First Meeting

DAY 2 TALKING POINTS

- World No. 1 Carlos Alcaraz, two-time Roland Garros champion Novak Djokovic, young Top 10 stars Jannik Sinner (21) and Felix Auger-Aliassime (22) along with #NextGenATP Frenchman Arthur Fils (18) are among the players scheduled to compete in the 24-men's matches on Monday.
- In the second match on Court Philippe Chatrier, Djokovic takes on American Aleksandar Kovacevic, who
 idolized the Serbian superstar as a youngster and met him at the 2005 US Open. The 24-year-old New York
 native is making his Grand Slam tournament main draw debut.
- Djokovic is making his 19th consecutive Roland Garros appearance and he's never lost in the first round (18-0). He has advanced to the quarter-finals or better every year since 2010 (16 of 18 years overall). The 2016 and 2021 champion has 85 Roland Garros wins, second only to Rafael Nadal's 112.
- In the evening session, **Sinner** meets Frenchman **Alexandre Muller** who is looking for his first Roland Garros win (0-2). Sinner is 10-3 at Roland Garros, reaching the quarter-finals in his 2020 debut. The 21-year-old Italian has already reached the QFs in each of the four Grand Slam tournaments in his young career.
- On Court Suzanne Lenglen, local wild card Benoit Paire makes his 14th straight Roland Garros appearance as
 he faces British No. 1 Cameron Norrie. Paire is looking for his first Top 20 win at Roland Garros (0-6). Norrie is
 16-6 on clay this season with a win over Alcaraz in the Rio de Janeiro final in February.
- Alcaraz plays qualifier Flavio Cobolli, who is making his Grand Slam main draw debut. This season Alcaraz has
 compiled a 30-3 record with four titles (Buenos Aires, ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells, Barcelona, ATP Masters
 1000 Madrid). Last year Alcaraz came into Roland Garros ranked No. 6 and he reached the QFs (I. to Zverev).
- On Court Simonne Mathieu, **Felix Auger-Aliassime** squares off with **Fabio Fognini**, who is looking for his first Top 10 win at Roland Garros (0-5). Last year the top Canadian lost to Nadal in the 4R in 5 sets, his best result.
- In another Grand Slam debut appearance, 18-year-old French sensation **Fils** plays **Alejandro Davidovich Fokina**, who was a 2021 quarter-finalist. On Saturday, Fils became the youngest Frenchman to win an ATP Tour title in Lyon since Gael Monfis at 2005 Sopot. Fils was ranked No. 408 at this time last year and now he is No. 63.
- For the first time in Roland Garros history, three Chinese men are in the main draw. On Court 5, **Zhang Zhizhen** (vs. Lajovic) and [Q] **Shang Juncheng** (vs. Varillas) are in action. On Court 12, **Wu Yibing** plays [19] **Roberto Bautista Agut.** The trio also played in the Australian Open in January.

NOVAK DJOKOVIC

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 36-year-old Serbian is not the top-seeded player in a Roland Garros draw for the time since 2018.
- > Making his 19th straight appearance and his 85 wins is the 2nd-most at Roland Garros, only behind Nadal (112).
- > Has advanced to guarter-finals or better every year since 2010 and overall 16 of 18 years (except 2005-2R, 2009-3R).
- > Has an 18-0 record in 1R matches and has not lost a set in opener since 2010 when Evgeny Korolev fell in 4 sets.
- > Captured titles in 2016 (d. Murray) and 2021 (d. Tsitsipas) and reached finals in 2012, 2014-15 (l. to Wawrinka) and 2020. His other three runner-up finishes came against Nadal.

