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LAVER CUP TALKING POINTS

- World No. 1 **Carlos Alcaraz** headlines the 2025 **Laver Cup** field, making his second appearance at the event after capturing 8 points for Team Europe last year and secure a 13-11 win over Team World by defeating Fritz in 12th and deciding tie. He leads the ATP Tour in wins (61) and titles (7) this season and arrives to San Francisco on a 13-match winning streak after capturing back-to-back titles at ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati and US Open.
- Joining Alcaraz in Team Europe, World No. 3 **Alexander Zverev** becomes the first man to make 6 appearances in Laver Cup history and was part of all 5 Team Europe victories at this event, including in front of his home crowd in Berlin last year. He is 45-17 this season, highlighted by Munich title and owns 7-2 singles record at Laver Cup.
- World No.12 **Casper Ruud** returns to Team Europe for fifth consecutive edition and just like in his debut at 2021 Boston, he opens Day 1 action vs. **Reilly Opelka**. Also on Team Europe, three debutants join the squad: World No. 11 **Holger Rune**, No. 17 **Jakub Mensik**, and No. 25 **Flavio Cobolli**, who was an alternate last year.
- No. 1 American **Taylor Fritz** leads the Team World, playing in his 5th Laver Cup, first on home soil, including being on roster for both Team World wins at 2022 London and 2023 Vancouver. Fritz owns most wins (27) on the tour since June and will team up with countryman Michelsen to take on Alcaraz and Mensik in doubles on Day 1.
- World No. 8 **Alex de Minaur** joins Fritz as only Top 20 players on Team World this year. Australian leads the ATP Tour in hard-court wins in 2025 (29), highlighted by Washington title in July and is playing in his 2nd Laver Cup after debuting at 2022 London, where he defeated Andy Murray to help Team World to 1st win over Team Europe.
- Argentina's **Francisco Cerundolo** and Brazil's **Joao Fonseca** represent the South American part of Team World, as Cerundolo joins the Laver Cup for the third straight year, while Fonseca makes his first appearance. 19-year-old Brazilian is the second youngest player to feature in a Laver Cup lineup in event history, only behind Shapovalov, 18, in 2017 and will attempt to become youngest man to win a match at this event. Americans 21-year-old **Alex Michelsen** and World No. 62 **Reilly Opelka** round out the Team World squad.
- Three singles and one doubles match are scheduled daily during the Laver Cup. One point is awarded per Day 1 win, two points per Day 2 win and three points per Day 3 win. The 12th and final match decided the Laver Cup in 2017, 2019 and 2024, with Team Europe winning on all three occasions.

TEAM EUROPE – PLAYER BIOS

Carlos Alcaraz

- > Youngest and first teenage World No. 1 and year-end No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), making record rise from No. 32 at end of 2021 to No. 1 at age 19 in September 2022.
- > Beat Ruud in 2022 US Open final for No. 1 ranking, becoming youngest men's champion at US Open since Sampras, 19, in 1990 and at any Grand Slam event since Nadal, 19, at 2005 Roland Garros.
- > Became youngest man to win a Grand Slam title on all three surfaces at 2024 Roland Garros and rallied from 2 sets down, saving 3 championship points vs. Sinner, to defend the title in 2025 in longest final in event's history (5H29M).
- > Defeated 7-time champion Djokovic in 2023 and 2024 Wimbledon finals to be 2nd man in Open Era to win 1st four Grand Slam finals and became youngest Olympic men's finalist since 1904, earning silver medal at Paris Olympics.
- > Six-time Grand Slam champion (6-1 in finals), youngest of four men to win multiple Grand Slam titles on clay, grass and hard courts (also Djokovic, Nadal, Wilander), and 8-time ATP Masters 1000 champion (8-1 in finals).
- > Youngest player to defeat both Nadal and Djokovic and 1st to do so at same clay-court event, beating them on back-to-back days en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2022 Madrid.

Alexander Zverev

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal.
- > Led ATP Tour with 6 titles in 2021 and leads all players born since 1990 with 24 career titles, defeating No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and 2021 Nitto ATP Finals championships.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.
- > Earned wins over 14-time champion Nadal en route to 2024 Roland Garros final and 10-time champion Djokovic via RET to reach 2025 Australian Open final.
- > Defeated Djokovic at 2017 Rome and Federer at 2017 Montreal for 1st and 2nd of his 7 ATP Masters 1000 titles.
- > Joined Murray and Thiem as 3rd player to defeat Djokovic on hard (3 times), Federer on grass (2016 Halle SF) and Nadal on clay (2 times).

