Arthur Rinderknech (FRA) vs [Q] Marton Fucsovics (HUN) First Tour-Level Meeting

21 Rotterdam Q (Netherlands) Hard Q1 Marton Fucsovics 6-2 6-4

Arthur Rinderknech | Age: 29 | World No. 81 | Career-High No. 42 | 2025: 5-14 (5x 2R) | Stuttgart: 3-2 ('22, '24-'25 2R)
> Broke into Top 50 in January 2022 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at Adelaide-2, then became No. 1 Frenchman and achieved career-high No. 42 in October 2022.

> Playing on indoor hard courts in fall 2022, saved 1 MP vs. No. 17 Schwartzman in Tel Aviv 2R, 9 MPs vs. No. 15 Carreno Busta in Gijon QF and 2 MPs vs. No. 16 Cilic in Basel 1R.

> In 2021, advanced to Kitzbuhel SF, reached 6 other ATP Tour QFs, and earned 1st 18 tour-level wins of career.

> Captured Challenger titles at 2020 Rennes, 2020 Calgary, 2021 Istanbul as Q, 2022 Poznan, 2023 Zug and 2024 Lille.

> Five-time All-American at Texas A&M University (3 singles, 2 doubles), where he graduated from Mays Business School in 2018.

NOTE: Rinderknech seeks his 20th ATP Tour QF (5-13 + 1 W/O loss), 2nd on grass after 2023 Mallorca (l. to eventual champion Eubanks), and 1st since Atlanta last July (l. to Nishioka in SF). He looks to win consecutive matches for the first time since reaching ATP Masters 1000 Paris 3R in October (d. Machac and Michelsen).

Marton Fucsovics | Age: 33 | World No. 112 | Career-High No. 31 | 2025: 8-4 (Bucharest SF) | Stuttgart: 9-6 ('23 SF)

> Achieved career-high No. 31 in 2019 and became highest-ranked Hungarian since No. 29 Taroczy in 1983.

> Defeated 2-time defending champion Wawrinka en route to 1st ATP Tour title at 2018 Geneva, becoming 1st Hungarian champion since Taroczy at 1982 Hilversum and won 2nd title at 2024 Bucharest.

> Rallied for 5-set win over No. 7 Rublev at 2021 Wimbledon to become 1st men's quarter-finalist from Hungary at that event since Asboth in 1948.

> Advanced to Grand Slam 4R on 3 other occasions, beating No. 5 Medvedev en route to 2020 Roland Garros 4R and to end 0-14 start to career vs. Top 10.

> Became World No. 1 junior after capturing 2010 Wimbledon boys' singles title without dropping a set.

NOTE: Fucsovics aims to reach his 4th ATP Tour grass-court QF, all in Stuttgart (2019, 2022 QF, 2023 SF). He erased a 3-5 deficit in the deciding set vs. Zverev in Q1 this week and reached SF as Q in his last appearance at this venue two years ago (d. No. 8 Fritz in QF, l. to No. 12 Tiafoe).

[3] Ben Shelton (USA) vs [Q] Pierre-Hugues Herbert (FRA) First Meeting

Ben Shelton | Age: 22 | World No. 12 (Career-High) | 2025: 17-11 (Munich Final) | Stuttgart: 0-1 (2024 2R)

> Broke into Top 200 in August 2022, Top 100 in November 2022 and Top 20 in September 2023, achieving career-high No. 12 in March 2025 after advancing to Australian Open SF.

> Defeated countrymen Paul and Tiafoe at 2023 US Open to become youngest American man in US Open SF since Chang, 20, in 1992 and beat No. 4 Sinner for 1st of 3 ATP Masters 1000 QFs at 2023 Shanghai.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2023 Tokyo, joining Bryan Shelton as 4th father-son duo to win a tour-level championship in Open Era (Phil & Taylor Dent, Ramanathan & Ramesh Krishnan, Petr & Sebastian Korda).

