TERRA WORTMANN OPEN TALKING POINTS

- World No. 1 and defending champion **Jannik Sinner** headlines 2025 **Terra Wortmann Open** field. Italian lifted his lone grass-court title at this venue last year (d. Hurkacz) and is 47-3 in his last 50 matches. 23-year-old aims to reach 9th consecutive final and looks to be 3rd player to defend Halle title after 3-time champion Kafelnikov (1997-98, 2002) and 10-time champion Federer (2003-06, 2008, 2013-15, 2017, 2019).
- German No. 1 Alexander Zverev is making his 9th appearance in Halle, highlighted by finals in 2016 (I. to F. Mayer) and 2017 (I. to Federer). He aims to advance to his 3rd consecutive Halle SF (2023-24) and is one of six 2025 ATP 500 champions in the Halle field, doing it on home soil in Munich in April. Zverev seeks 1st grass-court trophy of career after losing 3rd final in Stuttgart on Sunday.

- Zverev is joined by two German wildcards as Jan-Lennard Struff makes his 12th consecutive main draw appearance, having reached first Halle QF last year (I. to Sinner). Daniel Altmaier seeks first main draw win at the event after falling in 2021-22 1R. Remaining wildcard was awarded to 18-year-old Joao Fonseca, who is playing in his second ATP Tour event on grass after losing to Duckworth in Halle 1R last year.
- Last four **Terra Wortmann Open** champions are all in 2025 field with No. 1 seed Sinner, **Alexander Bublik**, **Hubert Hurkacz**, and No. 6 seed **Ugo Humbert**. Hurkacz defeated No. 1 Medvedev to claim 2022 title and lost to No. 1 Sinner in championship match last year. Humbert is making his first Halle appearance since 2022, while Bublik reached first Grand Slam QF at Roland Garros in his most recent tournament.
- No. 3 seed Daniil Medvedev was the finalist in Halle in 2022 (I. to Hurkacz), while No. 4 seed Andrey Rublev lost in finals to Humbert in 2021 and Bublik in 2023. Rublev seeks his first grass-court title with Medvedev looking to triumph on the surface for the first time since 2021 Mallorca. No. 5 seed Francisco Cerundolo is making his tournament debut and looks for 2nd grass-court title after 2023 Eastbourne.

Fabian Marozsan (HUN) vs Miomir Kecmanovic (SRB)

Fabian Marozsan | Age: 25 | World No. 58 | Career-High No. 36 | 2025: 15-14 (Munich SF) | Halle: 1-1 (2024 2R) > Broke into Top 200 in August 2022, Top 100 in June 2023 and earned career-high No. 36 in May 2024, becoming fourth Hungarian to break into Top 50 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973).

> In ATP Tour debut, defeated No. 2 Alcaraz for biggest win of career en route to 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome 4R as Q and reached 1st QF at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai (d. No. 9 Ruud in 4R).

> Upset No. 7 Rune in 2R and No. 10 de Minaur in 4R en route to 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Miami QF.

> Earned 1st Grand Slam main draw win at 2023 US Open (d. Gasquet) and reached 3R at 2024 and 2025 Australian Open.

> Owns 55-30 Challenger record (3-1 in finals), winning titles at 2022 Banja Luka, 2023 Antalya and 2023 Perugia and losing to compatriot Fucsovics in 2022 Bratislava-2 final.

> Began playing tennis at age 5 and credits his father for teaching him everything about the sport.

NOTE: Marozsan posted his lone grass-court ATP Tour win vs. No. 40 Safiullin in 1R last year before losing in 3 sets to No. 1 Sinner. In April, reached his 1st ATP Tour SF, doing so on German soil, losing to No. 3 Zverev in Munich SF.

M. Kecmanovic | Age: 25 | World No. 46 | Career-High No. 27 | 2025: 14-14 (Delray Beach Title) | Halle: 0-3 ('19, '22, '24 1R) > Broke into Top 40 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2020 Kitzbuhel and achieved career-high No. 27 in January 2023.

> Earned personal-best 38 wins in 2022, reaching Australian Open 4R, Roland Garros 3R and Wimbledon 3R.
> Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 QFs at 2019 Indian Wells as LL, 2022 Indian Wells and 2022 Miami, equaling biggest win of career in 2022 Indian Wells 4R vs. No. 6 Berrettini.

 > Beat Ruud and Davidovich Fokina to reach 2019 Next Gen ATP Finals SF (I. to eventual champion Sinner) and saved 2 championship points to defeat Davidovich Fokina for 2nd ATP Tour title at 2025 Delray Beach.
> Defeated Tsitsipas in 3rd-set TB to win 2015 Orange Bowl junior title, then ended 2016 as World No. 1 junior ahead of No. 2 Tsitsipas.

NOTE: Kecmanovic seeks first main draw win in Halle after losing in 1R to Khachanov in 2019, Otte in 2022, and Sonego in 2024. He is playing first match on grass since reaching Wimbledon 3R last year (I. to No. 1 Sinner).

Daniel Altmaier | Age: 26 | World No. 52 | Career-High No. 47 | 2025: 12-14 (2 QFs) | Halle: 0-2 (2021-22 1R)

> Made Top 50 debut a day before his 25th birthday in September, achieving career-high No. 47 in October 2023.