Career Highlights

- > Record-tying 6-time Nitto ATP Finals champion owns ATP/WTA record for most weeks at No. 1 (387), as well as Pepperstone ATP Rankings records for most years ended at No. 1 (7). Has finished in Top 3 for 10 consecutive years from 2007-2016 and overall in Top 5 for 15 of 16 years (except 2017 at No. 12).
- > Owns record for most wins vs. Top 10 (243) and won a personal-best 31 Top 10 matches in 2015.
- > Tied with Nadal for most Grand Slam men's singles titles in history (22), including record 10 Australian Open titles, and is 1 of 3 men to hold all 4 Grand Slam championships at same time (also Budge, Laver).
- > Only player to win all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events since start of series in 1990, doing so multiple times for a record total of 38 titles.
- > Owns 4th-most men's singles titles in Open Era (93) and 5th-most men's singles wins in Open Era (1,051).
- > Boasts winning records against both Federer (27-23) and Nadal (30-29), as well as win streaks of ATP Tour-record 43 matches (2010-11), ATP Masters 1000-record 31 matches (2011), Open Era-record 30 Grand Slam matches (2015-16)

ALEKSANDAR KOVACEVIC

Roland Garros Stats

- > One of 16 Americans in main draw (most since 19 in 1995) and the 24-year-old is making his Roland Garros debut.
- > This is also the New York native's Grand Slam tournament debut after failing to qualify at 2021 US Open (Q3), 2022 US Open (Q1) and 2023 Australian Open (Q1).
- > He will be playing in his first match vs. a Top 10 opponent and second career tour-level match on clay (I. to Brouwer in Houston 1R last month). Since Houston lost in 1R in two Challengers and in ATP Masters 1000 Rome qualifying 1R.



Career Highlights

- > Achieved career-high No. 101 on 3 April 2023 following 12-1 start to season on ATP Challenger Tour.
- > Won Challenger titles at Cleveland and Waco in 2023, highlighted by win over Wu Yibing in Cleveland final.
- > As lucky loser at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Miami, defeated Munar and lost to F. Cerundolo in 2R.
- > Defeated countryman McDonald to reach 2022 Seoul SF (I. to eventual champ Nishioka in 3 sets) in ATP Tour main draw debut as 222nd-ranked LL.
- > Has a 54-45 career record on ATP Challenger Tour and 52-39 on hard courts with 2 titles (2-6 on clay).
- > Played 5 years of college tennis at University of Illinois, where he was a 2-time All-American and graduated in 2021 with finance degree.
- > Born and raised in New York City, where he started playing tennis as a 4-year-old at Central Park with his parents, Milan and Milanka, who are ex-pro table tennis players from former Yugoslavia.

JANNIK SINNER

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 21-year-old Italian is playing in his 4th Roland Garros, reaching at least the fourth round stage in all three previous appearances (2020-22).
- > Advanced to his first career Grand Slam QF at 2020 Roland Garros in his tournament debut, becoming the first debutant to reach Roland Garros QF since Nadal in 2005. He lost to eventual champion Nadal.
- > One of 9 Italians in the main draw and last Italian men's champion at Roland Garros was Adriano Panatta in 1976.
- > Owns a 9-0 record vs. players outside the Top 10 at Roland Garros (1-3 vs. Top 10 players).

Career Highlights

- > Unranked to begin 2018, entered Top 100 in 2019, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager and broke into Top 10 at age 20 in 2021, reaching career-high No. 8 in April 2023.
- > Won 2019 Next Gen ATP Finals title and 7 tour-level titles from 2020-23, including 2022 Umag (d. Alcaraz).
- > As 19-year-old in 2021, became 1st teenager to win an ATP 500 title at Washington and 1st Italian finalist in 37-year tournament history of ATP Masters 1000 Miami.
- > Came back to Miami 2 years later to reach 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Miami final after beating World No. 1 Alcaraz in SF for biggest win of career to become first Italian with multiple ATP Masters 1000 finals.
- > Earned 49 victories in 2021, including 6-2 6-2 win over Hurkacz in Nitto ATP Finals debut as ALT, avenging loss in Miami final.
- > Reached QFs of all 4 Grand Slam events, including 2022 Wimbledon (I. to eventual champion Djokovic after holding 2-set lead) and 2022 US Open (I. to eventual champion Alcaraz after holding 1 MP).



