NITTO ATP FINALS TALKING POINTS

- The final **Nitto ATP Finals** semi-final spot is up for grabs on Friday between No. 2 **Carlos Alcaraz** and No. 7 **Alexander Zverev**, the 2018 and 2021 champion. No. 3 **Daniil Medvedev** is 2-0 in Red Group play so far and has already qualified for the semi-finals. He faces Alcaraz in the day session and in the evening session Zverev takes on No. 5 **Andrey Rublev**, who is 0-2 this week.
- In the opening singles day session match, **Alcaraz** and **Medvedev** square off for the fifth time (tied 2-2) in their **Lexus ATP Head2Head**. Alcaraz won in this year's ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final and in the Wimbledon semi-finals before Medvedev won the last meeting in the US Open semi-finals.
- Alcaraz earned his personal-best 10th Top 10 win of the season over Rublev on Wednesday and owns a 10-5 record against Top 10 opponents. Medvedev has not dropped a set (4-0) en route to his third Nitto ATP Finals semi-final in the last four years. He leads the ATP Tour this season with 66 overall wins and 49 on hard courts.
- Here are the Red Group qualifying semi-final scenarios going into Friday's play:
 - 1) Regardless of score, if **ALCARAZ** defeats **MEDVEDEV** and **RUBLEV** defeats **ZVEREV**, then **ALCARAZ** wins the group and **MEDVEDEV** qualifies 2nd.
 - 2) Regardless of score, if **MEDVEDEV** defeats **ALCARAZ** and **RUBLEV** defeats **ZVEREV**, then **MEDVEDEV** wins the group and **ALCARAZ** qualifies 2nd.
 - 3) Regardless of score, if **MEDVEDEV** defeats **ALCARAZ** and **ZVEREV** defeats **RUBLEV**, then **MEDVEDEV** wins the group and **ZVEREV** qualifies 2nd.
 - 4) **ALCARAZ** defeats **MEDVEDEV** in 2 sets and **ZVEREV** defeats **RUBLEV** in 2 sets, then **ALCARAZ** wins the group and **MEDVEDEV** qualifies 2nd.
 - 5) **ALCARAZ** defeats **MEDVEDEV** in 2 sets and **ZVEREV** defeats **RUBLEV** in 3 sets, then **ALCARAZ** wins the group and **MEDVEDEV** qualifies 2nd.
 - 6) **ALCARAZ** defeats **MEDVEDEV** in 3 sets and **ZVEREV** defeats **RUBLEV** in 2 sets, then **MEDVEDEV** wins the group and **ALCARAZ** qualifies 2nd.
 - 7) **ALCARAZ** defeats **MEDVEDEV** in 3 sets and **ZVEREV** defeats **RUBLEV** in 3 sets, then **MEDVEDEV** wins the group and **ALCARAZ** qualifies 2nd.
- In the evening session, **Zverev** comes in with a 5-3 **Lexus ATP Head2Head** record against **Rublev**, who has won the past three meetings, all this season. Zverev won the first five meetings between 2016-2021. Zverev, who captured titles in 2018 and 2021, is trying to advance to the semi-finals for the fourth time in six appearances.
- Rublev, who reached the semi-finals last year, is trying to avoid his first 0-3 finish at the Nitto ATP Finals. He has lost straight-set matches to Medvedev and Alcaraz so far. In his first two appearances in 2020-21, he went 1-2 in round robin play.

- In Red Group doubles action, in the opening match, No. 2 **Wesley Koolhof** and **Neal Skupski** bring a 3-2 **Lexus ATP Head2Head** record against No. 3 **Rohan Bopanna** and **Matthew Ebden**. Both teams are 1-1 this week and the winner will advance to the semi-finals. Last year Koolhof/Skupski reached the semi-finals. Bopanna, 43, became the oldest player to win a match in tournament history on Wednesday.
- In the evening session, reigning Nitto ATP Finals champions and 3-time US Open winners No. 6 **Rajeev Ram** and **Joe Salisbury** meet No. 8 **Rinky Hijikata** and **Jason Kubler** for the first time. Ram/Salisbury already have qualified for the semi-finals for the fourth straight year and they enter with a seven-match Turin winning streak. Australian Open champions Hijikata/Kubler are trying to win their first match since Wimbledon 1R. This is only their second tournament together since then. They are 0-2 this week in their Nitto ATP Finals debut.

When Alcaraz defeated Medvedev in Indian Wells, he was able to break down the Medvedev defences and achieve a Conversion Score of 71%. This is special as opponents average a 61% Conversion Score vs Medvedev, and when Alcaraz loses to Medvedev, he has a low Conversion Score.

