DAY 5 TALKING POINTS

- Second-round play continues in the bottom half of the draw on Thursday with three Top 10 stars aged 25-and-younger leading the way: last year's Roland Garros finalist No. 4 seed Casper Ruud, No 8 Jannik Sinner and No. 9 Taylor Fritz. The lone French player remaining (of 18) in the draw is Arthur Rinderknech.
- No. 6 **Holger Rune** advanced to the third round on Wednesday night when **Gael Monfils** withdrew due to a wrist injury. It was the first time in 16 Roland Garros appearances Monfils withdrew during the tournament.
- In the opening match on Court Philippe Chatrier, **Ruud** takes on Italian qualifier **Giulio Zeppieri**, who is playing in his second career Grand Slam tournament. The 21-year-old left-hander from Rome is facing a Top 10 opponent for the second time. Last July he lost in three sets to No. 5 Alcaraz in the semi-finals of Umag. Zeppieri is one of nine qualifiers to reach the second round, the most at Roland Garros since 2020.
- Ruud is looking to reach the third round at Roland Garros for the fifth year in a row. The 24-year-old Norwegian leads the ATP Tour with the most clay wins (82), clay finals (11) and clay titles (9) since 2020.
- In the evening session, two-time Roland Garros semi-finalist **Alexander Zverev** takes on **Alex Molcan** of Slovakia for the first time. Zverev attempts to reach the third round for the seventh time in eight appearances in Paris. Last year he suffered a season-ending right ankle injury vs. Nadal in the second set of the semi-finals.
- Molcan is trying to advance to the third round in a Grand Slam tournament for the third time, the first at Roland Garros. He reached the 3R at the 2021 US Open as a qualifier and at Wimbledon last year. He owns a 1-4 record vs. Top 50 players at Grand Slam events (d. No. 50 Martinez at 2022 Wimbledon 1R).
- On Court Suzanne Lenglen, Sinner plays German Daniel Altmaier, who is looking for his second Top 10 win at Roland Garros. In 2020, he beat No. 8 Berrettini for the biggest win of his career. In their only previous meeting in the 1R at last year's US Open, Sinner prevailed in five sets. Going into Thursday, there are three Italians in the 3R
- In the final match on, **Rinderknech** looks for his first career Top 10 win (0-5) against World No. 8 **Fritz**, Rinderknech came into Roland Garros winless (0-3) and he's trying to reach the third round at a Grand Slam event for the first time. Fritz, who has won a personal-best 10 clay matches this year (10-5), last reached the third round at Roland Garros in 2020. Countrymen **Marcos Giron**, **Tommy Paul** and **Tiafoe** are in action Thursday.
- On Court Simonne Mathieu, Tiafoe plays [Q] Aslan Karatsev and Cerundolo takes on German lucky loser
 Yannick Hanfmann, who is looking to avenge his first round loss to the Argentine in Buenos Aires in February.

GIULIO ZEPPIERI

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 21-year-old Italian has come through qualifying for the second consecutive year, defeating No. 51 Bublik in 1R for first career Grand Slam tournament win. Last year lost to No. 13 Hurkacz in first round.
- > The win over Bublik was his first career fifth-set match and first tour-level win outside of his SF run at Umag last year.
- > Owns a 6-0 match and 12-0 set record in Roland Garros qualifying and has not yet lost more than 4 games in any set played while attempting to qualify for the event.
- > Has an 0-4 record vs. Top 50 players in tour-level (d. No. 47 Molcan at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Rome qualifying 1R).

Career Highlights

- > Earned 1st ranking point at age 16 in July 2018 and achieved career-high No. 115 in February 2023 after winning Cherbourg, FRA Challenger and reaching final at Roverto ITA..
- > Qualified at 2022 Roland Garros in 1st try at a Grand Slam event, defeating 38-year-old Seppi in Q1 to snap his countryman's streak of 66 straight Grand Slam main draw appearances (I. to Hurkacz).
- > Also qualified at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Rome with comeback wins over No. 47 Molcan and No. 62 Cressy and 2 months later advanced to 1st ATP Tour SF in Umag as Q (I. to No. 5 Alcaraz).
- > Captured 1st Challenger title of career on home soil at 2021 Barletta (d. Cobolli)
- > Has a 68-64 career record on ATP Challenger Tour with 2 titles (53-51 on clay with 1 title, 15-13 on hard with 1 title).
- > Peaked at No. 12 in juniors after falling to countryman Musetti in 2019 Australian Open boys' singles SF and teaming with Musetti to reach 2019 Australian Open boys' doubles SF.

