ROLEX SHANGHAI MASTERS TALKING POINTS

- Reigning champion Jannik Sinner returns to Rolex Shanghai Masters as he looks for 1st ATP Masters
 1000 title of the season after runner-up results in Rome and Cincinnati. Italian, who captured Australian Open
 and Wimbledon titles this season, plays Tien in Beijing final on Wednesday and could become the third man
 to do the Beijing-Shanghai double in the same season after Djokovic (2012-13, 2015) and Murray (2016).
- Four-time champion **Novak Djokovic** owns tournament records for most wins (39) and titles (4) in tournament history and will attempt to break the tie with **Roger Federer** for most titles on hard courts in history (71) by capturing his record-extending 41st ATP Masters 1000 title. Djokovic reached at least the quarter-final stage in all 10 previous appearances, including last year, before losing to Sinner in the championship match.
- Former finalist and World No. 3 Alexander Zverev is a 7-time ATP Masters 1000 champion and attempts to collect the title at 6th of 9 ATP Masters 1000 events. German reached 2019 final, losing to Daniil Medvedev. Medvedev won all of his 20 titles at different locations, seeking 1st ATP Tour title since 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome, while 2023 finalist Andrey Rublev looks for 2nd title of the year after his triumph in Doha.
- No. 1 American Taylor Fritz leads the ATP Tour in wins since June (32), winning titles in Stuttgart and
 Eastbourne and advancing to Tokyo final last week. Fritz leads 13 Americans in the draw, including World No.
 6 Ben Shelton, who became a 1st-time ATP Masters 1000 champion in Toronto in August and is playing in
 his first event since retiring due to shoulder injury at US Open.
- Shanghai-native Zhang Zhizhen advanced to 4R two years ago and will bid to become first Chinese quarter-finalist at this event. He is joined by Chinese No. 1 Buyunchaokete, who seeks first win on home soil this season after runs to Hangzhou and Beijing SFs last year. Wu Yibing, Shang Juncheng and Zhou Yi join the draw as wildcards a year after they became the first Chinese trio to advance to Shanghai 2R.
- Former World No. 3s **Stan Wawrinka** and **Marin Cilic** are both in Day 1 action, making their 12th appearance at the event, most in tournament history. Wawrinka bids to become the oldest man to win an ATP Masters 1000 match in series history (since 1990), while Cilic seeks first win since his run to Wimbledon 4R.

David Goffin | Age: 34 | World No. 87 | Career-High No. 7 | 2025: 9-19 (2 QFs) | Shanghai: 10-5 (2016, 2024 QF) > Earned career-high 59 wins in 2017, ending season at career-high No. 7 after defeating No. 1 Nadal and No. 2 Federer en route to Nitto ATP Finals championship match.

- > Became 6th and final player to beat Nadal and Federer at same event (also Davydenko, Del Potro, Djokovic, Murray and Nalbandian).
- > First Belgian to break into Top 10, qualify for Nitto ATP Finals, defeat World No. 1 and reach an ATP Masters 1000 final (2019 Cincinnati).
- > In 2022, earned 300th victory (d. Andujar in Marrakech 2R), captured 6th ATP Tour title (Marrakech) and posted 3rd win over World No. 1 (d. Alcaraz in Astana 1R).
- > Advanced to 4 Grand Slam QFs, most recently 2022 Wimbledon, and led Belgium to Davis Cup finals in 2015 and 2017.

NOTE: Goffin seeks 1st Top 50 win and first ATP Masters 1000 win since defeating No. 3 Alcaraz in Miami 2R in March. 34-year-old is 2-9 on tour-level since injuring his right foot vs. Muller in Madrid in May. Last year in Shanghai, he earned wins over No. 18 Musetti and No. 3 Zverev to reach most recent of his 13 career ATP Masters 1000 QFs.

Alexandre Muller | Age: 28 | World No. 38 (Career-High) | 2025: 21-22 (Hong Kong Title) | Shanghai: 2-2 (2024 3R) > Broke into Top 500 in 2016, Top 250 in 2019, Top 100 in 2023 and broke into Top 50 after advancing to biggest final of career in Rio de Janeiro in February 2025, before achieving career-high No. 38 in August that year.

- > Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Hong Kong, becoming 3rd man in Open Era to win a tour-level title by rallying from a set down in all matches played after Ashe at 1975 WCT Finals and Bublik at 2024 Montpellier.
- > Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Musetti en route to 1st SF and final at 2023 Marrakech and earned Top 10 wins over No. 6 Rublev at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Rome and No. 3 Zverev at 2025 Hamburg.
- > Made tour-level debut at 2017 Roland Garros as WC (I. to Monteiro) and won 1st tour-level match at 2021 Australian Open as LL, beating Londero in 1R.
- > Owns 140-123 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning 1st title at 2022 Blois after saving a MP in his 1R match.

NOTE: Muller is 6-7 at ATP Masters 1000 level this season, highlighted by runs to 3R of Madrid and Toronto. With a win, he would tie Fils for second-most wins among Frenchmen this season (22), only trailing Moutet (26).

Adrian Mannarino | Age: 37 | World No. 60 | Career-High No. 17 | 2025: 12-13 (2x 4R) | Shanghai: 1-5 (2023 2R) > Ended 12 straight years in Top 75 of PIF ATP Rankings (2013-24) and became the oldest man to break into Top 20 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 35, achieving career-high No. 17 in January 2024.

- > Captured 1st ATP Tour title in 7th final of career at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch, 2nd title in 11th final of career at 2022 Winston-Salem.
- > Posted personal-best 43 wins in 2023, highlighted by ATP Tour titles in Newport, Astana and Sofia.
- > Earned first Top 5 win over No. 5 Cilic to reach biggest final of career at 2017 Tokyo and biggest win of career over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch.
- > Reached Australian Open 4R in 2022 and 2024 and Wimbledon 4R in 2013, 2017 and 2018, before posting 1st Top 10 win at a Grand Slam over No. 6 Shelton to reach 2025 US Open 4R.

NOTE: Mannarino seeks second win in Shanghai after defeating No. 380 Tseng in 2023 2R (after 1R bye). Last week in Beijing, he qualified for main draw and defeated No. 16 Bublik in 1R before losing to No. 9 Musetti in 2R.

Matteo Berrettini | Age: 29 | World No. 56 | Career-High No. 6 | 2025: 14-13 (3 QFs) | Shanghai: 5-2 (2019 SF) > Achieved career-high No. 6 after reaching 2022 Australian Open SF, becoming 3rd-highest-ranked Italian since start of PIF ATP Rankings in 1973 (No. 1 Sinner in 2024, No. 4 Panatta in 1976).

- > At 2021 Wimbledon, became 1st Italian men's singles finalist in tournament history and 1st Italian Grand Slam men's singles finalist since Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros.
- > First Italian man to reach QFs of all 4 Grand Slam events and 1st to earn a win at Nitto ATP Finals (d. Thiem in 2019 RR).
- > Owns 42-12 record on grass with 4 of his 10 ATP Tour titles, including 2021 and 2022 London/Queen's Club to become 1st player in Open Era to win titles in each of his 1st 2 appearances at that event.
- > Defeated No. 3 Thiem en route to 2021 ATP Cup team final and No. 3 Ruud en route to 2023 United Cup team final before defeating No. 2 Zverev at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo for biggest win of career.

NOTE: Berrettini is making his third main draw appearance in Shanghai, advancing to his 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF in his debut in 2019 and advancing to 2R last year (I. to Rune). He is 8-5 at ATP Masters 1000 level this season, highlighted by Miami QF and bids to record 9 ATP Masters 1000 wins in a season for first time (8 in 2021, 2025).

Zhang Zhizhen | Age: 28 | World No. 370 | Career-High No. 31 | 2025: 5-11 (Marseille QF) | Shanghai: 3-3 (2023 4R) > Became 1st Chinese player in PIF ATP Rankings history to break into Top 100 in October 2022 and Top 50 in January 2024, earning career-high No. 31 in July 2024.

- > Won 3 consecutive matches in deciding set tiebreaks to be 1st Chinese ATP Masters 1000 quarter-finalist at 2023 Madrid and advanced to his 2nd ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2024 Rome.
- > During 2024 season, defeated countryman Bu to advance to 1st ATP Tour final in Hangzhou after earning silver medal in Paris Olympics mixed doubles with Wang Xinyu.
- > Qualified at 2021 Wimbledon and joined fellow qualifier Wu at 2022 US Open as 1st Chinese man to compete in main draw of both events in Open Era.
- > Equaled biggest win of career over No. 5 Medvedev en route to 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2024 Halle 2R and became 1st Chinese man in Open Era to reach SF on clay and grass in Open Era.

