[WC] Leandro Riedi (SUI) vs Gregoire Barrere (FRA)

First Meeting

Leandro Riedi | Age: 22 | World No. 134 | Career-High No. 126 | 2024: 1-1 (Davis Cup) | Gstaad: 0-1 (2021 1R)
 > Former World No. 6 junior broke into Top 500 in April 2022 and Top 200 in November 2022, reaching career-high No. 126 in March 2023.
 > Made his ATP Tour debut at 2021 Gstaad as WC before earning his first win at 2023 Marseille (d. Rinderknech).
 > Owns a 55-29 Challenger record (4-6 in finals), winning titles in Helsinki and Andria in 2022 and Oeiras-2 and Ottignies-Louvain-la-Neuve in 2024.
 > Finished his junior career at 2020 Roland Garros, losing to Stricker in 1st All-Swiss boys' singles final after capturing 2020 Australian Open boys' doubles title w/lonel days after his 18th birthday.
 > Zurich native preferred football at a young age, before switching to tennis due to fun of the sport and travel.

NOTE: Riedi returns to Gstaad for the first time since making his ATP Tour debut in 2021 and now aims to earn third ATP Tour win of career, first on home soil (d. Rinderknech at 2023 Marseille and van de Zandschulp at 2024 Davis Cup, both on indoor hard).

Gregoire Barrere | Age: 30 | World No. 131 | Career-High No. 49 | 2024: 4-6 (Bucharest SF) | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 100 in September 2019 and Top 50 in July 2023, achieving career-high No. 49 after reaching 1st ATP Tour SF at 2023 Eastbourne.
 > Advanced to ATP Tour QFs in his native France at 2019 Metz, 2020 Montpellier and 2023 Montpellier.
 > On clay, earned biggest win of career over No. 11 Khachanov at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome and reached 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2024 Bucharest.
 > Won main draw matches at all 4 Grand Slam events, including at Roland Garros in 2019 and 2022 as WC.
 > Qualified at Wimbledon in 2018, 2019 and 2021, as well as at 2019 US Open.
 > Owns 137-108 Challenger record (6-7 in finals), winning all 6 of his titles and reaching 12 of his 13 finals on French soil.

NOTE: Barrere is playing in his 100th tour-level match (38-61) and seeks first tour-level win since reaching his 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2024 Bucharest (l. to Navone).

[Q] Titouan Droguet (FRA) vs [7] Fabio Fognini (ITA)

First Meeting

Titouan Droguet | Age: 23 | World No. 141 | Career-High No. 130 | 2024: 0-0 | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Frenchman earned career-high No. 130 in June 2024 soon after winning his first Challenger title in Francavilla Al Mare without losing a set.
 > Qualified for his 1st career Grand Slam tournament at 2023 US Open, defeating No. 2 seed Garin in Q1 and posting 7-5 in 3rd set wins over Sandgren in Q2 and Coppejans in Q3.
 > Upset No. 18 seed Lorenzo Musetti at 2023 US Open 1R for biggest win of career before losing to Mensik in 2R.
 > Owns a 50-35 career Challenger record (31-21 on clay), capturing title at 2024 Francavilla al Mare and reaching finals at 2023 Cherbourg as Q, 2023 Modena, 2023 Amersfoort and 2024 Szekesfehervar.

NOTE: Droguet qualified for his 2nd tour-level event after 2023 US Open (d. No. 18 Musetti in 1R) and plays in his first ATP Tour match on clay. He is on a 4-match losing streak vs. Top 100 players across all levels after a 3-0 start.

Fabio Fognini | Age: 37 | World No. 80 | Career-High No. 9 | 2024: 8-6 (Marrakech QF) | Gstaad: 4-2 (2017 Title)
 > As a 32-year-old in 2019, became oldest player to break into Top 10 for 1st time, as well as 1st Italian in Top 10 since Barazzutti in 1979.
 > Also became 1st Italian ATP Masters 1000 champion, beating Nadal for 3rd time on clay en route to 2019 Monte Carlo title.
 > Boasts most victories of any Italian man in Open Era (422), highlighted by biggest win of career over No. 1 Murray at 2017 Rome.
 > Owns 9 singles and 8 doubles titles, breaking through as a doubles player in 2015 by winning Australian Open, reaching 3 ATP Masters 1000 finals and qualifying for Nitto ATP Finals w/Bolelli.
 > Married to 2015 US Open women's singles champion Flavia Pennetta with 3 children – Federico, Farah and Flaminia.

NOTE: Fognini is seeded at an ATP Tour event for the first time since 2022 Umag and seeks his first win in Gstaad since clinching the title in 2017, losing last two opening rounds to Zopp in 2018 and Ramos-Vinolas in 2023.