CASPER RUUD

- > Norwegian is making his 6th straight appearance and extended his perfect record at Roland Garros opening rounds to 6-0 defeating qualifier Elias Ymer in straight sets. Attempts to reach third round for the fifth consecutive year.
- > Entered Roland Garros last year as the World No. 8 before reaching 1st career Grand Slam final (I. to Nadal).
- > Previously reached 3R three times: in 2019 (I. to No. 3 Federer), 2020 (I. to No. 3 Thiem) and 2021 (I. to Davidovich Fokina in the deciding fifth set).



Career Highlights

- > Top-ranked Norwegian in history rose from No. 7 to career-high No. 2 after falling to Alcaraz in 2022 US Open final with No. 1 ranking at stake.
- > Has improved year-end Pepperstone ATP Rankings for 7 consecutive seaons from No. 1,126 in 2016 to No. 3 in 2022.
- > First Norwegian to win an ATP Tour title (10), play at Nitto ATP Finals (2021 SF, 2022 final), and reach both a Grand Slam final (2022 Roland Garros, US Open) and an ATP Masters 1000 final (2022 Miami).
- > Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.
- > Former World No. 1 junior leads ATP Tour since start of 2020 season in clay-court wins (82), finals (11) and titles (9).
- > Defeated No. 4 A. Zverev on a hard court for biggest win of career en route to 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Miami final (I. to Alcaraz).

ALEXANDER ZVEREV

Roland Garros Stats

- > German is making 8th straight Roland Garros main draw appearance and reached semi-finals past two years.
- > Defeated Harris in straight sets in 1R to extend his record to 6-1 in Roland Garros opening rounds and attempts to reach the third round for seventh time in eight appearances at the event.
- > Last year suffered a season-ending right ankle injury vs. Nadal in second set of semi-final.
- > Reached 2021 SF after rallying from 2 sets down vs. countryman Otte in 1R (I. to Tsitsipas in 5 sets).
- > Also advanced to Roland Garros QFs in 2018 (I. to Thiem) and 2019 (I. to No. 1 Djokovic).
- > Owns 8-1 record in 5th sets at Roland Garros, including 3 consecutive wins in 2018 (d. Lajovic, Dzumhur, Khachanov).
- > Advanced to 2013 Roland Garros boys' singles final (I. to Garin).

Career Highlights

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 on 13 June 2022 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal. Returned in January 2023.
- > Finished in Top 10 for 5 straight years from 2017-2021 with year-end best No. 3 in 2021.
- > Led ATP Tour with 6 titles in 2021. He has 2nd-most titles (19) of all players born since 1990, behind Medvedev (20), defeating No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and 2021 Nitto ATP Finals titles.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.
- > Joined Murray and Thiem as 3rd player to defeat Djokovic on hard (3 times), Federer on grass (2016 Halle SF) and Nadal on clay (2021 Madrid QF)



ALEX MOLCAN

Roland Garros Stats

- > In his second main draw appearance, he defeated Gaston to reach the second round for second consecutive year.
- > Lost to No. 1 Djokovic in 2022 2R after defeating F. Coria in 1R, the brother of Guillermo Coria, former 2004 finalist.
- > Owns 1-4 record vs. Top 50 players at Grand Slam tournaments (d. No. 50 Martinez at 2022 Wimbledon 1R).
- > Advanced to 2015 Roland Garros boys' singles 3R (I. to Barrios Vera) and 2014 Roland Garros boys' doubles 3R with countryman Blasko (I. to Luz/Menezes).