> Advanced to 2023 Australian Open QF at age 20 and on his 1st trip outside USA, becoming youngest American man in Aus. Open QF since Giannalva Jr., 19, in 1982, and in Grand Slam QF since Roddick, 20, at 2002 US Open.

> Posted 65-10 singles record in 2 seasons for University of Florida, clinching 2021 NCAA team title and 2022 NCAA singles title while being coached by his father Bryan, a former World No. 55.

NOTE: Shelton plays first match on grass since reaching Wimbledon 4R last year (won 3 5-set matches, l. to Sinner). He lost to No. 101 Duckworth in 2024 2R and would move up to No. 10 on PIF ATP Live Rankings with a 2R win.

Pierre-Hugues Herbert | Age: 34 | World No. 132 | Career-High No. 36 | 2025: 4-3 (4x 2R) | Stuttgart: 1-3 (2025 2R)
 > Former Top-40 singles player defeated No. 5 Tsitsipas for biggest win of career en route to 4th ATP Tour singles final at 2021 Marseille.
 > Formed strong doubles team with countryman Mahut, who is 9 years older, that led to his career-high No. 2 doubles ranking in 2016.
 > One of 8 teams to complete career Grand Slam in doubles, winning titles at 2015 US Open, 2016 Wimbledon, 2018 Roland Garros, 2019 Australian Open and 2021 Roland Garros.
 > Captured Nitto ATP Finals doubles titles in 2019 and 2021 after squandering championship point in 2018 and qualifying in 2015-17.
 > Frenchmen boast 21-8 team record in tour-level doubles finals, including 7-2 at ATP Masters 1000s with 7 different titles.

NOTE: Herbert seeks 15th ATP Tour QF (8-6), 1st since 2023 Metz (l. to Shevchenko in SF) and 1st on grass since 2019 Halle (l. to No. 3 Federer in SF). He is 10-40 vs. Top 20, looking for first win since defeating No. 5 Tsitsipas in 2021 Marseille SF (0-6 since), and aims to earn biggest grass-court win of career (3-2 vs. Top 20 on the surface).

Quentin Halys | Age: 28 | World No. 47 (Career-High) | 2025: 10-11 (Dubai SF) | Stuttgart: 1-0 (2025 2R)
 > Former World No. 3 junior earned 1st ranking point at age 15 in 2012, entered Top 200 in 2015, broke into Top 100 in 2022 and achieved career-high No. 50 in May 2025 soon after reaching Dubai SF as Q and Roland Garros 3R.
 > As World No. 220, advanced to 3R of 2024 Wimbledon as Q and came from qualifying to reach 1st ATP Tour final in Gstaad the following week.
 > Saved 3 MPs for 1st Top 20 win vs. No. 18 de Minaur en route to 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R and earned biggest win of career over No. 9 Rublev at 2025 Dubai for 1st Top 10 win in 11th attempt.
 > Posted 43-10 Challenger record in 2022 (3-4 in finals), winning titles at Pau, Lille and Ismaning.
 > Defeated future World No. 3 Tsitsipas en route to 2nd of 7 career Challenger titles at 2018 Quimper.
 > Went 129-46 in singles and 83-35 in doubles on ITF Junior Circuit, ending junior career with run to 2014 US Open boys' singles final after winning 2014 Roland Garros boys' doubles title with countryman Bonzi.

NOTE: Halys seeks 7th ATP Tour QF (3-3), 1st on grass. He is 1-13 vs. Top 10, including loss to then-No. 4 Fritz in Geneva 2R last month, and posted lone Top 10 win vs. No. 9 Rublev in Dubai 1R this February.