ALEXANDRE MULLER

Roland Garros Stats

- > Frenchman is making his 3rd Roland Garros appearance after receiving a wild card in 2017 (I. to Monteiro in 1R) and qualifying in 2019 (I. to Carballes Baena in 1R).
- > This year's Roland Garros marks the first time he's a direct entrant into the main draw of a Grand Slam tournament, previously qualifying for Roland Garros in one out of 5 attempts.
- > Owns a 7-4 record in qualifying here and seeks first Roland Garros main draw win and second overall Grand Slam win (2021 Australian Open).

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 500 in 2016, Top 250 in 2019 and Top 100 in April 2023, earning career-high No. 94 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at 2023 Marrakech (I. to Carballes Baena).
- > Defeated No. 34 van de Zandschulp to reach 1st ATP Tour QF at 2023 Doha and No. 21 Musetti en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2023 Marrakech.
- > Made tour-level debut at 2017 Roland Garros as a WC (I. to Monteiro) and won first tour-level match at 2021 Australian Open as a LL beating Londero in 1R.
- > Owns a 114-110 Challenger record, winning 1st title at 2022 Blois, saving a MP in his 1R match.
- > Had a tennis court at his childhood home and began playing with his dad at age 6 and says he was better at football than tennis before choosing the latter.

BENOIT PAIRE

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 34-year-old Frenchman is making his 14th straight main draw appearance at Roland Garros (2010-23).
- > His best result is the 4th Round in 2019 when he posted wins over Copil, countryman Herbert 11-9 in 5th set and Carreno Busta before falling in 5 sets to No. 7 Nishikori.
- > He owns an 8-5 record in the 1R, winning in 8 of his 9 opening rounds from 2012-20 (I. to No. 4 Nadal in 2017 1R).
- > Aims to earn first win at the event since 2020 after losing to No. 16 Ruud in 2021 1R and No. 50 Ivashka in 2022 1R.
- > Has 0-6 mark vs. Top 20 players at Roland Garros, 1-19 at all Grand Slams (d. No. 4 Nishikori at 2015 US Open 1R).



Career Highlights

- > Rose 99 spots during season to end 2015 at No. 19, then reached career-high No. 18 in January 2016.
- > In 2015, won 1st ATP Tour singles title (Bastad), 3 Challenger titles and 1 Futures title to become 1st player to sweep titles at all 3 levels since Darcis in 2007.
- > Earned personal-best 34 wins and 2 titles in 2019, but owns 18-61 record with 0 SFs since tour resumed from COVID-19 suspension in August 2020.
- > Advanced to Grand Slam 4R on 4 occasions, including at 2015 US Open after saving 2 MPs to defeat 2014 finalist Nishikori in 1R.
- > Defeated No. 3 Wawrinka for biggest win of career at 2017 Madrid, lost to Wawrinka in biggest of 9 career finals at 2015 Tokyo and teamed w/Wawrinka for lone doubles title at 2013 Chennai.

CAMERON NORRIE

Roland Garros Stats

- > British No. 1 is making his 6th consecutive Roland Garros appearance and last year matched his best result 3R with wins over Guinard and Kubler before losing to No. 25 Khachanov in four sets.
- > Also posted a 3R showing at 2021 Roland Garros before losing to No. 3 Nadal in straight sets.
- > Made his debut in 2018 defeating Gojowczyk in 1R for second career Grand Slam win (1st at 2017 US Open) before losing to No. 16 Pouille in 2R.

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 10 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 8 in September 2022, joining Henman, Murray and Rusedski as 4th Top-10 British man in ATP Rankings history (since 1973).
- > Advanced to 13 ATP Tour finals from May 2021-February 2023, highlighted by 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title to become 1st British champion in 46-year tournament history.
- > Reached Grand Slam 4R, QF and SF for 1st time at 2022 Wimbledon, falling to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets.
- > Earned 52 wins in 2021 and 49 wins in 2022 before beating No. 2 Nadal at 2023 United Cup and No. 2 Alcaraz in 2023 Rio de Janeiro final for biggest wins of career.
- > Born in South Africa to a Scottish father and Welsh mother, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University, and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

CARLOS ALCARAZ

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 20-year-old Spaniard is the top seed at a Grand Slam tournament for the first time and is the youngest No. 1 seed at Roland Garros since Bjorn Borg (19) in 1976. He turned 20 during the tournament. Borg was also the top seed in 1975.
- > Last year as a 19-year-old, he became youngest men's player to reach Roland Garros QF since Djokovic (19) in 2006. The Spaniard lost to Zverev in 4 sets in QF.
- > Qualified in 2021 en route to Roland Garros 3R at age 18 to become youngest men's player to reach 3R since Andrei Medvedev (17) in 1992.
- > Undefeated in opening round at Roland Garros (2-0) and all Grand Slam tournaments (8-0) in his career.

