BITPANDA HAMBURG OPEN TALKING POINTS

- 2023 champion, 2024 finalist and Hamburg-native **Alexander Zverev** returns to the event as No. 1 seed. He will look to become the fifth player to win multiple titles in Hamburg this century after Federer (2002, 2004-05, 2007), Nadal (2008, 2015), L. Mayer (2014, 2017), and Basilashvili (2018-19) and is one of two German champions in tournament's Open Era history alongside Stich (1993).
- Zverev** leads the charge of five Germans in the field with **Diego Dedura**, **Justin Engel**, and **Jan-Lennard Struff** receiving wildcards. Last month, Dedura became the first player born in 2008 to play and win an ATP Tour match, when he defeated Shapovalov in Munich. The lone remaining German in the field is **Daniel Altmaier**, who reached Hamburg QF in 2023 after defeating then-World No. 7 **Andrey Rublev**.
- No. 3 seed **Rublev** is the other former champion in the draw, losing in 2019 final to Basilashvili before beating Tsitsipas for 2020 title. Rublev (Doha), No. 8 seed **Sebastian Baez** (Rio de Janeiro), and **Zverev** (Munich) are also only ATP 500 champions of this season in the field.

- No. 4 seed **Francisco Cerundolo** leads the ATP Tour in clay-court wins this year (18) and will attempt to capture the biggest title of his career. Meanwhile, No. 6 seed **Felix Auger-Aliassime** is one of two 2-time ATP Tour champions in 2025 alongside Alcaraz (playing ATP Masters 1000 Rome final on Sunday) and is looking for his first clay-court win since reaching semi-finals at Paris Olympics in July last year.

Diego Dedura (GER) vs Luciano Darderi (ITA)

First Meeting

Diego Dedura | Age: 17 | World No. 374 (Career-High) | 2025: 1-1 (Munich 2R) | Hamburg: 0-0 (Debut)

> Earned his first PIF ATP Rankings point at age 15 by defeating countryman Engel at M25 Wetzlar before achieving career-high No. 374 in May 2025.

> Defeated No. 100 McDonald in first ATP Tour qualifying match at 2025 Munich and entered main draw as LL, before beating No. 29 Shapovalov via RET in ATP Tour debut as the first 2008-born player to compete on the ATP Tour.

> Became first player born in 2008 to win an ATP Challenger Tour match at 2024 Augsburg CH (d. D. Dutra da Silva).

> Owns 31-20 record on ITF World Tennis Tour, reaching his lone final at 2024 M25 Santa Margherita di Pula.

> Son of a Chilean father and Lithuanian mother, he speaks English, German, Lithuanian, and Spanish.

NOTE: Dedura aims to be youngest Hamburg match winner since Nadal, 16, in 2003 (d. Moya, Mathieu, I. to Gaudio in 3R) and second-youngest German in Open Era behind Becker, 16, in 1984 (d. Casal, I. to Sundstrom). He is 1-1 vs. Top 50, both matches in Munich last month (d. No. 29 Shapovalov and I. to No. 50 Bergs).

Luciano Darderi | Age: 23 | World No. 46 | Career-High No. 32 | 2025: 11-11 (Marrakech Title) | Hamburg: 2-1 ('24 QF)

> Former Top 10 junior started 2024 season as No. 128, then broke into Top 100 in February, Top 50 in May and achieved career-high No. 32 in August.

> Captured his 1st ATP Tour title in Cordoba, defeating Bagnis in 3rd final between two qualifiers since the ATP Tour was established in 1990 and his 3rd ATP Tour event of career and won 2nd title at 2025 Marrakech.

- > Owns 90-60 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning titles at 2023 Todi, 2023 Lima-2 and 2024 Perugia.
- > Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings in February 2020 after earning 3 singles and 3 doubles titles to start the season.
- > Born in Argentina, started playing tennis at age 4 with his father Luciano Enrique, a former tennis player and current coach.

NOTE: Darder reached both his quarterfinals above ATP 250 level on German soil – at this venue last year (l. to Baez) and last month in Munich (l. to Shelton). He is on a 5-match winning streak in ATP Tour opening rounds.

Pedro Martinez | Age: 28 | World No. 49 | Career-High No. 36 | 2025: 11-14 (Buenos Aires SF) | Hamburg: 3-1 ('24 SF)
 > Broke into Top 50 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Santiago in February and Top 40 in May 2022, before achieving career-high No. 36 in February 2025.
 > Defeated No. 16 Bautista Agut at 2021 Kitzbuhel en route to 1st SF and final and No. 8 Ruud for biggest win of career en route to 2024 Estoril final.
 > Led all players by qualifying for 6 tour-level events in 2020, including Australian Open, Rio de Janeiro, Rome and Roland Garros.
 > Also in 2020, earned 1st tour-level win at Australian Open (d. Koepfer), posted 1st ATP Masters 1000 win at Rome (d. Querrey) and advanced to 1st Grand Slam 3R at Roland Garros.
 > Reached 8 of his 13 career Challenger finals on home clay in Spain, highlighted by 2020 Marbella, 2021 Seville, 2023 Maspalomas, 2024 Girona and 2024 Valencia titles.

NOTE: Martinez defeated Cerundolo in Hamburg last year to reach biggest semifinal of career (l. to Zverev). He is 2-12 vs. Top 20 on clay (4-27 overall), beating No. 16 Bautista Agut at 2021 Kitzbuhel and No. 8 Ruud at 2024 Estoril.

Francisco Cerundolo | Age: 26 | World No. 18 (Career-High) | 2025: 26-11 (Buenos Aires Final) | Hamburg: 5-3 ('22 SF)
 > Broke into Top 100 and achieved new career-high ranking 11 times in 2022 and achieved career-high No. 18 in May 2025 after equaling biggest win of career over No. 2 Zverev en route to ATP Masters 1000 Madrid SF.
 > Moved into Top 25 in July 2022 after defeating No. 5 Ruud en route to 1st ATP Tour title in Bastad and No. 8 Rublev en route to Hamburg SF in back-to-back weeks.
 > Won 2nd title at 2023 Eastbourne to be 1st Argentine ATP Tour champion on grass since Frana in 1995.
 > As World No. 103 at 2022 Miami, became lowest-ranked semi-finalist in 37-year tournament history and 1st player to reach SF in his ATP Masters 1000 main draw debut since Janowicz at 2012 Paris.
 > Father, Alejandro, also played pro tennis; younger brother, Juan Manuel, won 2021 Cordoba title; sister, Constanza, played for Argentine field hockey team that won gold medal at 2018 Youth Olympics.

NOTE: Cerundolo is 10-1 in opening rounds in 2025 after loss to Carballes Baena in 1st match of the year in Auckland and is on a 12-match winning streak vs. opponents ranked outside Top 20 since losing to No. 103 Djere in Santiago. He is making his 4th appearance in Hamburg, advancing to 2022 SF (l. to Musetti) and to QF last year (l. to Martinez).
