#### **DAY 6 TALKING POINTS**

- Third-round play in the top half of the draw on Friday is headlined by World No. 1 and top seed Carlos Alcaraz, No. 3 Novak Djokovic, No. 5 Stefanos Tsitsipas and No. 7 Andrey Rublev. In addition, No. 11 Karen Khachanov, No. 13 Hubert Hurkacz and No. 14 Cameron Norrie are among the Top 16 seeds in action.
- In the third match on Court Philippe Chatrier, **Djokovic** brings a 2-1 head-to-head lead against No. 29 seed **Alejandro Davidovich Fokina**, who won their last meeting at ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo in April 2022. Djokovic is trying to reach the fourth round at Roland Garros for the 14th year in a row and 21st Grand Slam tournament played overall (since 2R at '17 Australian Open).
- Davidovich Fokina is 4-19 lifetime vs. Top 10 opponents and three of his wins have come on clay, the last coming at ATP Masters 1000 Madrid over No. 7 Rune last month. The 23-year-old Spaniard is trying to reach the fourth round at Roland Garros for the second time in three years (QF in 2021).
- In the evening session, **Alcaraz** and **Denis Shapovalov** square off for the first time. Alcaraz, who reached the quarter-finals last year, comes in 32-3 on the season with four titles and 22-2 on clay. The 20-year-old Spaniard is 21-2 lifetime against opponents ranked outside the Top 20 in Grand Slam events. Shapovalov is ranked No. 32.
- The 24-year-old Canadian is 11-29 against Top 10 opponents (1-6 on clay, d. No. 4 Nadal in 2022 Rome) and 3-4 in Grand Slam play with his last win over No. 3 Zverev in 2022 Aus. Open 4R. He is 0-8 vs. World No. 1 players.
- On Court Suzanne Lenglen, **Rublev** and **Lorenzo Sonego** meet for the third time (tied 1-1). Rublev, who is 14-4 against Italians since 2020 (with 3 losses to Sinner), is trying to reach the 4R for the third time in four years (QF in 2020 and 2022). Sonego is 5-18 against Top 10 opponents (2-7 on clay, defeating No. 4 Thiem, No. 7 Rublev at 2021 Rome) and he's looking for his first Top 10 win in Grand Slam play (0-4). He is one of three Italians in action.
- In the last match on, **Tsitsipas** takes a 4-2 record (2-0 on clay) against **Diego Schwartzman**, who is one of four Argentines left in the third round. Tsitsipas is trying to reach the fourth round for the fifth straight year. Schwartzman is 2-6 against Top 10 opponents at Roland Garros with wins over No. 7 Anderson in 2018 4R and No. 3 Thiem in 2020 QF, which was also his last Top 5 win on clay. He is trying to reach 4R for 4th year in a row.
- On Court Simonne Mathieu, Khachanov looks to reach the fourth round in Paris for the sixth time in seven years
  as he plays [WC] Thanasi Kokkinakis. The Aussie is appearing in his second career third round in a Grand Slam
  tournament (2015 Roland Garros). In the next match on, Lorenzo Musetti, who reached the fourth round two
  years ago, meets Norrie. The British No. 1 is trying to reach the 4R for the third time in his last four Slam events.

#### **NOVAK DJOKOVIC**

#### **Roland Garros Stats**

- > The 36-year-old Serbian reached 3R at Roland Garros for 18th consecutive time with straight-sets wins over Kovacevic in 1R and Fucsovics in 2R. Looking to reach fourth round for the 14th year in a row.
- > Has advanced to quarter-finals or better every year since 2010 and overall 16 of 18 years (except 2005-2R, 2009-3R).
- > He is not the top-seeded player in a Roland Garros draw for the time since 2018 and his 87 wins is the 2nd-most at Roland Garros, only behind Nadal (112).
- > Captured titles in 2016 (d. Murray) and 2021 (d. Tsitsipas) and reached finals in 2012, 2014-15 (l. to Wawrinka) and 2020. His other three runner-up finishes came against Nadal.

