**MUTUA MADRID OPEN TALKING POINTS**

- No. 1 seed **Alexander Zverev** opens his campaign for 3rd **Mutua Madrid Open** title and takes a 5-2 **Lexus ATP Head2Head** lead (after 0-2 start) into his match vs. Spaniard **Roberto Bautista Agut**. Zverev, who won Munich title last week, aims to extend his 5-match winning streak to tie Corretja and Ferrero for 9th-most ATP Masters 1000 wins on clay in series history. Bautista Agut seeks first win over Zverev in over 10 years (2015 Rotterdam) to record back-to-back wins in one event for 1st time since winning Antwerp title last October.

- Defending champion **Andrey Rublev** takes on Frenchman **Gael Monfils** in a rematch of their Monte-Carlo 2R encounter earlier this month. Monfils bids to tie Gasquet for most ATP Masters 1000 match wins among Frenchmen (144) and become 2nd player in event history to defeat reigning champion in opening round after Horna beat Ferrero in 2004 2R. Rublev has reached at least R16 in all previous four appearances in Madrid.

- World No. 15 **Casper Ruud** leads the ATP Tour in clay-court wins (119), finals (16) and titles (11) since the start of 2020 season and takes on **Arthur Rinderknech**. World No. 10 **Daniil Medvedev** begins his quest to become 5th man to complete the set of SFs at all active 9 ATP Masters 1000 events (also Djokovic, Federer, Nadal, Murray) vs. **Laslo Djere**. Djere seeks 4th Top 10 win, 2nd in Madrid after d. No. 8 del Potro in 2019.
- World No. 29 **Alejandro Davidovich Fokina** starts his event vs. Portuguese No. 1 **Nuno Borges**. Davidovich Fokina and Bautista Agut are only Spaniards left in the men’s draw (could meet in 3R) and aim to avoid having no Spanish players in 3R for 1st time in event history. Fresh off his Barcelona title, No. 8 seed **Holger Rune** takes on **Flavio Cobolli** and bids to keep his unbeaten record on Spanish clay this season.

**Alexander Zverev** | Age: 28 | World No. 2 (Career-High) | 2025: 19-7 (Munich Title) | Madrid: 23-5 (2018, 2021 Titles)  
> Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal.

- > Led ATP Tour with 6 titles in 2021 and leads all players born since 1990 with 24 career titles, defeating No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and 2021 Nitto ATP Finals championships.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.
- > Earned wins over 14-time champion Nadal en route to 2024 Roland Garros final and 10-time champion Djokovic via RET to reach 2025 Australian Open final.
- > Defeated Djokovic at 2017 Rome and Federer at 2017 Montreal for 1st and 2nd of his 6 ATP Masters 1000 titles.
- > Joined Murray and Thiem as 3rd player to defeat Djokovic on hard (3 times), Federer on grass (2016 Halle SF) and Nadal on clay (2 times).

**NOTE:** Zverev is on a 5-match winning streak after capturing Munich title on his 28th birthday on Sunday. Two-time Madrid champion went 9-0 in ATP Masters 1000 opening rounds last year, but is 1-2 this year after 2R losses to Griekspoor in Indian Wells and Berrettini in Monte-Carlo. 28-year-old owns 61-20 record on clay at this level.

**Roberto Bautista Agut** | Age: 37 | World No. 55 | Career-High No. 9 | 2025: 4-10 (4x 2R) | Madrid: 14-10 (2014 SF)

- > Captured 12th ATP Tour title in Antwerp and 400th win of career in 2024 and ended 2019 at career-high No. 9.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2019 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam SF at 2019 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-9 record in Grand Slam 4R matches.
- > Defeated No. 1 Djokovic in 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai SF, 2019 Doha SF and 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R, as well as No. 1 Medvedev in 2022 Mallorca QF.
- > Went 4-1 at 2022 ATP Cup and 6-0 at 2020 ATP Cup to lead Spain to finals after helping his country win 2019 Davis Cup.
- > Played football for Villarreal C.F. until he was 14 years old.

**NOTE:** Bautista Agut aims to reach Madrid 3R for fifth time in 11 appearances (2014-16, 2023) and win back-to-back matches at an ATP Masters 1000 level for first time since 2022 Cincinnati. He seeks first win over a Top-2 player since defeating No. 1 Medvedev at 2022 Mallorca and his first Top 10 win on clay (0-19; 21-64 across all surfaces).