Career Highlights

- > Youngest and first teenage World No. 1 and year-end No. 1 in Pepperstone ATP Rankings history (since 1973), making record rise from No. 32 at end of 2021 to No. 1 at age 19 in September 2022, then remaining atop rankings through end of season, earning 22 weeks overall at No. 1. At start of Roland Garros (29 May) he will have held No. 1 for 24 weeks.
- > Beat Ruud in 2022 US Open final for No. 1 ranking, becoming youngest men's champion at US Open since Sampras, 19, in 1990 and at any Grand Slam event since Nadal, 19, at 2005 Roland Garros.
- > Became youngest ATP 500 champion at 2022 Rio de Janeiro (165 events since 2009) and 3rd-youngest ATP Masters 1000 champion at 2022 Miami (294 events since 1990).
- > Captured 9 titles as a teenager (9-3 in finals), behind Borg (17), Nadal (16), Wilander (14), Becker (12) and Agassi (10) and 6th-youngest to win 10 tour-level titles behind: Wilander, Borg, Nadal, Becker and Agassi.
- > Improved to 4-0 in ATP Masters 1000 finals with repeat title at 2023 Madrid, 2nd-best start in Masters 1000 finals only behind Michael Chang and Jim Courier (both 5-0).
- > Youngest player to defeat both Nadal and Djokovic and 1st to do so at same clay-court event, beating them on back-to-back days en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2022 Madrid.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2021 US Open, becoming youngest men's quarter-finalist at US Open since Koch, 18, in 1963 (Amateur Era) and at any Grand Slam since Chang, 18, at 1990 Roland Garros.

FLAVIO COBOLLI

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 21-year-old Italian is making his Roland Garros and Grand Slam debut after successfully qualifying over Erhard in 1R, [26] Klein in 2R and Lokoli in final round.
- > Also tried to qualifying for Roland Garros in 2022, but lost in 2R to Kuzmanov.
- > Playing in his first match vs. Top 10 opponent and aims to become the first player ranked outside the Top 100 to beat Alcaraz in a main draw Grand Slam match.

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 200 in January 2022 and achieved career-high No. 133 in July 2022 after finishing 2020 outside Top 900.
- > Came through qualifying to earn 2 Top 100 wins over Thompson and Otte en route to 1st ATP Tour QF at 2023 Munich (I. to O'Connell).
- > Saved 3 MPs vs. Giron to win ATP Tour main draw debut 3-6 7-6 7-6 at 2021 Parma as 429th-ranked WC.
- > Won 1st Challenger title at 2022 Zadar after reaching finals at 2021 Rome-2 and 2021 Barletta.
- > Peaked at No. 8 in juniors and ended career by winning 2020 Roland Garros boys' doubles title w/Stricker.
- > Has 71-53 career record on ATP Challenger Tour, including 61-39 on clay with one title.

FELIX AUGER-ALIASSIME

Roland Garros Stats

- > Top Canadian is making 4th straight Roland Garros appearance, winning his first main draw match last year, coming from 2 sets down to defeat Varillas in 1R. Lost to Nadal in 4R in 5 sets.
- > Had to withdraw from 2019 Roland Garros due to left adductor injury, after sustaining an injury in Lyon final just days prior the tournament.
- > Advanced to 2016 Roland Garros boys' singles final as a 15-year-old (I. to Blancaneaux 8-6 in the third set).

Career Highlights

- > Achieved career-high No. 6 and earned personal-best 60 wins during breakout 2022 season, including career-long 16-match win streak with 3 titles in as many weeks at Florence, Antwerp and Basel.


