 straight seasons (2005-23), including ATP Masters 1000s at 2009 Paris, 2010 Paris and 2016 Monte Carlo.
- > Earned 561 career victories, highlighted by biggest wins over No. 1 Nadal at 2009 Doha and No. 1 Medvedev at 2022 Indian Wells, as well as career-long win streaks of 12 matches and 25 sets in 2020.
- > Advanced to 2008 Roland Garros and 2016 US Open SFs after winning junior titles at Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon in 2004.

Damir Dzumhur | Age: 32 | World No. 94 | Career-High No. 23 | 2024: 2-2 (Davis Cup) | Shanghai: 0-2 (2017-18 1R)

- > Broke into Top 100 in 2015 and Top 50 in 2017 before winning 3rd ATP Tour title at 2018 Antalya to achieve career-high No. 23.
- > Captured St. Petersburg and Moscow titles in 2017 on hard courts then won 2018 Antalya title on grass.
- > Earned personal-best 36 victories in 2017, highlighted by biggest wins of career over No. 3 Wawrinka at Dubai and

No. 4 A. Zverev at Shenzhen.

> Advanced to Grand Slam 3R on 5 occasions, including at 2018 Roland Garros, where he led No. 3 A. Zverev by 2 sets to 1 and held 1 MP before losing.

> Reached ATP Masters 1000 R16 on 3 occasions, including at 2016 Miami, where he defeated No. 5 Nadal in 2R.

NOTE: Dzumhur looks for first tour-level win outside Davis Cup since reaching 2023 Banja Luka QF in April last year (d. No. 42 Gasquet in 1R for last Top 50 win) and 1st ATP Masters 1000 win since 2021 Miami (d. Anderson in 1R).

Shang Juncheng (CHN) vs [WC] Coleman Wong (HKG)

Shang Juncheng | Age: 19 | World No. 52 (Career-High) | 2024: 24-14 (Chengdu Title) | Shanghai: 0-1 (2023 1R)

> Became the first Chinese teenager to break inside Top 100 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973) in May 2024 and achieved career-high No. 52 in September 2024 after winning 1st ATP Tour title in Chengdu.

> Earned biggest wins over career over No. 16 Tiafoe to reach 1st ATP Tour SF in Hong Kong and No. 14 Shelton en route to 2nd SF at 2024 Atlanta.

> Reached 1st Grand Slam 3R at 2024 Aus. Open and became the 1st Chinese man in 3R of that event in Open Era.

> Made ATP Tour debut at 2022 Rio de Janeiro as a WC, before earning 1st tour-level win at 2023 Australian Open, beating Otte in 1R as Q (l. to Tiafoe in 2R).

> Owns 37-27 record on ATP Challenger Tour, highlighted by 1st title at 2022 Lexington.

> Father, Yi, was a professional football player and his mother, Na, was a world champion table tennis player.

> His nickname is Jerry after the cartoon character of his favorite childhood show.

NOTE: Shang is 12-4 in his opening rounds this season (9-2 on hard courts), despite Beijing 1R loss to Buyunchaokete last week. The 19-year-old became the first Chinese man to win an ATP Tour title on home soil two weeks ago in Chengdu and aims to join Wu Yibing in 2018 as only Chinese teenagers to win a match in Shanghai.

> Former World No. 11 junior broke into Top 500 in September 2023, Top 200 in April 2024, then achieved career-high No. 134 in September 2024 after earning 1st ATP Tour win in Hangzhou.

> Made tour-level debut in Davis Cup as a 15-year-old (l. to Jung), then made ATP Tour debut as WC at 2024 Hong Kong, losing to Musetti in 1R.

> Owns 23-20 Challenger record (0-4 in finals), reaching finals at 2023 Shenzhen (Luohu), 2023 Playford, 2024 New Delhi and 2024 Lincoln and 51-41 record on ITF Tour, winning 2 titles at 2023 M15 Monastir and M25 Hong Kong.

> Became Hong Kong's second ever junior Grand Slam winner in any discipline (Patricia Hy - 1983 Wimbledon girls' doubles), winning boys' doubles titles at 2021 US Open and 2022 Australian Open.

NOTE: Wong is playing in his second ATP Masters 1000 event after Miami earlier this year (l. to Djere in 1R) and aims to become the first player representing Hong Kong to win an ATP Masters 1000 match in series history.

> Captured 1st of 12 ATP Tour titles at 2008 Delray Beach as 18-year-old Q ranked 244th and remains youngest champion on tour since Hewitt, 16, at 1998 Adelaide.

> Six-time ATP 500 champion, four-time ATP Masters 1000 finalist, four-time Nitto ATP Finals qualifier and 2016 Rio Olympics bronze medalist.

> Owns highest winning percentage among active players in deciding sets (150-58, .721).

NOTE: Nishikori is making his 7th Shanghai main draw appearance, first since reaching 2018 quarter-finals (l. to No. 2 Federer). In last ATP Masters 1000 event played in Montreal this August, he became the second lowest-ranked quarter-finalist as then-World No. 576 in series history.

Mariano Navone | Age: 23 | World No. 40 | Career-High No. 29 | 2024: 17-19 (2 Final) | Shanghai: 0-0 (Debut)

> Broke into Top 200 in June 2023, Top 100 in February 2024 and Top 50 in April 2024, achieving career-high No. 29 in June 2024 after capturing 6th Challenger title of career in Cagliari.

> As No. 31 seed at 2024 Roland Garros, became the first man in Open Era to be seeded in his Grand Slam main draw debut and defeated Carreno Busta in 1R.

> Came through qualifying at 2024 Rio de Janeiro, earning 1st ATP Tour win, then advanced to first QF, SF and final and defeated No. 21 F. Cerundolo for biggest win of career en route to 2nd ATP Tour final in Bucharest.

> Made his ATP Tour debut at 2024 Cordoba as a WC, then qualified for Buenos Aires and Rio de Janeiro in following two weeks, defeating Coria in Rio de Janeiro for 1st ATP Tour win.

> Posted 40-18 Challenger record in 2023, ending the season on a 19-2 run and led all players with 5 Challenger titles, winning in Poznan, Santa Fe, Santa Cruz, Buenos Aires and Santa Fe 2.

> Began playing at age 3 as his parents and sister all played tennis and is nicknamed La Navoneta.

NOTE: Navone aims to record his first ATP Masters 1000 win on hard courts, earning only previous win at this level over No. 46 Popyrin in Madrid 1R on clay earlier this year. He earned 15 of 17 tour-level wins this season on clay.
