Elias Ymer | Age: 26 | World No. 134 | Career-High No. 105 | 2022: 7-4 (Pune SF) | Bastad: 3-8 ('14, '19, '21 2R)
> Broke into Top 200 in 2015, achieved career-high No. 105 in 2018 and ended 5 straight seasons as No. 1 Swede before being passed by little brother Mikael (2014-18).
> Made history as a teenager in 2015, becoming 2nd man on record to qualify for all 4 Grand Slam events in a calendar year (also Dancevic in 2011).
> Captured 2016 Stockholm doubles title in team debut w/M. Ymer as 954th-ranked WC (d. Pavic/Venus 6-1 6-1).
> Won 1st 6 Challenger singles finals of his career, capturing most recent title at 2018 Pune.
> Achieved career-high No. 5 in junior rankings, highlighted by run to 2012 Orange Bowl final (l. to Djere).

NOTE: Ymer is the only home player in the field, making 9th appearance in Bastad, looking for 4th win in the event.

Daniel Altmaier | Age: 23 | World No. 62 | Career-High No. 53 | 2022: 5-16 (Pune, Mallorca QF) | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut)
> Finished at No. 100 in 2021 year-end rankings, then achieved career-high No. 53 in May 2022 after winning 4th Challenger title of career at Heilbronn.
> Won Challenger titles in 2021 at Braunschweig, Ludenscheid and Puerto Vallarta.
> Made Grand Slam qualifying debut at 2020 Roland Garros, earning 6th win of event vs. No. 8 Berrettini to reach 4R.
> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SFs of career in back-to-back weeks at Umag and Kitzbuhel in July 2021.
> Hits a one-handed backhand and says that his idols growing up were fellow one-handers Federer and Wawrinka.

NOTE: Altmaier is 1-3 on tour-level on clay this season, but reached both career ATP Tour SFs in July last year.

Stan Wawrinka | Age: 37 | World No. 290 | Career-High: No. 3 | 2022: 3-5 (Rome 3R) | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut)
> Achieved career-high No. 3 in 2014 and ended 2014-16 at No. 4 before undergoing 2 left knee surgeries in 2017 and 2 left foot surgeries in 2021.
> Boasts 5 wins over World No. 1 at Grand Slams, including finals of 2014 Australian Open (d. Nadal), 2015 Roland Garros (d. Djokovic) and 2016 US Open (d. Djokovic).
> One of 3 players to defeat Djokovic, Nadal, Federer and Murray at Grand Slams (also Berdych, Tsonga).
> Owns 16 singles titles with 11 straight wins in finals from 2014-16, defeating Federer for lone ATP Masters 1000 title at 2014 Monte Carlo.
> Won 2008 Beijing Olympics doubles gold medal w/Federer and helped Switzerland capture 2014 Davis Cup.

NOTES: Wawrinka is 39-45 vs. Top 20 players on clay (1-1 in 2022, d. No. 17 Opelka at ATP Masters 1000 Rome in 1R).

Pablo Carreno Busta | Age: 30 | World No. 18 | Career-High No. 10 | 2022: 18-15 (Barcelona F) | Bastad: 3-4 ('14, '18 QF)
> Winner of 6 singles and 4 doubles titles achieved career-high No. 10 in singles and No. 16 in doubles during 2017 season.
> Reached US Open SF in 2017 after defeating 4 qualifiers and in 2020 after defeating No. 1 Djokovic by default and earning 5-set wins over Uchiyama and Shapovalov.
> Defeated No. 1 Djokovic and No. 2 Medvedev en route to 2020 Tokyo Olympics bronze medal (held in 2021).
> Advanced to Roland Garros QF in 2017 and 2020, as well as 2016 US Open doubles final with countryman Garcia-Lopez.
> Helped Team Spain reach ATP Cup finals in 2020 (5-1 in doubles) and 2022 (4-1 in singles).

NOTE: Carreno Busta is 1-4 on clay since reaching the 2022 Barcelona final in April.

Lorenzo Musetti | Age: 20 | World No. 67 | Career-High No. 51 | 2022: 13-15 (3 times in QF) | Bastad: 0-1 (2021 1R)
 > Achieved career-high No. 51 in May 2022 after reaching 3R at ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo, Barcelona and ATP Masters 1000 Madrid as Q.

- > In 2021, qualified for Intesa Sanpaolo Next Gen ATP Finals and reached Roland Garros 4R (l. to World No. 1 and eventual champion Djokovic after leading by 2 sets).
- > Advanced to ATP Tour SFs at 2020 Sardinia as WC, 2021 Acapulco as Q and 2021 Lyon.
- > Defeated Wawrinka and Nishikori to reach 2020 Rome 3R as 18-year-old Q-WC, becoming 1st player born in 2002 to win an ATP Tour match and youngest player in Rome 3R since Santoro, 18, in 1991.
- > Became World No. 1 junior after winning 2019 Australian Open boys' singles title and reaching 2018 US Open boys' singles final.

NOTE: The #NextGenATP Italian is 7-8 in opening rounds on tour-level this season (4-1 on clay; l. to No. 4 Tsitsipas at Roland Garros 1R). He is hoping to break a 5-match losing streak on tour-level dating back to 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid in May.

Laslo Djere | Age: 27 | World No. 53 | Career-High No. 27 | 2022: 12-15 (Marrakech SF) | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut)

- > Former World No. 3 junior broke into Top 30 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Rio de Janeiro without dropping a set.
- > Dedicated Rio title to his parents, Caba and Hajnalka, who both passed away from cancer.
- > Defeated countryman Lajovic en route to 2nd title at 2020 Sardinia.
- > Posted biggest wins of career over No. 8 Thiem (2019 Rio de Janeiro 1R) and No. 8 Del Potro (2019 Madrid 2R).
- > Owns records of 69-44 on clay (.611), 15-44 on hard (.254) and 3-9 on grass (.250) with his 1st 18 ATP Tour QFs coming on clay.

NOTE: Djere is hoping to break a 6-match tour-level losing streak vs. Top 100 players, last defeating No. 26 Sonogo at ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo in April.