Nitto ATP Finals Stats

- The 20-year-old Spaniard earned his first tournament win 7-5 6-2 over Rublev, winning 94% of 1st serve pts. and never facing break point. He opened with a 6-7(3) 6-3 6-4 loss to Zverev on Monday in his tournament debut.
- Looking to become the youngest semi-finalist since Nadal (20) in 2006.
- He is the youngest player in the field along with 20-year-old Rune, this marks first time since 2000 Lisbon there are two 20-and-under players in the field. In 2000, Lleyton Hewitt (19) and Marat Safin (20) made their debuts.
- Qualified last year but withdrew due to an internal oblique muscle tear in his left abdominal wall.
- One of 7 players in the field who has played at the Next Gen ATP Finals in Milan (Hurkacz, Medvedev, Rublev, Rune, Sinner, Tsitsipas) and captured 2021 title (d. Korda).

Career Highlights

- Youngest and first teenage World No. 1 and year-end No. 1 in Pepperstone ATP Rankings history (since 1973), making record rise from No. 32 at end of 2021 to No. 1 at age 19 in September 2022, then remaining atop rankings through end of season earning a total of 36 weeks.
- Has compiled a 6-2 record in finals in 2023 and has a 12-4 career record in tour-level finals from 2021-23.
- Became third Spanish man in Wimbledon history to win the singles title after Nadal (2008, 2010) and Santana (1966), defeating Djokovic in a 5-set battle for his 2nd Grand Slam title.
- Beat Ruud in 2022 US Open final for No. 1 ranking, becoming youngest men's champion at US Open since Sampras, 19, in 1990 and at any Grand Slam event since Nadal, 19, at 2005 Roland Garros.
- Became youngest ATP 500 champion at 2022 Rio de Janeiro (173 events since 2009) and 3rd-youngest ATP Masters 1000 champion at 2022 Miami (since 1990).
- Youngest player to defeat both Nadal and Djokovic and 1st to do so at same clay-court event, beating them on back-to-back days en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2022 Madrid.
- Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2021 US Open, becoming youngest men's quarter-finalist at US Open since Koch, 18, in 1963 (Amateur Era) and at any Grand Slam since Chang, 18, at 1990 Roland Garros.

Nitto ATP Finals Stats

- Opened with a 6-4 6-2 victory over Rublev on Monday (saving all 7 break points faced), then posted a 7-6(7) 6-4 win over Zverev to advance to the semi-finals for the third time in five appearances.
- Last year went 0-3 in round robin play, losing to Rublev, Tsitsipas and Djokovic all in a third-set tie-break.
- In 2021, reached final (l. to Zverev), which broke a 9-match tournament winning streak. Won Red Group with a 3-0 record (all in 3 sets). Of his 9 wins, 5 straight came in 3 sets.
- Captured 2020 title with victories over 2018 champion Zverev 6-3 6-4, No. 1 Djokovic 6-3 6-3, Schwartzman 6-3 6-3, 2-time finalist Nadal 3-6 7-6(4) 6-3 and 2019 finalist Thiem 4-6 7-6(2) 6-4.
- Became 1st player in tournament history to defeat World No. 1, No. 2 and No. 3 (d. Djokovic, Nadal and Thiem).
- Five victories at 2020 Nitto ATP Finals were part of career-long 20 match win streak overall (12 vs. Top 10).
- Joined countryman Davydenko, who won 2009 London, to capture Nitto ATP Finals titles. Medvedev won last of 12 editions held at The O2 and Davydenko won 1st of 12.
- Went 0-3 in Nitto ATP Finals tournament debut in 2019 (l. to Tsitsipas, Nadal and A. Zverev).
- In 2020, became 1st player in tournament history to go undefeated one year after going winless in his debut.

Career Highlights

- Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in February 2004.
- Five-time Grand Slam finalist (1-4) owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.
- Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).
- Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

• Won 18 of his 20 singles titles on hard courts and all 20 of his titles at different events, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami and 2023 Rome, his 1st career clay ATP Tour title.

Nitto ATP Finals Stats

- Opened with a 6-4 6-2 loss to Medvedev and followed with a 7-5 6-2 loss to Alcaraz (has yet to break serve so far).
- He is making his 4th straight Nitto ATP Finals appearance and looking to avoid first 0-3 finish.
- Last year advanced to SFs with a 2-1 round robin record (d. Medvedev, l. to Djokovic, d. Tsitsipas) and then lost to Ruud. In first two appearances, went 1-2 in 2020-21.
- All 4 of his wins have come against Top 5 opponents – No. 3 Thiem in 2020, No. 4 Tsitsipas in 2021, No. 5 Medvedev and No. 3 Tsitsipas last year.
- In 2021, opened with win over Tsitsipas before losing to Djokovic in straight sets and to Ruud in 3rd set TB.
- In 2020, lost to Nadal in straight sets and Tsitsipas in 3rd set TB before defeating Thiem 6-2 7-5 in final match.