Holger Rune

- > Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 100 in January 2022, Top 50 in May 2022 and Top 10 in November 2022, becoming highest-ranked Dane in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), peaking at No. 4 in August 2023.
- > Captured 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Paris title at age 19 by becoming 1st player since start of ATP Tour in 1990 to earn 5 Top-10 wins at an event other than Nitto ATP Finals.
- > From 2022 Paris to 2023 Rome, compiled an 18-5 record at ATP Masters 1000 level, also posting runner-up results in Monte-Carlo and Rome and lost to Draper in 1st ATP Masters 1000 final between men born in 2000s at 2025 Indian Wells.
- > Went on a 7-match winning streak vs. Top 5 opponents for 7-1 start to career vs. Top 5 (now 8-14), including wins over No. 1 Alcaraz at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Paris and No. 1 Djokovic at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome.
- > Ended 2022 season on 19-2 run (2-2 in finals) after going 1-6 from January-February and 0-7 from June-July.
- > Upset 2021 finalist Tsitsipas at 2022 Roland Garros to become 1st Danish man to reach QF in tournament history (since 1925) and to reach any Grand Slam QF in Open Era (since 1968).

Casper Ruud

- > Top-ranked Norwegian in history rose from No. 7 to career-high No. 2 after falling to Alcaraz in 2022 US Open final with No. 1 ranking at stake.
- > First Norwegian to win an ATP Tour title (13), an ATP Masters 1000 title (2025 Madrid), play at Nitto ATP Finals (2021 SF, 2022 final, 2024 SF), and reach a Grand Slam final (2022, 2023 Roland Garros, 2023 US Open).
- > Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.
- > Former No. 1 junior leads ATP Tour since start of 2020 season in clay-court wins (130), finals (17) and titles (12).
- > Defeated World No. 1 Djokovic for biggest win of career en route to 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo final.

Jakub Mensik

- > Former World No. 2 junior broke into Top 100 in February 2025 and earned career-high No. 16 in August 2025 soon after becoming fourth man in series history to win 1st ATP Tour title at Masters 1000 event in Miami.
- > Also in Miami, defeated No. 4 Fritz and 6-time champion No. 5 Djokovic to join Alcaraz as only teenagers to earn multiple Top 5 wins in one event this century and became 1st Czech ATP Masters 1000 champion since 2005.
- > Reached 1st ATP Tour QF, SF and final at 2024 Doha by defeating former champions Murray, No. 5 Rublev and Monfils, becoming 1st man born in 2005 or later to play in an ATP Tour final.
- > In tour-level debut, reached 3R at 2023 US Open as Q, becoming youngest man to reach Grand Slam 3R since Nadal at 2004 Aus. Open and youngest at US Open since Santoro in 1990, losing to Fritz on 18th birthday.
- > Also advanced to Grand Slam 3R at 2024 US Open, losing to Borges after holding 3 MPs, 2025 Australian Open, losing to Davidovich Fokina after squandering 2 MPs and 2025 Wimbledon.
- > Posted 85-28 record on ITF Juniors circuit, highlighted by reaching 2022 Australian Open boys' singles final.

Flavio Cobolli

- > Broke into Top 200 in January 2022 and Top 100 in October 2023, achieving career-high No. 17 in July 2025 after defeating former finalist Cilic to reach 1st Grand Slam QF at Wimbledon.
- > Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Baez to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Bucharest and captured biggest title of his career at 2025 Hamburg.
- > Earned wins over Shelton as No. 15 en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2024 Geneva and as No. 14 to reach 1st final at 2024 Washington and beat No. 9 Rune via RET for 1st Top 10 win at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.
- > Saved 3 MPs vs. Giron to win ATP Tour main draw debut 3-6 7-6 7-6 at 2021 Parma as 429th-ranked WC.
- > Peaked at No. 8 in juniors and ended junior career by winning 2020 Roland Garros boys' doubles title w/Stricker.

TEAM WORLD – PLAYER BIOS

Taylor Fritz

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 4 in November 2024 after becoming 1st American since Blake in 2006 to play in Nitto ATP Finals championship match and finish inside Top 5 of year-end rankings.
- > At 2024 US Open, became 1st American man to play in a Grand Slam final since 2009 after earning wins over No. 8 Ruud in 4R, No. 4 Zverev in QF and No. 20 Tiafoe in all-American semi-final.
- > Defeated No. 2 Nadal en route 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF after beating him in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final to become that event's 1st American men's champion since Agassi in 2001.
- > Reached 1st ATP Tour final at 2016 Memphis as 18-year-old WC, becoming youngest American finalist since start of ATP Tour in 1990.
- > Went on a 13-2 run on grass in 2025, capturing titles in Stuttgart and Eastbourne and advancing to Wimbledon SF.
- > Clinched United Cup titles for Team USA in 2023 and 2025, helped Team World capture Laver Cup in 2022 and 2023 and earned bronze medal at 2024 Paris Olympics in men's doubles w/Paul.