Career Highlights

- > Ended 2021 and 2022 as No. 1 Slovakian, breaking into Top 50 in April 2022, achieving career-high No. 38 in May 2022.
- > Won a personal-best 26 matches and finished a year-end best No. 50 in 20022.
- > Earned 1st 4 ATP Tour main draw wins of career en route to 2021 Belgrade-2 final as 255th-ranked Q (I. to No. 1 Djokovic).
- > Also advanced to clay-court finals at Marrakech (I. to Goffin) and Lyon (I. to Norrie) in 2022, defeating No. 9 Auger-Aliassime for biggest win of career in Marrakech 2R.
- > Advanced to Grand Slam 3R at 2021 US Open as Q and 2022 Wimbledon.
- > Did not drop a set at 2021 Liberec en route to 1st of 2 Challenger titles, defeating Jaziri 6-1 6-0 in SF and Machac 6-0 6-1 in final.

JANNIK SINNER

- > Opened on Monday with a 6-1 6-4 6-1 victory over Muller to improve to 10-0 vs. players outside the Top 10 at Roland Garros (1-3 vs. Top 10 opponents).
- > The 21-year-old Italian is playing in his 4th Roland Garros, reaching at least the fourth round stage in all three previous appearances (2020-22).
- > Advanced to his first career Grand Slam QF at 2020 Roland Garros in his tournament debut, becoming the first debutant to reach Roland Garros QF since Nadal in 2005. He lost to eventual champion Nadal.
- > One of 9 Italians in the main draw and last Italian men's champion at Roland Garros was Adriano Panatta in 1976.



Career Highlights

- > Unranked to begin 2018, entered Top 100 in 2019, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager and broke into Top 10 at age 20 in 2021, reaching career-high No. 8 in April 2023.
- > Won 2019 Next Gen ATP Finals title and 7 tour-level titles from 2020-23, including 2022 Umag (d. Alcaraz).
- > As 19-year-old in 2021, became 1st teenager to win an ATP 500 title at Washington and 1st Italian finalist in 37-year tournament history of ATP Masters 1000 Miami.
- > Came back to Miami 2 years later to reach 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Miami final after beating World No. 1 Alcaraz in SF for biggest win of career to become first Italian with multiple ATP Masters 1000 finals.
- > Earned 49 victories in 2021, including 6-2 6-2 win over Hurkacz in Nitto ATP Finals debut as ALT, avenging loss in Miami final.
- > Reached QFs of all 4 Grand Slam events, including 2022 Wimbledon (I. to eventual champion Djokovic after holding 2-set lead) and 2022 US Open (I. to eventual champion Alcaraz after holding 1 MP).

DANIEL ALTMAIER

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 24-year-old German earned a straight sets win over Huesler in 1R to record his first Grand Slam win since reaching the fourth round at 2020 Roland Garros in his Grand Slam tournament debut.
- > In 2020, came through qualifying to defeat No. 30 seed Struff in 2R and World No. 8 Berrettini both in straight sets, to record biggest win of career and lone Top 10 victory (I. to Carreno Busta in 4R).
- > Went on drought of 5 straight first round losses in Grand Slam events since until this year's tournament.
- > Owns a 1-7 record vs. Top 20 players (1-4 in Grand Slams).

Career Highlights

- > Finished at No. 100 in 2021 year-end rankings, then achieved career-high No. 53 in May 2022 after winning 4th of 7 Challenger titles at Heilbronn.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Masters 1000 quarter-final as a lucky loser at 2023 Madrid (I. to Coric).
- > Ended 2022 season with 13 wins in his last 14 Challenger matches, including back-to-back titles at Lima-2 and Guayaguil.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SFs of career in back-to-back weeks at Umag and Kitzbuhel in July 2021.
- > Made Grand Slam qualifying debut at 2020 Roland Garros and earned 6th win of tournament over No. 8 Berrettini to reach 4R.
- > Has 113-57 career record on ATP Challenger Tour with 6 of 7 titles coming on clay. Has 67-31 record on clay, 45-24 on hard courts.
- > Hits a one-handed backhand and says that his idols growing up were fellow one-handers Federer and Wawrinka.

