**Francisco Comesana** | Age: 24 | World No. 73 | Career-High No. 61 | 2025: 11-14 (Rio SF) | Kitzbuhel: 0-0 (Debut)  
 > Broke into Top 200 in June 2023, Top 100 in April 2024 and achieved career-high No. 61 in April 2025.  
 > In Grand Slam main draw debut at 2024 Wimbledon, defeated No. 6 Rublev in 1R for 1st tour-level win of career and beat Walton in 2R to become youngest Argentine in Wimbledon 3R since del Potro in 2011.  
 > Reached 2024 US Open 3R to become 3rd Argentine man in Open Era to advance to 3R in 1st two Grand Slam main draw appearances after Jaite (in 1984-85) and Markus (in 1991).  
 > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2025 Rio de Janeiro, defeating No. 2 Zverev for biggest win of career in QF.  
 > Posted 45-21 Challenger record in 2023, earning most Challenger wins that season, highlighted by titles in Vicenza and Liberec and finals in Skopje and Santa Cruz.

**NOTE:** Comesana is seeded at an ATP Tour event for the second time after Gstaad last week (No. 7 seed; l. to eventual champion Bublik in QF). He is 8-1 vs. Americans on clay across all levels, lone loss to Nakashima at 2024 Aix-en-Provence CH and including two wins over Boyer.

**Tristan Boyer** | Age: 24 | World No. 126 | Career-High No. 109 | 2025: 2-5 (2 times in 2R) | Kitzbuhel: 0-0 (Debut)  
 > Unranked in March 2023, broke inside Top 500 in 2023, Top 200 in April 2024 and achieved career-high No. 109 in February 2025 after advancing to Australian Open 2R.  
 > Defeated former-World No. 29 Eubanks to qualify for 2025 Australian Open and beat No. 96 Coria in 1R for first tour-level win of career, before defeating No. 64 Vukic in 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells 1R as WC.  
 > Earned 44 wins on Challenger level in 2024, equaling Kim in 2004 for most Challenger match wins by an American in a season and became 1st American to earn 3 clay titles in a season, winning in Merida, Campinas and Montevideo.  
 > Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings in 2018, highlighted by runs to 3R at Roland Garros (l. to Seyboth Wild) and Wimbledon (l. to Draper).  
 > Played college tennis at Stanford University in 2021 and helped win their first Pac-12 championship since 2003.

**NOTE:** Boyer seeks 1st ATP Tour win on clay after losing to Darderi in Marrakech 1R in April and to E. Ymer in Bastad 1R last week. He is 4th American to compete in Kitzbuhel this century after Armando (2001 QF, 2005, 2007 1R), Odesnik (2012 QF), and Moreno de Alboran (2024 QF).

#### [WC] Joel Schwaerzler (AUT) vs [8] Marton Fucsovics (HUN)

#### First Meeting

**Joel Schwaerzler** | Age: 19 | World No. 354 | Career-High No. 307 | 2025: 0-0 (2 CH QFs) | Kitzbuhel: 0-1 (2024 1R)  
 > Earned first ATP point at age 17 in March 2023 before breaking the Top 500 at No. 387 in May 2024 and achieving career-high No. 303 in March 2025.  
 > Peaked at No. 1 in juniors in January 2024 having won 2023 ITF World Tennis Tour Junior Finals, before claiming 2024 Roland Garros in boys' doubles title w/Budkov Kjaer.  
 > Won lone Challenger title at 2024 Skopje as No. 664-ranked 18-year-old in 7th Challenger main draw appearance, defeating former-Top 100 player Majchrzak in the final.  
 > Owns 23-15 ITF Tour record, reaching back-to-back finals in 2025 at M25 Klosters and M25 Bastia-Lucciana.  
 > Made ATP Tour qualifying debut in Kitzbuhel in 2023 before making his ATP Tour main draw debut at the same event in 2024, losing to Seyboth Wild in 1R.

**NOTE:** Schwaerzler is playing his 3rd ATP Tour match after making debut at this event last year (l. to No. 72 Seyboth Wild in 1R) and Vienna in October (l. to No. 3 Zverev in 1R). He seeks biggest win of career (0-4 vs. Top 100 across all levels) and would be youngest Austrian to win a match at this event since Haider-Maurer, 19, in 2006.

**Marton Fucsovics** | Age: 33 | World No. 91 | Career-High No. 31 | 2025: 11-6 (Bucharest SF) | Kitzbuhel: 0-2 ('19, '24 1R)  
 > Achieved career-high No. 31 in 2019 and became highest-ranked Hungarian since No. 29 Taroczy in 1983.  
 > Defeated 2-time defending champion Wawrinka en route to 1st ATP Tour title at 2018 Geneva, becoming 1st Hungarian champion since Taroczy at 1982 Hilversum and won 2nd title at 2024 Bucharest.  
 > Rallied for 5-set win over No. 7 Rublev at 2021 Wimbledon to become 1st men's quarter-finalist from Hungary at that event since Asboth in 1948.  
 > Advanced to Grand Slam 4R on 3 other occasions, beating No. 5 Medvedev en route to 2020 Roland Garros 4R

and to end 0-14 start to career vs. Top 10.

> Became World No. 1 junior after capturing 2010 Wimbledon boys' singles title without dropping a set.

**NOTE:** Fucsovics won his last 5 tour-level opening matches and is competing in his 1st event since Wimbledon (reached 3R as LL, l. to No. 10 Shelton). He would be 1st Hungarian to win a match in Kitzbuhel since Balazs in 2012 (d. Fischer, l. to Kohlschreiber in 2R), losing in 1R to Ramos-Vinolas in 2019 and Carballes Baena in 2024.