**Gael Monfils** | Age: 38 | World No. 42 | Career-High No. 6 | 2025: 16-6 (Auckland Title) | Madrid: 16-13 ('08, '10 QF)  
 > Former No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 6 in 2016 and married former WTA No. 3 Elina Svitolina in 2021.  
 > Owns 13 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500s at 2016 Washington, 2019 Rotterdam and 2020 Rotterdam.  
 > At 38 years and 4 months, won 2025 Auckland, becoming oldest champion in ATP Tour history (since 1990) and oldest tour-level titlist since Rosewall at 1977 Hong Kong.  
 > Reached at least 1 final in 20 different seasons (2005-23, 2025), including ATP Masters 1000s at 2009 Paris, 2010 Paris and 2016 Monte-Carlo.  
 > Earned 581 career victories, highlighted by biggest wins over No. 1 Nadal at 2009 Doha and No. 1 Medvedev at 2022 Indian Wells, as well as career-long win streaks of 12 matches and 25 sets in 2020.  
 > Advanced to 2008 Roland Garros and 2016 US Open SFs after winning junior titles at Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon in 2004.

**NOTE:** Monfils is 38-98 vs. Top 10, 1-2 in 2025, seeking first Top 10 win on clay since defeating No. 3 Cilic in 2018 Rio de Janeiro 2R. At 38 years and 7 months, he would be 2nd-oldest man to earn Top 10 win on clay in PIF ATP Rankings history after Rosewall beat No. 10 Nastase at 1975 North Conway\* and No. 2 Newcombe at 1973 Tokyo\*.  
 \* Rosewall was 38y 11m at 1973 Tokyo and 40y 9m at 1975 North Conway

**Andrey Rublev** | Age: 27 | World No. 8 | Career-High No. 5 | 2025: 11-9 (Doha Title) | Madrid: 11-3 (2024 Title)  
 > Former No. 1 junior broke into Top 20 in January 2020, Top 10 in October 2020 and Top 5 in September 2021.  
 > Rallied from a set down in both SF and final for 1st time in career at 2023 Monte-Carlo to capture 1st ATP Masters 1000 title and defeated two-time defending champion No. 3 Alcaraz en route to 2nd title at 2024 Madrid.  
 > Defeated No. 3 Nadal at 2021 Monte-Carlo, No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Cincinnati and No. 1 Sinner at 2024 Montreal en route to ATP Masters 1000 finals and beat No. 1 Djokovic for 11th of 17 ATP Tour titles at 2022 Belgrade.  
 > Led tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.  
 > Ten-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist reached 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF and won gold medal in All-ROC mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).  
 > Went 9-1 in singles and 4-1 in doubles at team events during 2021 season, sweeping titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

**NOTE:** Rublev is on a 6-match winning streak in Madrid after winning his 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title last year and bids to reach Madrid 3R for 5th time in as many appearances. He is 1-3 in ATP Masters 1000 events this season, lone win over Monfils in Monte-Carlo 2R. He is down to No. 17 on PIF ATP Live Rankings and needs to at least reach the final to avoid leaving Top 10 for first time since September 2022 (138 weeks).

**Arthur Rinderknech** | Age: 29 | World No. 76 | Career-High No. 42 | 2025: 3-10 (3x 2R) | Madrid: 1-1 (2025 2R)  
 > Broke into Top 50 in January 2022 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at Adelaide-2, then became No. 1 Frenchman and achieved career-high No. 42 in October 2022.  
 > Playing on indoor hard courts in fall 2022, saved 1 MP vs. No. 17 Schwartzman in Tel Aviv 2R, 9 MPs vs. No. 15 Carreno Busta in Gijon QF and 2 MPs vs. No. 16 Cilic in Basel 1R.  
 > In 2021, advanced to Kitzbuhel SF, reached 6 other ATP Tour QFs, and earned 1st 18 tour-level wins of career.  
 > Captured Challenger titles at 2020 Rennes, 2020 Calgary, 2021 Istanbul as Q, 2022 Poznan, 2023 Zug and 2024 Lille.  
 > Five-time All-American at Texas A&M University (3 singles, 2 doubles), where he graduated from Mays Business School in 2018.

**NOTE:** Rinderknech is 6-24 vs. Top 20 (2-3 on clay after 2-0 start), looking for first Top 20 win since defeating No. 16 Cilic in 2022 Basel 1R (0-14 since). After defeating Safiullin in 1R, he bids to advance to ATP Masters 1000 3R for third time in his career after Montreal and Paris, both last year.

**Casper Ruud** | Age: 26 | World No. 15 | Career-High No. 2 | 2025: 15-6 (Dallas Final) | Madrid: 6-4 (2021 SF)  
 > Top-ranked Norwegian in history rose from No. 7 to career-high No. 2 after falling to Alcaraz in 2022 US Open final with No. 1 ranking at stake.  
 > First Norwegian to win an ATP Tour title (12), play at Nitto ATP Finals ('21, '24 SF, 2022 final), and reach a Grand Slam final (2022-23 Roland Garros, 2023 US Open) and an ATP Masters 1000 final (2022 Miami, 2024 Monte-Carlo).  
 > Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.  
 > Former No. 1 junior leads ATP Tour since start of 2020 season in clay-court wins (119), finals (16) and titles (11), highlighted by the biggest title of career at 2024 Barcelona.  
 > Defeated World No. 1 Djokovic for biggest win of career en route to 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo final.

