- Defending champions also won Metz together in 2012. They have each also won the event 2 additional times with different partners (Mahut w/Benneteau in 2003 and Clement in 2004; Roger-Vasselin w/Kubot in 2015 and Benneteau in 2017). Mahut was also Metz runner-up in 2013 (w/Tsonga) and 2015 (w/Herbert).
- Teamed up to reach the Wimbledon final this year (l. in 5 sets to Cabal/Farah).
- No. 7 Mahut is a former World No. 1 in doubles, who has a 25-15 record in ATP Tour doubles finals. He completed the career Grand Slam in doubles w/Herbert by winning the Australian Open this year (his only title in 2019 thus far).
- No. 27 Roger-Vasselin (career-high No. 6) is 18-12 in doubles finals, including titles at 2014 Roland Garros (w/Benneteau) and 2015 Cincinnati (w/Nestor). He has 2 titles in 2019 (Montpellier and Lyon, both w/Dodig).

- No. 70 Lindstedt (career-high No. 3) is 22-25 in doubles finals, including titles at the 2014 Australian Open (w/Kubot) and 2012 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati (w/Tecau). He is 0-1 in finals this season (Geneva runner-up w/Ebden).

### Paire 2019 Summary | Age: 30 | World No. 23 | 32-22 in 2019 (Marrakech, Lyon **Champion**) | 9-6 at Metz (2017 Finalist)

- Appearing in 4th SF of the season and 3-0 in this round and 2nd SF in Metz. He reached the final two years ago.
- His 32 match wins this season ties a career-best in 2013. Has 3-5 career record in ATP Tour finals (2-1 this season)
- Owns career-best 15-5 record on clay with titles at Marrakech (d. Andujar) and Lyon (d. Auger-Aliassime).
- Earned 3 wins in 3 sets to reach Winston-Salem final (l. to Hurkacz in 3 sets).
- Advanced to 4R at Roland Garros (l. to Nishikori in 5 sets) and Wimbledon (l. to Bautista Agut) and squandered 2-set lead and 3 MPs vs. Bedene in US Open 2R.

- Every Moselle Open singles champion since 2010 is in the 2019 field: **Gilles Simon** (2010, 2013, 2018), **Jo-Wilfried Tsonga** (2011-12, 2015), **David Goffin** (2014), **Lucas Pouille** (2016) and **Peter Gojowczyk** (2017).
- Goffin, the No. 1 seed, was 12-13 on the season and fell outside of the Top 30 on 10 June. Since then, the 28-year-old Belgian is 20-7 with finals at the ATP 500 event in Halle and ATP Masters 1000 event in Cincinnati.
- Goffin will rise from No. 11 to No. 8 in the ATP Race to London if he reaches the Metz final and No. 9 **Matteo Berrettini** does not reach the St. Petersburg semi-finals, or if he wins a title on Sunday and Berrettini does not.
- A Frenchman has won the Moselle Open singles title in 10 of 16 years since the tournament debuted in 2003. Still seeking his first title here is **Richard Gasquet**, who reached his first of 31 ATP Tour finals at 2004 Metz.
- Three-time singles champions Simon and Tsonga return alongside four-time doubles champions **Nicolas Mahut** and **Eduard Roger-Vasselin**. The Frenchmen have won two Metz titles as a team and two separately.