**Arthur Rinderknech** | Age: 29 | World No. 65 | Career-High No. 42 | 2025: 10-19 (Queen's Club QF) | Kitzbuhel: 5-2 ('21 SF)  
> Broke into Top 50 in January 2022 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at Adelaide-2, then became No. 1 Frenchman and achieved career-high No. 42 in October 2022.

> Playing on indoor hard courts in fall 2022, saved 1 MP vs. No. 17 Schwartzman in Tel Aviv 2R, 9 MPs vs. No. 15 Carreno Busta in Gijon QF and 2 MPs vs. No. 16 Cilic in Basel 1R.

> In 2021, advanced to Kitzbuhel SF, reached 6 other ATP Tour QFs, and earned 1st 18 tour-level wins of career.

> Captured Challenger titles at 2020 Rennes, 2020 Calgary, 2021 Istanbul as Q, 2022 Poznan, 2023 Zug and 2024 Lille.

> Five-time All-American at Texas A&M University (3 singles, 2 doubles), where he graduated from Mays Business School in 2018.

**NOTE:** Rinderknech reached 2021 SF (l. to Ruud) and 2023 QF (l. to Thiem) in prior Kitzbuhel appearances. He is 8-9 on tour-level since ATP Masters 1000 Madrid at the end of April after starting the season 2-10.

**Facundo Bagnis** | Age: 35 | World No. 772 | Career-High No. 55 | 2025: 0-0 (1 CH QF) | Kitzbuhel: 0-3 ('16, '17, '23 1R)

> Achieved career-high No. 55 in 2016 and broke back into Top 100 in 2021 after advancing to 1st ATP Tour final at Santiago.

> Celebrated 31st birthday by competing in 1st ATP Tour SF at 2021 Cordoba as Q after earning 6 wins, then advanced to 2nd ATP Tour final at 2024 Cordoba, playing in 3rd all-qualifier final in ATP Tour history (since 1990).

> Advanced to Grand Slam 3R for 1st time at 2021 US Open after entering event with 1-10 record on hard courts.

> In Grand Slam main draw debut, defeated Benneteau 18-16 in 5th at 2014 Roland Garros as Q.

> Boasts 368-217 Challenger record (17-14 in finals), posting 6-0 finals record in 2016 – tied for 2nd-most titles in a single season behind Griekspoor's 8 in 2021.

**NOTE:** Bagnis is playing 1st ATP Tour match since 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid (d. Nakashima, l. to No. 8 Rublev in 2R). He would be lowest-ranked player to win a match in Kitzbuhel since No. 937 Schiessling in 2002 (d. Ulihrach).

**Hugo Gaston** | Age: 24 | World No. 99 | Career-High No. 58 | 2025: 6-12 (6 times in 2R) | Kitzbuhel: 4-1 (2024 Final)  
> Broke into Top 100 after reaching 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Paris QF as Q, then achieved career-high No. 58 in July 2022.

> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF, SF and final at 2021 Gstaad as World No. 155 and competed at Next Gen ATP Finals to end season.

> Saved 2 MPs to beat defending champion Baez at 2024 Kitzbuhel en route to 2nd ATP Tour final.

> At 2020 Roland Garros, became 1st Frenchman to reach 4R in tournament debut since Dominguez in 1971, defeating 2015 champion Wawrinka in 5 sets before falling in 5 sets to 2-time finalist Thiem.

> As 239th-ranked WC, became lowest-ranked player to reach Grand Slam 4R since No. 248 Canas at 2004 Australian Open and Roland Garros 4R since No. 283 Di Pasquale in 2002.

> Ended 2018 as World No. 2 junior after winning gold medal in boys' singles and bronze medal in both boys' doubles and mixed doubles at Youth Olympics.

**NOTE:** Gaston reached latest of 2 ATP Tour finals in Kitzbuhel last year, losing to Berrettini (d. No. 18 Baez in QF). He is No. 124 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#) and needs to reach at least the final to avoid exiting Top 100 for the first time since May 2024.

**Norbert Gombos** | Age: 34 | World No. 307 | Career-High No. 80 | 2025: 1-0 (Davis Cup) | Kitzbuhel: 0-0 (2015 1R)

> Broke into Top 100 and achieved career-high No. 80 in 2017 before ending a year in Top 100 for 1st time in 2020.

> Posted best Grand Slam and ATP Masters 1000 results in Paris during 2020 season, advancing to Roland Garros 3R before beating No. 14 Goffin for biggest win of career to reach Paris 3R.

> Went 9-0 in Grand Slam qualifying matches during 2022 season, advancing to main draw at Australian Open,

Roland Garros and US Open (DNP at Wimbledon).

> Debuted on tour by defeating future World No. 3 Thiem during 2014 Davis Cup tie (SVK d. AUT 4-1).

> Owns 256-193 Challenger record (7-11 in finals), winning 2 titles on home soil in Bratislava (2016 and 2019).

**NOTE:** Gombos is playing 1st tour-level match outside of Davis Cup since 2022 US Open (l. to Ramos-Vinolas) and seeks 1st ATP Tour win since defeating Delbonis at 2022 Umag (l. to No. 5 Alcaraz in 2R). He is 9-11 vs. Top 100 on tour-level clay (18-45 on all surfaces) and would be first Slovak to win an ATP Tour match this season.