Taylor Fritz | Age: 27 | World No. 7 | Career-High No. 4 | 2025: 17-10 (Miami SF) | Stuttgart: 2-3 (2023 QF)

> Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 4 in November 2024 after becoming 1st American man since Blake in 2006 to play in Nitto ATP Finals championship match and finish inside Top 5 of year-end rankings.
 > At 2024 US Open, became 1st American man to play in a Grand Slam final since 2009 after earning wins over No. 8 Ruud in 4R, No. 4 Zverev in QF and No. 20 Tiafoe in all-American semi-final.
 > Defeated No. 2 Nadal en route 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF after beating him in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final to become that event's 1st American men's champion since Agassi in 2001.
 > Reached 1st ATP Tour final at 2016 Memphis as 18-year-old WC, becoming youngest American finalist since start of ATP Tour in 1990.
 > Clinched inaugural United Cup for Team USA in 2023, helped Team World capture Laver Cup in 2022 and 2023 and earned bronze medal at 2024 Paris Olympics in men's doubles w/Paul.

NOTE: Fritz makes his 4th main draw appearance in Stuttgart, losing in 3 sets to No. 3 Federer in 2016 2R in tournament debut. He went 10-2 on grass in 2024, highlighted by Eastbourne title and Wimbledon QF (l. to Musetti).

Jan-Lennard Struff | Age: 35 | World No. 103 | Career-High No. 21 | 2025: 5-13 (Marseille QF) | Stuttgart: 13-8 ('23 Final)
 > Achieved career-high No. 21 in June 2023 after advancing to 3rd ATP Tour final at 2023 Stuttgart.
 > Entered 2023 Madrid as LL, defeating No. 5 Tsitsipas in QF and Karatsev in SF, after losing to him in qualifying, to become 1st lucky loser to reach an ATP Masters 1000 final in series history (since 1990).
 > On home soil, advanced to 1st ATP Tour singles final at 2021 Munich, earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Medvedev in 2021 Halle 1R and became 3rd oldest first-time ATP Tour champion at 2024 Munich.
 > Posted personal-best 35 victories in 2019, highlighted by 1st Grand Slam 4R appearance at Roland Garros.
 > In 2018, became 1st player in Open Era to rally from 2 sets down in Wimbledon 1R and 2R (d. L. Mayer and Karlovic).
 > Lost in qualifying at 20 tour-level events before qualifying for 1st time at 2013 Roland Garros and earning 1st tour-level win at 2013 Wimbledon as Q (d. Kavcic).

NOTE: Struff aims to reach his 5th ATP Tour QF on grass, all on home soil (2019, 2023-24 Stuttgart, 2024 Halle) and looks to win consecutive matches for first time since reaching Marseille QF in February (l. to Medvedev). He seeks 2nd Top 50 win of the season (1-8) after defeating No. 41 Arnaldi in 1R on Monday.

Jiri Lehecka | Age: 23 | World No. 33 | Career-High No. 22 | 2025: 19-11 (Brisbane Title) | Stuttgart: 2-2 ('23, '25 2R)
> Achieved career-high No. 22 in February 2025 after 8-0 start to year after Brisbane title and run to Australian Open 4R.

> Defeated No. 5 Rublev to reach 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2023 Doha and en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2024 Indian Wells before defeating No. 4 Medvedev via RET to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF at 2024 Madrid.

> Earned wins over No. 12 Norrie and No. 7 Auger-Aliassime en route to 2023 Australian Open QF and won 1st ATP Tour title at 2024 Adelaide.

> Reached 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 Rotterdam as Q after defeating No. 12 Shapovalov in 1R for 1st ATP Tour win.

> Celebrated 21st birthday during 2022 Next Gen ATP Finals and finished as runner-up.

> Former World No. 10 junior won 2019 Wimbledon boys' doubles title with countryman Forejtek.

NOTE: Lehecka looks to advance to his 19th tour-level quarter-final (9-9), 1st on grass. He would be 2nd Czech man to earn 20 tour-level wins this year after Mensik (20) and 2nd Czech to advance to ATP Tour grass-court QF this decade after Mensik at Mallorca last June (l. to Tabilo).
