

Hubert Hurkacz | Age: 28 | ATP World No. 83 | Career-High No. 6 | 2025: 15-11 (Geneva Final) | Career: 227-153 (8 Titles)
> Top Polish men's player in history ended 2021 and 2023 at year-end career-high No. 9 after Nitto ATP Finals appearances and reached career-high No. 6 in August 2024.

> Entered 2021 Wimbledon on 6-match losing streak, then reached 1st Grand Slam SF by defeating 8-time champion Federer 6-3 7-6(4) 6-0 in final singles match of Swiss' career.

> Upset 5 seeds to win 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Miami title and saved a championship point to win 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai after losing in the 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Montreal final.

> Also advanced to ATP Masters 1000 SFs at 2021 Paris, 2022 Miami and 2023 Cincinnati and captured ATP Masters 1000 doubles titles at 2020 Paris w/Auger-Aliassime and 2022 Miami w/Isner.

> Defeated No. 1 Medvedev 6-1 6-4 in 63 minutes to win 5th ATP Tour singles title in 5th final at 2022 Halle (now 8-4 in finals).

Coco Gauff | Age: 21 | WTA World No. 4 | Career-High No. 2 (June 2024) | 2025: 48-16 (2 singles titles) | Career: 244-100 (11 singles titles)

> At her United Cup debut in 2025, went 5-0 in singles and 2-0 in doubles, leading United States to the title

> Winner of 11 WTA Tour singles titles (including a 9-0 career record in WTA Tour hard court finals)

> Two-time Grand Slam singles champion, hoisting the trophy at 2023 US Open and 2025 Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in both finals)

> Other notable 2025 results included earning her third career WTA 1000 title at Wuhan and WTA 1000 finals at Madrid and Rome, becoming the first American to reach three WTA 1000 finals in a calendar year since Serena Williams in 2014

> Has won 10 WTA Tour doubles titles, including a Grand Slam title at 2024 Roland Garros (w/Siniakova)

> Reached World No.1 in doubles rankings on August 15, 2022

NOTE: Helped USA to a 2-1 win over Argentina with wins in singles (d. Sierra) and mixed doubles (w/Harrison). After losing to Bouzas Maneiro in 3-sets, Gauff returned to team with Harrison for a mixed doubles win to help USA advance. This is Gauff's 11th meeting against Sakkari; she has only faced Iga Swiatek (15) and Aryna Sabalenka (12) more times.



Maria Sakkari | Age: 30 | WTA World No. 51 | Career-High No. 3 (March 2022) | 2025: 20-27 (2 QFs) | Career: 249-194 (2 titles)

- > Two-time WTA Tour singles titlist, winning her first title at 2019 Rabat and adding the WTA 1000 Guadalajara crown in 2023
- > Has reached 8 additional Tour finals, including back-to-back Indian Wells R-Up finishes in 2022 and 2023
- > At inaugural United Cup in 2023, went 3-1 in singles and 3-0 in doubles during Greece's SF run
- > In 2024 United Cup, went 3-0 in singles and 0-2 in doubles (Greece reached QF); at 2025 edition went 0-2 in singles and 1-0 in doubles
- > Career best Grand Slam performances are semifinals at 2021 Roland Garros (l. eventual champion Krejcikova after holding MP) and 2021 US Open (l. eventual champion Raducanu)
- > First Greek to reach the Top 10 of the WTA Rankings, and the first Greek to qualify for the WTA Finals (2021)

NOTE: Sakkari has lost her last five meetings vs. Top 5 ranked opponents; her last Top 5 win came against today's opponent Coco Gauff (then No.3, at 2024 Indian Wells in SF). Sakkari has already recorded singles wins over Naomi Osaka and Emma Raducanu at United Cup.