NOTE: Shanghai-native Zhang seeks second Top 50 win of the season after defeating No. 20 Hurkacz in Marseille 2R in February and aims to record first ATP Masters 1000 win since beating Mpetshi Perricard in Cincinnati 1R last year. In 2023, became 1st Chinese man to reach Shanghai 4R, before losing to eventual champion Hurkacz in 3 sets.

Sebastian Baez | Age: 24 | World No. 41 | Career-High No. 18 | 2025: 16-20 (Rio Title) | Shanghai: 1-2 (2023 3R) > Broke inside Top 20 in March 2024 after winning back-to-back ATP Tour titles in Rio de Janeiro and Santiago, then earned career-high No. 18 in June.

- > During 2023 season, went on a career-best 12-match winning streak, lifting titles in Kitzbuhel and Winston-Salem and reached 1st Grand Slam 3R at US Open.
- > Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Estoril, then earned 2nd title on home soil at 2023 Cordoba after entering tournament with 6 straight losses and 17 losses in previous 18 matches.
- > Broke into Top 300, 200 and 100 in 2021, posting 6-3 record in Challenger finals tied for 2nd-most titles in a season behind Griekspoor's 8 in 2021.
- > Became World No. 1 junior in March 2018 and went on to reach Roland Garros boys' singles final and win boys' doubles gold medal at Youth Olympics w/Diaz Acosta in his hometown of Buenos Aires.

NOTE: Baez is 1-6 at ATP Masters 1000 level this season, defeating Goffin in Cincinnati 1R for lone win. 24-year-old earned 14 of his 16 tour-level wins of 2025 on clay, highlighted by Rio title and finals in Santiago and Bucharest.

Fabian Marozsan (HUN) vs [WC] Stan Wawrinka (SUI)

Fabian Marozsan | Age: 25 | World No. 57 | Career-High No. 36 | 2025: 23-23 (Munich SF) | Shanghai: 4-1 (2023 QF) > Broke into Top 200 in August 2022, Top 100 in June 2023 and earned career-high No. 36 in May 2024, becoming fourth Hungarian to break into Top 50 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973).

- > In ATP Tour debut, defeated No. 2 Alcaraz for biggest win of career en route to 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome 4R as Q and reached 1st QF at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai (d. No. 9 Ruud in 4R).
- > Upset No. 7 Rune in 2R and No. 10 de Minaur in 4R en route to 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Miami QF.
- > Earned 1st Grand Slam main draw win at 2023 US Open (d. Gasquet) and reached 3R at 2024 and 2025 Australian Open and advanced to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2025 Munich after 0-6 start in ATP Tour QFs.
- > Owns 55-30 Challenger record (3-1 in finals), winning titles at 2022 Banja Luka, 2023 Antalya and 2023 Perugia and losing to countryman Fucsovics in 2022 Bratislava-2 final.

NOTE: Marozsan aims to record personal-best 24th win in a season (23 in 2024, 2025). 25-year-old owns 23-15 ATP Masters 1000 career record (.605) compared to 58-60 record overall on tour-level (.492), including run to his 1st ATP Tour QF in Shanghai two years ago to become 1st Hungarian ATP Masters 1000 quarter-finalist in series history.

Stan Wawrinka | Age: 40 | World No. 129 | Career-High No. 3 | 2025: 2-10 (2x 2R) | Shanghai: 13-11 ('13, '15 QF) > Achieved career-high No. 3 in 2014 and ended 2014-16 at No. 4 before undergoing 2 left knee surgeries in 2017 and 2 left foot surgeries in 2021.

- > Boasts 5 wins over World No. 1 at Grand Slams, including finals of 2014 Australian Open (d. Nadal), 2015 Roland Garros (d. Djokovic) and 2016 US Open (d. Djokovic).
- > One of 3 players to defeat Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal at Grand Slams (also Berdych, Tsonga).
- > Owns 16 singles titles with 11 straight wins in finals from 2014-16, defeating fellow Swiss Federer for lone ATP Masters 1000 title at 2014 Monte-Carlo.
- > Won 2008 Beijing Olympics doubles gold medal w/Federer and helped Switzerland capture 2014 Davis Cup.