ARTHUR RINDERKNECH

Roland Garros Stats

- > Frenchman is playing in his 4th consecutive Roland Garros and earned his first win at the event over compatriot Gasquet in 1R in four sets and now attempts to reach first 3R in 10th career Grand Slam tournament.
- > Has 0-5 career record vs. Top 10 players and 0-4 vs. Top 50 players in Grand Slam events.
- > Lost in first round to Bedene in 2020, Cilic in 2021 and Bublik last year (1-9 in sets).
- > Reached the 2R at 4 Grand Slam events, 2022 Australian Open, 2021-22 US Open and 2023 Roland Garros.
- > Made one main draw appearance at boys' event in 2012 and lost to 2013 Roland Garros boys' winner Garin in 1R.

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 50 in January 2022 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at Adelaide-2 (I. to Kokkinakis), then became No. 1 Frenchman and achieved career-high No. 42 in October 2022.
- > Playing on indoor hard courts in fall 2022, saved 1 MP vs. No. 17 Schwartzman in Tel Aviv 2R, 9 MPs vs. No. 15 Carreno Busta in Gijon QF and 2 MPs vs. No. 16 Cilic in Basel 1R.
- > In 2021, advanced to Kitzbuhel SF, reached 6 other ATP Tour QFs, and earned 1st 18 tour-level wins of career.
- > Captured Challenger titles at 2020 Rennes, 2020 Calgary, 2021 Istanbul as Q and 2022 Poznan.
- > Five-time All-American at Texas A&M University (3 singles, 2 doubles), where he graduated from Mays Business School in 2018.

TAYLOR FRITZ

- > World No. 8 is making his 7th Roland Garros appearance and attempting to equal his best result at the event, reaching the third round in 2020 (I. to Sonego).
- > Defeated compatriot Mmoh in first round 6-2 6-1 6-1 to advance to second round of Roland Garros for the fifth consecutive year (2019-23).
- > He is 3-1 vs. Frenchmen at Grand Slam tournaments (0-0 at Roland Garros).
- > At 2015 Roland Garros reached the boys' singles final as the No. 2 seed, losing to compatriot Paul, before avenging the loss to defeat Paul at 2015 US Open boys' singles final.



Career Highlights

- > Former World No. 1 junior won 5th ATP Tour title at 2023 Delray Beach to achieve career-high No. 5 and become 1st American in Top 5 since Roddick in September 2009.
- > Defeated No. 2 Nadal en route 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF after beating him in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final to become that event's 1st American men's champion since Agassi in 2001.
- > Advanced to 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2022 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam QF at 2022 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-7 record in Grand Slam 3R matches.
- > Reached 1st ATP Tour final at 2016 Memphis as 18-year-old WC, becoming youngest American finalist since start of ATP Tour in 1990.
- > Clinched inaugural United Cup for Team USA in 2023 after helping Team World capture 2022 Laver Cup.

Roland Garros Stats

- > Qualified without losing a set (6-0) and beat Popyrin in first round for his first Grand Slam win since 2022 Aust. Open.
- > He aims to reach 3R at Roland Garros for the first time after equaling his best result at the event (2R in 2021).
- > Owns 2-1 record vs. Top 20 players at Grand Slams (0-0 at Roland Garros), beating No. 9 Schwartzman in 3R and No. 19 Auger-Aliassime en route to a semi-final in his Grand Slam debut at 2021 Aust. Open (I. to No. 1 Djokovic).
- > In 2021 main draw debut (d. Brooksby, I. to Kohlschreiber) after losing in final round qualifying in 2016, 2020 and in 1R of qualifying in 2015.

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 20 after winning 2nd ATP Tour title at 2021 Moscow, then achieved career-high No. 14 following 3rd title at 2022 Sydney.
- > Ended 23-match ATP 500 win streak of countryman Rublev en route to 1st ATP Tour title at 2021 Dubai.
- > Qualified at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid and reached SFs with wins over No. 19 de Minaur (3R) and No. 3 Medvedev (4R) before losing to [LL] Struff.

- > Has a 70-62 ATP Challenger Tour career record (46-37 on clay) reaching back-to-back finals on home soil at 2022 San Benedetto Del Tronto (I. to Brancaccio) and 2022 Cordenons (I. to Zhang).
- > In doubles, earned a career-high of No. 44 in May 2023 after winning 3 ATP Tour titles at 2021 Cagliari w/Sonego, 2023 Santiago w/Pellegrino and 2023 Marrakech w/Demoliner, with a 11-5 tour-level record this season.
