MEN'S TOURNAMENT PREVIEW

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TITLES LEADERBOARD: Two-time champion **Novak Djokovic** is looking to become the first man in history to win all four Grand Slam tournaments at least three times. Djokovic is tied with 14-time Roland Garros champion **Rafael Nadal** for the most Grand Slam men's singles titles of all-time. Djokovic opened the season by capturing his 10th Australian Open crown. He is attempting to win the Australian Open and Roland Garros for the third time in the same season (2016, 2021).

ALCARAZ TOP SEED: World No. 1 **Carlos Alcaraz** is the top seed in a Grand Slam tournament for the first time in his career. The 20-year-old Spaniard is the youngest No. 1 seed at Roland Garros since Bjorn Borg (19) in 1976. He turned 20 during the tournament. Borg was also the top seed in 1975. Alcaraz, who missed the Australian Open due to a right leg injury, is playing in his first Grand Slam tournament since winning the US Open last September (d. Ruud). At 19, he was the first male teenager to win a Grand Slam crown since Nadal (19) won 2005 Roland Garros.

This season Alcaraz has compiled a 30-3 record with four titles (Buenos Aires, ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells, Barcelona, ATP Masters 1000 Madrid). Last year Alcaraz came into Roland Garros ranked No. 6 and he reached the QFs (l. to Zverev).

MISSING RAFA: Defending champion **Rafael Nadal** is not in the Roland Garros draw due to a hip injury and it breaks his 18-year streak in Paris. He is the first defending champion not to return the next year since 1990 winner Andres Gomez who did not return the following year. Here are Nadal's Roland Garros records:

GASQUET EYES 600 WINS: Richard Gasquet is one of a tournament-high 19 Frenchmen in the Roland Garros main draw and he is two wins away from becoming the fourth active player with 600 wins (Nadal 1068, Djokovic 1051, Murray 725). Gasquet is among the Top 3 Frenchmen in three categories:

NOAH 40TH ANNIVERSARY: It's been 40 years since a Frenchman has won the Roland Garros men's singles title. In 1983, Yannick Noah lifted the trophy (d. Wilander) and he's the only French Grand Slam men's singles title in the Open Era.

MEDVEDEV ON A ROLL: World No. 2 **Daniil Medvedev** is the ATP Tour leader in titles (5), finals (6), wins (39) coming into Roland Garros. He captured his first career clay court title at ATP Masters 1000 Rome (d. Rune) and it was his personal-best fifth title of the season and 20th in his career (in 20 different tournaments). His best Roland Garros result was the quarter-finals in 2021 (l. to Tsitsipas). He is also the Pepperstone ATP Race To Turin leader coming into Paris.