Tsitsipas Leads 3-2

Taylor Fritz | Age: 28 | ATP World No. 9 | Career-High No. 4 | 2025: 53-23 (2 Titles) | Career: 338-214 (10 Titles)

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 4 in November 2024 after becoming 1st American since Blake in 2006 to play in Nitto ATP Finals championship match and finish in Top 5 of year-end rankings.
- > At 2024 US Open, became 1st American man to play in a Grand Slam final since 2009 after earning wins over former finalists Ruud and Zverev and defeating countryman Tiafoe in all-American semi-final.
- > Defeated No. 2 Nadal en route 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF after beating him in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final to become that event's 1st American men's champion since Agassi in 2001.
- > Reached 1st ATP Tour final at 2016 Memphis as 18-year-old WC, becoming youngest American finalist since start of ATP Tour in 1990.
- > Went on a 13-2 run on grass in 2025, capturing titles in Stuttgart and Eastbourne and advancing to Wimbledon SF.
- > Clinched United Cup titles for Team USA in 2023 and 2025, helped Team World capture Laver Cup in 2022, 2023 and 2025 and earned bronze medal at 2024 Paris Olympics in men's doubles w/Paul.

NOTE: Fritz owns most men's singles wins in tournament history (10), leading Team USA to titles in 2023 and 2025. 28-year-old lost to Baez in his opening match on Saturday before saving 1 MP to defeat Munar on Monday and now aims to record back-to-back wins for the first time since his run to Tokyo final in September.

Stefanos Tsitsipas | Age: 27 | ATP World No. 34 | Career-High No. 3 | 2025: 22-18 (Dubai Title) | Career: 369-183 (12 Titles)

- > Top-ranked Greek of all time achieved career-high No. 3 in August 2021 and boasts 11 wins vs. Top-3 opponents (2 vs. No. 1, 4 vs. No. 2, 5 vs. No. 3).
- > Six-time Grand Slam semi-finalist, highlighted by runs to 2021 Roland Garros and 2023 Australian Open finals, losing to Djokovic on both occasions.
- > Captured 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals title at age 20 and 2019 Nitto ATP Finals title at age 21, becoming youngest champion of latter since Hewitt, 20, in 2001.
- > Won 12 ATP Tour titles, including 2021, 2022 and 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo and captured 1st ATP 500 title in 12th final at 2025 Dubai.
- > Youngest of 30 players to defeat Djokovic (2018 Toronto 3R), Federer (2019 Australian Open 4R) and Nadal (2019 Madrid SF), sweeping Big 3 before turning 21.

NOTE: Tsitsipas is 8-2 at United Cup in singles, including wins over Mochizuki and Harris in group stage this year. He is 35-55 vs. Top 10, seeking first win since defeating No. 5 Zverev, No. 2 Sinner and No. 10 Ruud to win 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo title (0-5 since) and first Top 20 win since beating No. 18 Baez at 2024 Paris Olympics.

Belinda Bencic (SUI) vs Solana Sierra (ARG)

First Meeting

Belinda Bencic | Age: 28 | WTA World No. 11 | Career-High No. 4 (Feb 2020) | 2025: 37-17 (2 titles) | Career: 283-179 (10 titles)

> Ten time WTA Tour singles champion, winning her tenth title near the end of 2025 at Tokyo; she has also reached 10 additional WTA Tour singles finals

> Has won two WTA Tour doubles titles, both in 2015 (Prague with Siniakova, and Washington DC with Mladenovic)

> During 2025, skyrocketed from No.421 at the start of January to No.11 in the year-end ranking, in her first full season after maternity leave; went 2-0 in Tour finals, winning titles at WTA 500 events at Abu Dhabi and Tokyo, and also reached her second career Grand Slam SF at Wimbledon

> Was voted WTA Comeback Player of the Year 2025

> Played United Cup in 2023 (1-1 in singles, 1-0 in doubles) and 2025 (1-1 in both singles and doubles)

> Won two medals for Switzerland at the 2021 Olympics in Tokyo, finishing as singles gold medalist (d. Vondrousova in final) and the doubles silver medalist (w/Golubic, I. Krejcikova/Siniakova in final)

NOTE: In opening United Cup match, defeated No.3 ranked Paolini (was 2-7 vs. Top 5 opponents in 2025). Bencic was 30-2 vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 50 in 2025.