- > Record-tying 6-time Nitto ATP Finals champion owns ATP/WTA record for most weeks at No. 1 (387), as well as Pepperstone ATP Rankings records for most years ended at No. 1 (7). Has finished in Top 3 for 10 consecutive years from 2007-2016 and overall in Top 5 for 15 of 16 years (except 2017 at No. 12).
- > Owns record for most wins vs. Top 10 (243) and won a personal-best 31 Top 10 matches in 2015.
- > Tied with Nadal for most Grand Slam men's singles titles in history (22), including record 10 Australian Open titles, and is 1 of 3 men to hold all 4 Grand Slam championships at same time (also Budge, Laver).
- > Only player to win all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events since start of series in 1990, doing so multiple times for a record total of 38 titles.
- > Owns 4th-most men's singles titles in Open Era (93) and 5th-most men's singles wins in Open Era (1,053).
- > Boasts winning records against both Federer (27-23) and Nadal (30-29), as well as win streaks of ATP Tour-record 43 matches (2010-11), ATP Masters 1000-record 31 matches (2011), Open Era-record 30 Grand Slam matches (2015-16)



#### ALEJANDRO DAVIDOVICH FOKINA

#### **Roland Garros Stats**

- > Spaniard defeated the only two teenagers in the Top 100, Frenchmen 18-year-old No. 63 Arthur Fils in 1R and 19-year-old No. 82 Luca Van Assche in front of their home crowd, en route to second 3R appearance at the event.
- > He is playing in his 5th consecutive Roland Garros after entering the draw as a lucky loser in his Grand Slam main draw debut in 2019 (I. to Thompson in 1R).
- > Reached 1st career Grand Slam quarter-final in 2021, beating No. 16 Ruud in 3R for first Top 20 win at a Grand Slam level in a 4h35m marathon before losing to Zverev in QF.
- > Lost to Griekspoor in first round last year as the No. 25 seed, the highest he's been seeded in a Grand Slam tournament in his career.

# **Career Highlights**

- > Achieved career-high ranking of No. 24 on 3 April 2023 after improving year-end ranking for a 7th consecutive year in 2022, finishing at No. 31.
- > In April 2022 beat World No. 1 Djokovic en route to 1st ATP final at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo (I. to Tsitsipas)
- > Broke Djokovic 9 times in Monte Carlo 2R win, setting record for most breaks of Djokovic in a best-of-3-set match.
- > Advanced to 1st Grand Slam QF at 2021 Roland Garros and 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2021 Monte Carlo, highlighted by 5-set win over Ruud in Roland Garros 3R.
- > Ended junior career as World No. 2 after winning Wimbledon boys' singles title and posting 20-1 record in 2017.
- > Owns 2 cats and launched Adoptas.org in 2021, a pet adoption platform that aims to connect anyone looking to adopt or foster a pet with shelters and rescues across Spain.

# **CARLOS ALCARAZ**

- > The 20-year-old Spaniard defeated [Q] Cobolli 6-0 6-2 7-5 to extend his first round record to 9-0 in Grand Slam tournaments and Daniel in 4 sets in his second round match.
- > He is the top seed at a Grand Slam tournament for the first time and is the youngest No. 1 seed at Roland Garros since Bjorn Borg (19) in 1976. He turned 20 during the tournament. Borg was also the top seed in 1975.
- > Last year as a 19-year-old, he became youngest men's player to reach Roland Garros QF since Djokovic (19) in 2006. The Spaniard lost to Zverev in 4 sets in QF.
- > Qualified in 2021 en route to Roland Garros 3R at age 18 to become youngest men's player to reach 3R since Andrei Medvedev (17) in 1992.