Dominic Thiem | Age: 30 | World No. 133 | Career-High No. 3 | 2024: 2-5 (Estoril 2R) | Gstaad: 8-3 (2015 Title)
 > Achieved career-high No. 3 in March 2020 and remained in Top 5 until suffering right wrist tear in June 2021.
 > Playing in his 4th Grand Slam final, defeated A. Zverev in 5th-set TB to win 2020 US Open title, becoming 1st player to win US Open final from 2 sets down since Gonzales in 1949 (Amateur Era).
 > Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals each year from 2016-20, defeating No. 3 Federer and No. 2 Djokovic en route to 2019 championship match, then beating No. 2 Nadal and No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2020 final.
 > Playing in his 3rd ATP Masters 1000 final, defeated 5-time champion Federer to win 2019 Indian Wells title.
 > Went 9-3 from 2019-20 against Djokovic, Federer and Nadal, joining Murray as 1 of 2 players with at least 5 career wins over each member of Big 3.

NOTE: Thiem is one of six former champions in Gstaad main draw, defeating then-No. 14 Goffin to capture the 2015 title. He looks for 2nd ATP Tour win of the season after defeating Marterer in Estoril 1R (l. to Gasquet in 2R).

Juan Pablo Varillas | Age: 28 | World No. 162 | Career-High No. 60 | 2024: 1-8 (Santiago 2R) | Gstaad: 4-2 (2022-23 QF)
 > Broke into Top 100 in August 2022 and achieved career-high No. 60 in June 2023 after becoming the first Peruvian to reach Roland Garros 4R since Yzaga in 1994.
 > Also rallied from two sets down in Roland Garros 1R & 2R and defeated No. 14 Hurkacz in 3R for biggest win of career, becoming the 1st player since 2006 to reach 4R at the event with three 5-set wins.
 > Came from qualifying and swept 10 straight sets to reach 1st ATP Tour SF at 2023 Buenos Aires.
 > Joined Horna, Yzaga, Di Laura and Arraya as 5th Peruvian to break into Top 100 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973).
 > Boasts 135-91 Challenger record (6-5 in finals), with most recent title at Santiago in March 2024.
 > Squandered 2-set lead vs. Auger-Aliassime in Grand Slam main draw debut at 2022 Roland Garros as Q.

NOTE: Varillas reached 2 of 5 career ATP Tour QFs in Gstaad (2022 – l. to Thiem, 2023 – l. to Ramos-Vinolas). He looks for his first ATP Tour win since defeating Comesana at 2024 Santiago (l. to eventual champion Baez in 2R).

Marc-Andrea Huesler | Age: 28 | World No. 226 | Career-High No. 47 | 2024: 3-5 (Munich QF) | Gstaad: 1-5 (2018 2R)
> Broke into Top 100 at age 26 in July 2022, then achieved career-high No. 47 in February 2023.
> Beat #NextGenATP players Musetti and Rune en route to 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Sofia.
> Qualified at Halle, Wimbledon, Bastad, Winston-Salem and ATP Masters 1000 Paris in 2022.
> Defeated 2021 champion Ivashka and 2021 finalist M. Ymer en route to 2022 Winston-Salem SF as Q.
> Boasts 90-75 Challenger record (5-1 in finals), including clay-court titles in 2022 at Mexico City and Aguascalientes.

NOTE: Huesler is looking for first win in Gstaad since defeating Almagro in 2018 1R (l. to Bagnis in 2R). He aims to avenge loss to Medjedovic in Salzburg Challenger last week and earn first tour-level win since reaching 4th ATP Tour QF in Munich in April.

Hamad Medjedovic | Age: 20 | World No. 122 | Career-High No. 102 | 2024: 4-4 (Rome 3R) | Gstaad: 3-1 (2023 SF)
> 2023 Next Gen ATP Finals champion broke into Top 200 in March 2023, earning career-high No. 102 in October 2023 after reaching 2nd ATP Tour SF in Astana.
> Came through qualifying and upset 2015 champion Thiem en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2023 Gstaad.
> Made ATP Tour debut at 2021 Belgrade-2 and earned first tour-level win at 2023 Davis Cup over Durasovic.
> Also qualified to Grand Slam main draws at Roland Garros in 2023 and 2024 and Wimbledon in 2023.
> Owns 37-25 Challenger record (4-0 in finals) and joined Djokovic and Tipsarevic as the 3rd Serbian teenager to win a trio of Challenger titles, doing so at 2022 Luedenscheid, 2023 Szekesfehervar and 2023 Mauthausen.
> Achieved career-high No. 9 in junior rankings after winning titles without dropping a set at 2019 Berlin Grade 1 and 2019 New Delhi Grade 2.

NOTE: Medjedovic reached his first ATP Tour SF in Gstaad last year as 183th-ranked Q before losing to eventual champion Cachin. The youngest player in the draw is 7-1 vs. left-handers in his last 8 matches against them (including ATP Qualifying and Challengers).