Solana Sierra | Age: 21 | WTA World No. 66 | Career-High No. 64 (July 2025) | 2025: 6-6 (QF Sao Paulo) | Career: 7-8 (0 titles)

> Broke through at Grand Slam level by reaching 2025 Wimbledon R16 as lucky loser (I. Siegemund); became the first lucky loser to reach the R16 at Wimbledon in the Open Era, and the first Argentine woman to reach the R16 at Wimbledon since Paola Suarez in 2004

> Also in 2025, won first two WTA 125 titles of her career at Antalya #3 and Mallorca, and additionally reached her first WTA Tour-level quarterfinal at Sao Paulo

> Achieved Top 100 debut on June 16, 2025 (at No.100), peaking at No.64 on July 21

> Made Tour-level and Grand Slam main draw debut at 2024 US Open as a qualifier (I. Maria in 1r)

> Was the 2022 Junior Roland Garros singles runner-up (I. Havlickova in final)

NOTE: Defeated Bouzas Maneiro (3rd career Top 50 win) in opening United Cup match before falling to Gauff. Her highest win by ranking came against No.32 Emma Navarro at WTA 125 Florianopolis in 2023.



Stan Wawrinka (SUI) vs Sebastian Baez (ARG)

First Meeting

Stan Wawrinka | Age: 40 | ATP World No. 156 | Career-High No. 3 | 2025: 4-13 (4x 2R) | Career: 583-377 (16 Titles)
> Achieved career-high No. 3 in 2014 and ended 2014-16 at No. 4 before undergoing 2 left knee surgeries in 2017 and 2 left foot surgeries in 2021.
> Boasts 5 wins over World No. 1 at Grand Slams, including finals of 2014 Australian Open (d. Nadal), 2015 Roland Garros (d. Djokovic) and 2016 US Open (d. Djokovic).
> One of 3 players to defeat Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal at Grand Slams (also Berdych, Tsonga).
> Owns 16 singles titles with 11 straight wins in finals from 2014-16, defeating fellow Swiss Federer for lone ATP Masters 1000 title at 2014 Monte-Carlo.
> Won 2008 Beijing Olympics doubles gold medal w/Federer and helped Switzerland capture 2014 Davis Cup.

NOTE: Wawrinka defeated Rinderknech 5-7 7-6(5) 7-6(5) in 3H18M before losing to Cobolli 4-6 7-6(2) 6-7(4) in 2H55M in group stage. He aims to record multiple wins in one ATP Tour event for the first time since advancing to 2024 Stockholm SF as Team Switzerland looks for their first United Cup semi-final.

Sebastian Baez | Age: 25 | ATP World No. 43 | Career-High No. 18 | 2025: 17-24 (Rio Title) | Career: 110-111 (7 Titles)
> Broke inside Top 20 in March 2024 after winning back-to-back ATP Tour titles in Rio de Janeiro and Santiago, then earned career-high No. 18 in June 2025.
> During 2023 season, went on a career-best 12-match winning streak, lifting titles in Kitzbuhel and Winston-Salem and reached 1st Grand Slam 3R at US Open.
> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Estoril, then earned 2nd title on home soil at 2023 Cordoba after entering tournament with 6 straight losses and 17 losses in previous 18 matches.
> Broke into Top 300, 200 and 100 in 2021, posting 6-3 record in Challenger finals tied for 2nd-most titles in a season behind Griekspoor's 8 in 2021.
> Became World No. 1 junior in March 2018 and went on to reach Roland Garros boys' singles final and win boys' doubles gold medal at Youth Olympics w/Diaz Acosta in his hometown of Buenos Aires.

NOTE: Baez defeated Munar on Friday and No. 9 Fritz for 1st career Top 10 win on hard court on Saturday and now bids to earn 3 wins in one hard court event for the second time in career (2023 Winston-Salem title). A win over Wawrinka would mark his fourth win over a Grand Slam champion (2 times over Thiem, 1 over Cilic, all on clay).