- > Youngest and first teenage World No. 1 and year-end No. 1 in Pepperstone ATP Rankings history (since 1973), making record rise from No. 32 at end of 2021 to No. 1 at age 19 in September 2022, then remaining atop rankings through end of season, earning 22 weeks overall at No. 1. At start of Roland Garros (29 May) he will have held No. 1 for 24 weeks.
- > Beat Ruud in 2022 US Open final for No. 1 ranking, becoming youngest men's champion at US Open since Sampras, 19, in 1990 and at any Grand Slam event since Nadal, 19, at 2005 Roland Garros.
- > Became youngest ATP 500 champion at 2022 Rio de Janeiro (165 events since 2009) and 3rd-youngest ATP Masters 1000 champion at 2022 Miami (294 events since 1990).
- > Captured 9 titles as a teenager (9-3 in finals), behind Borg (17), Nadal (16), Wilander (14), Becker (12) and Agassi (10) and 6th-youngest to win 10 tour-level titles behind: Wilander, Borg, Nadal, Becker and Agassi.
- > Improved to 4-0 in ATP Masters 1000 finals with repeat title at 2023 Madrid, 2nd-best start in Masters 1000 finals only behind Michael Chang and Jim Courier (both 5-0).
- > Youngest player to defeat both Nadal and Djokovic and 1st to do so at same clay-court event, beating them on back-to-back days en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2022 Madrid.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2021 US Open, becoming youngest men's quarter-finalist at US Open since Koch, 18, in 1963 (Amateur Era) and at any Grand Slam since Chang, 18, at 1990 Roland Garros.

# **DENIS SHAPOVALOV**

#### **Roland Garros Stats**

- > Canadian left-hander reached his first Roland Garros third round in fifth appearance at the event.
- > Defeated Nakashima in 1R for his 11th career fifth-set win and Arnaldi in 2R in four sets.
- > His previous best result was a second-round appearance in 2018 (I. to Marterer) and 2020 (I. to Carballes Baena).
- > Reached the semi-finals at the 2016 Roland Garros boys' singles event, beating Kecmanovic in 3R and Tsitsipas in QF, before losing to eventual champion Blancaneaux. After went on a 12-match winning streak on grass to capture 2 titles, including Wimbledon boys' singles to finish his junior career.
- > He is 0-8 vs. World No. 1s in his career and 1-4 vs. Top-5 players in Grand Slam events (d. No. 3 Zverev at 2022 Australian Open 4R).
- > Roland Garros is the only Grand Slam event he has not reached the quarter-final stage (2022 Australian Open QF, 2021 Wimbledon SF, 2020 US Open QF).

#### **Career Highlights**

- > After becoming 1st Canadian US Open men's singles quarter-finalist in 2020, became 2nd of 3 Canadian men (Raonic, Auger-Aliassime) to rank in Top 10 on 21 September 2020.
- > Defeated 2-time champion Murray and earned 5-set wins over Kohlschreiber and Khachanov en route to 1st Grand Slam SF at 2021 Wimbledon (I. to No. 1 Djokovic).
- > Reached 2019 Paris final and 4 other ATP Masters 1000 SFs, including 2017 Montreal, where he upset No. 2 Nadal and became youngest semi-finalist in series history at age 18 (since 1990).
- > Beat Carreno Busta to begin 2022 ATP Cup final and Kokkinakis to begin 2022 Davis Cup final, helping Canada sweep both team titles.
- > Ended junior career with 2016 Wimbledon boys' singles title, then broke into Top 50 of Pepperstone ATP Rankings less than 15 months later.

#### **LORENZO SONEGO**

#### **Roland Garros Stats**

- > The 28-year-old Italian reached the Roland Garros third ro for the third time in five appearances, defeating No. 30 seed Shelton in 1R before ousting No. 1 Frenchman Humbert in 2R.
- > He aims to reach 4R at a Grand Slam tournament for the third time in 19th event, previously reaching this round at 2020 Roland Garros and 2021 Wimbledon.
- > He is 0-6 vs. Top 20 players in Grand Slam events and 5-18 vs. Top 10 players overall, seeking first Top 10 win on clay since defeating No. 4 Thiem and No. 7 Rublev in back-to-back matches to reach 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Rome SF.
- > Held a 2-1 set lead over eventual finalist No. 8 Casper Ruud in third round last year, before losing 6-3 in the fifth set.

# **Career Highlights**

- > Earned personal-best 30 wins and achieved career-high No. 21 in 2021, sweeping Cagliari titles to become 1st Italian champion on home soil in singles since 2006 and in doubles since 2005 (w/Vavassori).
- > Broke into Top 50 after saving championship point vs. Kecmanovic to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Antalya.
- > Did not drop a set en route to 3rd singles title of career at 2022 Metz, including wins over former champions Simon and Hurkacz.
- > Upset No. 1 Djokovic 6-2 6-1 en route to 2020 Vienna final, becoming 1st lucky loser to defeat Djokovic and equaling fewest games ever conceded to Djokovic in a match.
- > Saved 1 MP vs. Thiem en route to 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Rome SF, becoming 1st Italian semi-finalist at Foro Italico since 2007 and 2nd since 1978.

