[8] Pavel Kotov vs Cristian Garin (CHI)

First Meeting

Pavel Kotov | Age: 25 | World No. 60 | Career-High No. 50 | 2024: 14-13 (Marrakech SF) | Bastad: 1-1 (2023 2R)
 > Earned 1st ranking point at age 16 in October 2015, broke into Top 100 in October 2022 and achieved career-high No. 50 in June 2024.
 > Defeated No. 25 Griekspoor for biggest win of career en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2023 Stockholm as Q.
 > Qualified and earned 1st ATP Tour win at 2022 Marrakech (d. Griekspoor in 1R), returning to Marrakech to reach 1st ATP Tour SF in 2023 and 4th SF in 2024.
 > Qualified to make ATP Tour debut at 2020 St. Petersburg and Grand Slam debut at 2022 Roland Garros.
 > Owns 89-71 Challenger record (3-2 in finals), winning titles at 2021 Forli-3, 2022 Forli-3 and 2022 San Marino.

NOTE: Kotov is seeded at an ATP Tour event for the 1st time in his career and earned 10 of 14 wins this year on clay. In 2023, he qualified for the main draw in Bastad ranked No. 89 before losing to eventual champion Rublev in 2R.

Cristian Garin | Age: 28 | World No. 106 | Career-High No. 17 | 2024: 7-7 (Estoril, Munich SF) | Bastad: 1-2 (2021 QF)
 > Won biggest title of career at 2020 Rio de Janeiro to rise to No. 18, then ended 2021 season at career-high No. 17.
 > Five-time ATP Tour champion saved 5 MPs vs. Chardy en route to 2019 Houston title and 2 MPs vs. No. 3 A. Zverev en route to 2019 Munich title.
 > Advanced to 1st Grand Slam QF at 2022 Wimbledon after reaching ATP Masters 1000 QFs at 2019 Paris, 2021 Madrid and 2022 Rome.
 > Earned 1st ATP Tour win at 2013 Vina del Mar as 16-year-old WC (d. Lajovic) and 2nd ATP Tour win at 2019 Buenos Aires (d. Auger-Aliassime).
 > Former World No. 4 junior defeated A. Zverev for 2013 Roland Garros boys' singles title and reached boys' doubles final with countryman Jarry.

NOTE: Garin aims to make his 3rd consecutive ATP Tour SF on clay (l. to Hurkacz in Estoril SF, l. to Fritz in Munich SF). He is 10-3 in opening-round matches on tour-level clay since the start of the 2023 season.

Cameron Norrie | Age: 28 | World No. 42 | Career-High No. 8 | 2024: 16-14 (Rio de Janeiro SF) | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 10 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 8 in September 2022, joining Henman, Murray and Rusedski as 4th Top-10 British man in history.
 > Advanced to 13 ATP Tour finals from May 2021-February 2023, highlighted by 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title to become 1st British champion in 46-year tournament history.
 > Reached Grand Slam 4R, QF and SF for 1st time at 2022 Wimbledon, falling to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets.
 > Earned 52 wins in 2021 and 49 wins in 2022 before beating No. 2 Nadal at 2023 United Cup and No. 2 Alcaraz in 2023 Rio de Janeiro final for biggest wins of career.
 > Born in South Africa to a Scottish father and Welsh mother, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University, and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

NOTE: Norrie aims to be the 1st British match winner in Bastad since Bedene reached 2R in 2016. He is 23-2 against opponents ranked outside the Top 100 on clay since the start of the 2021 season (including ATP Tour qualifying).

Jozef Kovalik | Age: 31 | World No. 102 | Career-High No. 80 | 2024: 2-1 (Roland Garros 3R) | Bastad: 1-2 (2023 2R)
 > Broke into Top 100 and achieved career-high No. 80 during 2018 season.
 > Qualified en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2018 Sofia and 2nd SF at 2018 Hamburg SF.
 > Earned biggest win of career over No. 6 Cilic in 2017 Chennai 2R as Q.
 > Qualified at 2016 Australian Open, 2017 Roland Garros and 2018 Roland Garros, owning a 0-9 Grand Slam main draw record before defeating Giron and Khachanov to make 2024 Roland Garros 3R as LL.
 > Also entered Grand Slam main draws as a lucky loser at 2016 US Open, 2020 Australian Open and 2024 Roland Garros.
 > Owns 9 Challenger titles overall, ending 2019 on 18-3 run with titles at Szczecin and Maia.
 > In 2024, won Challenger titles in Split, Zadar and Karlsruhe and reached final of Mauthausen.

NOTE: Kovalik is 3-2 in his last 5 matches against Top 50 players (5-22 overall across all levels), beating No. 35 Davidovich Fokina in 2023 Bastad 1R and No. 50 Giron & No. 18 Khachanov at 2024 Roland Garros.