Alex de Minaur

- > Two-time Next Gen ATP Finals runner-up achieved career-high No. 6 in July 2024 before becoming 1st Australian to qualify for Nitto ATP Finals in singles since Hewitt in 2004.
- > Earned personal-best 47 victories in 2022 and 2024 and captured 10 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500 championships at 2023 and 2024 Acapulco and 2025 Washington, where he saved 3 championship points vs. Davidovich Fokina.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2020 US Open immediately after winning 1st ATP Tour doubles title at 2020 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati w/Carreno Busta in team debut and at same venue.
- > Six-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist, including at four consecutive events from 2024 Roland Garros to 2025 Australian Open and advanced to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF, SF and final at 2023 Toronto.
- > Playing for Australia, he went 6-1 in Davis Cup play during the 2022 season, leading Australia to its 1st final since 2003 and defeated No. 2 Nadal in 2023 and No. 1 Djokovic in 2024 at United Cup for biggest wins of career.
- > Son to a Uruguayan father and Spanish mother, splits time between Australia and Spain, and speaks English, Spanish and French.

Francisco Cerundolo

- > Broke into Top 100 and Top 50 in 2022, Top 20 in 2024 and achieved career-high No. 18 in May 2025 after defeating No. 2 Zverev en route to ATP Masters 1000 Madrid SF.
- > Moved into Top 25 in July 2022 after defeating No. 5 Ruud en route to 1st ATP Tour title in Bastad and No. 8 Rublev en route to Hamburg SF in back-to-back weeks.
- > Won 2nd title at 2023 Eastbourne to be 1st Argentine ATP Tour champion on grass since Frana in 1995.
- > As World No. 103 at 2022 Miami, became lowest-ranked semi-finalist in 37-year tournament history and 1st player to reach SF in his ATP Masters 1000 main draw debut since Janowicz at 2012 Paris.
- > Father, Alejandro, also played pro tennis; younger brother, Juan Manuel, won 2021 Cordoba title; sister, Constanza, played for Argentine field hockey team that won gold medal at 2018 Youth Olympics.

Alex Michelsen

- > Broke inside Top 50 in August 2024 and achieved career-high No. 30 in July 2025 after defeating former finalist Tsitsipas en route to 1st Grand Slam 4R at Australian Open.
- > Earned 1st ATP Tour win and reached 1st QF, SF and final at 2023 Newport, becoming youngest American ATP Tour finalist since Fritz at 2016 Memphis.
- > Also advanced to ATP Tour finals at 2024 Newport, where he held 1 MP vs. Giron, and 2024 Winston-Salem.
- > Defeated No. 9 de Minaur for biggest win of career in 2024 Los Cabos 2R, before squandering 3 MPs in QF against eventual champion Thompson and No. 10 Musetti en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2025 Toronto.
- > Also reached 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati doubles final w/McDonald after defeating him in qualifying.

Joao Fonseca

- > Reigning Next Gen ATP Finals champion became junior No. 1 in September 2023, broke into Top 100 of PIF ATP Rankings 16 months later and achieved career-high No. 42 in September 2025.
- > Captured 1st title at 2025 Buenos Aires at age 18, becoming youngest South American tour-level champion since Perez-Roldan in 1987 and youngest Brazilian champion in Open Era.
- > Earned biggest win of career over No. 9 Rublev in 2025 Australian Open 1R as Q, becoming youngest man to defeat a Top 10 player at Australian Open in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973).
- > Went 5-0 at 2024 Next Gen ATP Finals to join Alcaraz and Sinner as only 18-year-old champions in event history as well as becoming 1st South American champion at the event.
- > In his hometown of Rio de Janeiro, made ATP Tour debut in 2023 and earned 1st ATP Tour wins over No. 36 Fils and former champion Garin for his 1st ATP Tour QF in 2024, 10 years after watching Nadal win 2014 title as a fan.
- > Won 2023 US Open boys' singles event to become World No. 1 in junior rankings after reaching quarter-finals of Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon earlier in the season.

Reilly Opelka

- > Former Wimbledon junior champion became No. 1 American in June 2021 and achieved career-high No. 17 in February 2022 before undergoing hip surgery later that year.
- > Defeated Isner for 4th ATP 250 title on American soil at 2022 Houston after beating him 7-6(7) 7-6(22) en route to 2022 Dallas title, winning longest tiebreak in ATP Tour history (since 1990).
- > At 2020 Delray Beach, saved 1 MP vs. Raonic and defeated Nishioka on same day to win 2nd title.
- > At 2019 New York, saved 6 MPs and hit 43 aces vs. Isner in SF, then hit 43 more aces vs. Schnur in final to win 1st title.
- > Upset No. 3 Tsitsipas at 2021 Toronto for biggest win of career and to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 final and defeated No. 7 Djokovic en route to 2025 Brisbane final to break Serbian's 34-match winning streak vs. Americans.