#### ANDREY RUBLEV

- > Has advanced to quarter-finals in 2 of past 3 years, falling in a 5th set TB to Cilic last year and to No. 6 Tsitsipas in 2020
- > Reached the third round by defeating Djere in 1R and Moutet in 2R, both in four sets.
- > He is 6-1 vs. Italians in Grand Slam events, losing to No. 25 Berrettini at 2019 US Open 4R for lone loss.
- > Three of his four losses in Paris have been in 5-sets: 2017 1R as LL (I. to Schwartzman) and 2021 1R (I. to Struff).
- > Rallied from 2 sets down for only time in career to defeat Querrey in 1R in 2020.
- > Captured 2014 Roland Garros boys' singles title (d. Munar) and reached boys' doubles SF w/Kozlov (l. to Bonzi/Halys).





- > Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 20 in January 2020, Top 10 in October 2020 and Top 5 in September 2021.
- > Came back from a set down in both SF (d. Fritz) and final (d. Rune) for the first time in his career at 2023 Monte Carlo to earn 1st ATP Masters 1000 title.
- > Defeated No. 3 Nadal at 2021 Monte Carlo and No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Cincinnati en route to ATP Masters 1000 finals, then beat No. 1 Djokovic for 11th of 13 ATP Tour titles at 2022 Belgrade.
- > Led tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.
- > Seven-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist reached 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF and won gold medal in All-ROC mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).
- > Went 9-1 in singles and 4-1 in doubles at team events during 2021 season, sweeping titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

#### **DIEGO SCHWARTZMAN**

- > The Argentine rallied from 2 sets down for the third time in his career to defeat No. 32 seed Zapata Miralles in 1R, before recording a straight-sets win over Borges in 2R.
- > Also battled back from 2 sets down to defeat Munar in 2022 2R and No. 7 Anderson in 2018 4R to reach 1st of 3 Roland Garros quarter-finals in his career.
- > Upset World No. 3 Thiem in 2020 quarter-finals to reach 1st Grand Slam semi-final before losing to No. 2 Nadal.
- > Also lost to 14-time champion Nadal in 2018 and 2021 Roland Garros QF.
- > Owns 1-10 record vs. Top-5 players at Grand Slam tournaments (1-6 at Roland Garros).
- > Qualified at 2014 Roland Garros and defeated Elias in Grand Slam main draw debut (I. to No. 4 Federer in 2R).



- > More than 2 years after rising to No. 11, broke into Top 10 at career-high No. 8 in 2020 and qualified for Nitto ATP Finals. Finished in Top 20 from 2018-2021 with year-end best No. 9 in 2020 and won a personal-best 40 matches in 2019.
- > Advanced to Grand Slam QF-or-better on 5 occasions, highlighted by win over No. 3 Thiem in 5:08 to reach 2020 Roland Garros SF (I. to Nadal).
- > Earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Nadal en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at 2020 Rome, having entered 0-9 vs. Nadal and 0-22 vs. Top 5.
- > Shortest Top-8 player at 1.70m (5'7") since Solomon in 1981 at 1.68m (5'6"), Grand Slam semi-finalist since Solomon at 1980 Roland Garros, and ATP Masters 1000 finalist in series history (since 1990).
- > Snapped 5-match losing streak with 5 straight wins at 2016 Istanbul, rallying from a set and 5-2 down vs. Dimitrov to capture 1st of 4 ATP Tour titles in 1st of 14 finals.
- > Dropped out of Top 50 on 24 April 2023 at No. 72 for 1st time since 20 February 2017.

#### STEFANOS TSITSIPAS

#### **Roland Garros Stats**

- > Former finalist is making his 7th straight Roland Garros appearance (19-6) and from 2017-2021 he improved his result every year since making debut as a qualifier ranked No. 205 in 2017 (I. to Karlovic in 1R). Last year lost in 4R to Rune.