**NOTE:** Ruud is 12-1 vs. Frenchmen on clay since the start of 2020 season, lone loss to Fils in 2023 Hamburg QF. He is playing in his fifth Madrid main draw, reaching SF on his debut in 2021 and 4R last year, but recorded opening round losses to No. 77 Lajovic in 2022 and No. 105 Arnaldi in 2023.

**Daniil Medvedev** | Age: 29 | World No. 10 | Career-High No. 1 | 2025: 14-8 (2 SFs) | Madrid: 6-5 (2024 QF)  
 > Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in 2004.  
 > Six-time Grand Slam finalist owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.  
 > Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).  
 > Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.  
 > Won 18 of his 20 singles titles on hard courts and all 20 of his titles at different events, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami and 2023 Rome, his 1st title on clay.

**NOTE:** Medvedev is making his sixth Madrid main draw appearance, highlighted by reaching QF last year to complete set of QFs at all ATP Masters 1000 and Grand Slam events (l. to Lehecka via RET). He is 12-1 after winning 1st set this season and plays in his second clay event of 2025 after reaching ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo 3R.

**Laslo Djere** | Age: 29 | World No. 71 | Career-High No. 27 | 2025: 10-3 (Santiago Title) | Madrid: 3-2 (2019 3R)  
 > Former World No. 3 junior broke into Top 30 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Rio de Janeiro without dropping a set, reaching career-high No. 27 in June 2019.  
 > Dedicated Rio title to his parents, Caba and Hajnalka, who both passed away from cancer.  
 > Defeated countryman Lajovic en route to 2nd title at 2020 Sardinia and former champions Martinez and Baez en route to 3rd title at 2025 Santiago.  
 > Earned 5 victories and won 5 TBs en route to 2022 Winston-Salem final despite entering event with 15-44 career record on hard courts and 1-18 TB record in 2022.  
 > Also on hard courts, upset World No. 3 Ruud at 2023 Auckland for biggest win of career.

**NOTE:** Djere is 3-20 vs. Top 10 (2-10 on clay), seeking first win since defeating No. 3 Ruud at 2023 Auckland. Serbian No. 3 earned all 10 wins this season on clay courts, highlighted by Santiago title and Buenos Aires SF. He aims to reach his 5th ATP Masters 1000 3R (2019 Indian Wells, 2019 Madrid, 2022 Monte-Carlo, 2023 Rome).

**Flavio Cobolli** | Age: 22 | World No. 36 | Career-High No. 30 | 2025: 8-10 (Bucharest Title) | Madrid: 3-1 (2024 3R)  
 > Broke into Top 200 in January 2022 and Top 100 in October 2023, achieving career-high No. 30 in September 2024 soon after reaching 1st ATP Tour final in Washington.  
 > Defeated clay court champions Gasquet and Baez to capture 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Bucharest after entering the event on an 8-match losing streak on tour-level, becoming 1st Italian champion in history of that event.  
 > Earned biggest wins of career over Americans Shelton as No. 15 en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2024 Geneva and as No. 14 to reach 1st final at 2024 Washington and No. 13 Paul in 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati 1R.  
 > Also in 2024, reached Australian Open 3R as Q (d. No. 18 Jarry in 1R) and US Open 3R as No. 31 seed.  
 > Saved 3 MPs vs. Giron to win ATP Tour main draw debut 3-6 7-6 7-6 at 2021 Parma as 429th-ranked WC.  
 > Peaked at No. 8 in juniors and ended junior career by winning 2020 Roland Garros boys' doubles title w/Stricker.

**NOTE:** Cobolli is 0-9 vs. Top 10, aiming to record the biggest win of his career and 50th tour-level win of career (49-48). He seeks his 4th ATP Masters 1000 3R after reaching the stage in Madrid, Cincinnati and Shanghai last year.

 > From 2022 Paris to 2023 Rome, compiled an 18-5 record in 6 ATP Masters 1000 events, also posting runner-up results in Monte-Carlo and Rome.  
 > Went on a 7-match winning streak vs. Top 5 opponents for 7-1 start to career vs. Top 5 (now 8-14), including wins over No. 1 Alcaraz at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Paris and No. 1 Djokovic at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome.

**NOTE:** Rune is on a 5-match winning streak after capturing his 5th ATP Tour title in Barcelona last week (d. No. 2 Alcaraz in final). 21-year-old owns 17-4 tour-level record vs. Italians (2-3 vs. Sinner, 4-1 vs. Berrettini) and seeks 1st ATP Masters 1000 win since reaching Indian Wells final after opening round losses in Miami and Monte-Carlo.

> Earned 1st ATP Tour win and advanced to 1st QF, SF and final at 2024 Rio de Janeiro as Q and defeated clay-court champions Darderi, Seyboth Wild and F. Cerundolo en route to 2nd final in Bucharest.