Career Highlights

- Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 20 in January 2020, Top 10 in October 2020 and Top 5 in September 2021.
- Came from a set down in both SF and F for 1st time in career at 2023 Monte Carlo to win 1st ATP Masters 1000 title.
- Defeated No. 3 Nadal at 2021 Monte Carlo and No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Cincinnati en route to ATP Masters 1000 finals, then beat No. 1 Djokovic for 11th of 14 ATP Tour titles at 2022 Belgrade.
- Led tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.
- Nine-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist reached 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF and won gold medal in All-ROC mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).
- Went 9-1 in singles and 4-1 in doubles at team events during 2021 season, sweeping titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

Nitto ATP Finals Stats

- The two-time champion (2018, 2021) opened with a 6-7(3) 6-3 6-4 win over Alcaraz on Monday, hitting 16 aces and saving 5 of 6 break points. Followed with a 7-6(7) 6-4 loss to Medvedev on Wednesday. Looking to reach semi-finals for the fourth time in six appearances.
- Two years ago went 4-1 en route to title over No. 2 Medvedev. Became 10th player in tournament history with at least 2 titles and joined countryman Becker (3) with multiple titles.
- Three of his 4 career World No. 1 wins have come at Nitto ATP Finals – d. No. 1 Djokovic in 2018 final and 2021 SF along with No. 1 Nadal in 2019 round robin play.
- Defeated No. 3 Federer in SF and avenged group loss to No. 1 Djokovic in final to win 2018 championship.
- One of 3 Germans to win Nitto ATP Finals title (also Becker in 1988, 1992 and 1995; Stich in 1993).
- Upset No. 1 Nadal en route to 2019 SF, becoming 1st player to beat Djokovic, Nadal & Federer at Nitto ATP Finals.

Career Highlights

- Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal. Missed rest of season and finished No. 12 before strong 2023 with 6th year-end Top 10 ranking.
- Led ATP Tour with 6 titles in 2021 and leads all players born since 1990 with 21 career titles, defeating No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and 2021 Nitto ATP Finals championships.
- Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.
- Defeated Djokovic at 2017 Rome and Federer at 2017 Montreal for 1st and 2nd of his 5 ATP Masters 1000 titles.
- Joined Murray and Thiem as 3rd player to defeat Djokovic on hard (3 times), Federer on grass (2016 Halle SF) and Nadal on clay (2021 Madrid QF).

Rinky Hijikata Career Highlights

- Former World No. 9 junior achieved career-high singles ranking of No. 70 in October 2023 soon after reaching US Open 4R (l. to Tiafoe). Won personal-high 11 tour-level matches in singles and 20 in doubles. Reached a career-high No. 23 in doubles on 30 October, shortly after winning Tokyo title w/Purcell.
- Broke into Top 100 in singles after advancing to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch as LL.
- Defeated [1] Koolhof/Skupski en route to 2023 Australian Open doubles title in team debut w/Kubler, joining Kokkinakis/Kyrgios as 2nd straight All-Aussie WCs to win their home Grand Slam championship.

- Defeated [1] Koolhof/Skupski en route to 2023 Australian Open doubles title in team debut w/Hijkata, joining Kokkinakis/Kyrgios as 2nd straight All-Aussie WCs to win their home Grand Slam championship.
- After advancing to 2022 Wimbledon 4R as Q, saved 1 MP for biggest win of career vs. No. 9 Auger-Aliassime en route to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2022 Newport.
- To protect his knees, played exclusively on clay from March 2012-May 2015, winning 1st of 7 career Challenger titles at 2014 Sibiu.
- Earned 35 straight junior wins from July 2009-January 2010 (70-4 in sets), became World No. 1 junior in May 2010 and ended junior career by reaching 2011 Wimbledon boys' singles SF.

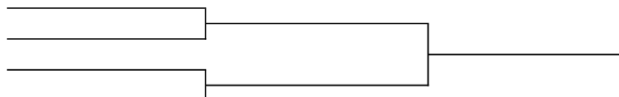

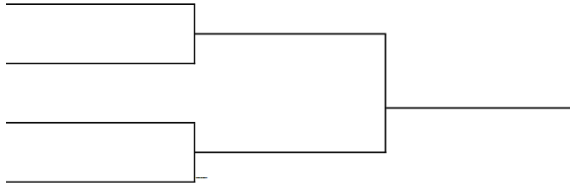