> Reached 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Madrid as a LL and defeated countryman No. 6 Zverev for biggest win of career at 2024 Acapulco.

> Made Grand Slam qualifying debut at 2020 Roland Garros and earned 6th win of tournament over No. 8 Berrettini to reach 4R and defeated No. 9 Sinner en route to 2023 Roland Garros 3R.

> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SFs of career in back-to-back weeks at Umag and Kitzbuhel in July 2021.

> Ended 2022 season with 13 wins in his last 14 Challenger matches, including back-to-back titles at Lima-2 and Guayaquil.

> Hits a one-handed backhand and says that his idols growing up were fellow one-handers Federer and Wawrinka.

NOTE: Altmaier looks for 1st grass-court ATP Tour win on home soil (0-4 in Halle and Stuttgart combined). He is 3-4 vs. Top 20 this year (7-19 overall), defeating No. 19 Fils in Rotterdam, No. 19 Auger-Aliassime at ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo and No. 4 Fritz at Roland Garros, and faces a Top 20 opponent on grass for the first time.

Daniil Medvedev | Age: 29 | World No. 11 | Career-High No. 1 | 2025: 19-12 (2 SFs) | Halle: 7-4 (2022 Final) > Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in 2004.

> Six-time Grand Slam finalist owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.

> Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).

> Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

> Won 18 of his 20 singles titles on hard courts and all 20 of his titles at different events, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami and 2023 Rome, his 1st title on clay.

NOTE: Medvedev looks to earn 20 tour-level wins for 9th consecutive season (2017-25). He is 17-2 vs. players ranked outside Top 50 on grass since 2018 Wimbledon, including I. to No. 87 Opelka in 's-Hertogenbosch last week. He is 18-2 vs. Germans since 2021 Wimbledon (including 8-2 vs. Zverev).

Bublik holds the upper hand with superior Serve Quality and In Attack metrics, while Muller aims to leverage his advantage in groundstroke shot quality to turn the tide.

Alexandre Muller | Age: 28 | World No. 40 | Career-High No. 39 | 2025: 17-13 (Hong Kong Title) | Halle: 0-0 ('21 Q1) > Broke into Top 500 in 2016, Top 250 in 2019, Top 100 in 2023 and achieved career-high No. 39 in April 2025 soon after advancing to biggest final of career in Rio de Janeiro.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Hong Kong, becoming 3rd man in Open Era to win a tour-level title by rallying from a set down in all matches played after Ashe at 1975 WCT Finals and Bublik at 2024 Montpellier.

> Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Musetti en route to 1st SF and final at 2023 Marrakech and earned Top 10 wins over No. 6 Rublev at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Rome and No. 3 Zverev at 2025 Hamburg.

> Made tour-level debut at 2017 Roland Garros as WC (I. to Monteiro) and won 1st tour-level match at 2021 Australian Open as LL, beating Londero in 1R.

> Owns 140-123 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning 1st title at 2022 Blois after saving a MP in his 1R match.
> Had a tennis court at his childhood home and began playing with his dad at age 6 and says he was better at football than tennis before choosing the latter.

NOTE: Muller is playing his first tour-level match on grass outside Wimbledon (2023-24 2R) and seeks first Top 50 win on the surface after losing to No. 1 Alcaraz in 2023 Wimbledon 1R and No. 5 Medvedev in 2024 Wimbledon 1R. French No. 4 aims to earn personal-best 18th win of the season (17 in 2024 & 2025).

Alexander Bublik | Age: 27 | World No. 43 | Career-High No. 17 | 2025: 11-14 (2 QFs) | Halle: 6-1 (2023 Title) > Achieved career-high No. 17 in May 2024 after becoming the 1st ATP Tour champion (since ATP Tour was established in 1990) to come back from a set down in every match en route to his 4th title in Montpellier. > Defeated five Top 25 players in as many matches including No. 9 Sinner in QF and No. 7 Rublev in final to earn biggest of 4 ATP Tour titles at 2023 Halle.

Earned biggest win of career over No. 3 A. Zverev in 2022 Montpellier final for 1st ATP Tour title in 5th final.
Defeated No. 9 de Minaur from 0-2 in sets and No. 6 Draper en route to 1st Grand Slam QF at 2025 Roland Garros.
In doubles, advanced to 2021 Roland Garros final with countryman Golubev and 2020 Australian Open SF with countryman Kukushkin.

NOTE: Bublik won biggest title of career in Halle two years ago before losing to Eubanks in 2024 2R. In most recent event, became first man representing Kazakhstan to reach a Grand Slam quarter-final at Roland Garros, including wins over No. 9 de Minaur in 2R (from 2 sets down) and No. 5 Draper in 4R.

Stefanos Tsitsipas (GRE) vs Luciano Darderi (ITA)

First Meeting

Stefanos Tsitsipas | Age: 26 | World No. 26 | Career-High No. 3 | 2025: 18-11 (Dubai Title) | Halle: 4-4 ('18, '22-'24 2R) > Top-ranked Greek of all time achieved career-high No. 3 in August 2021 and boasts 11 wins vs. Top-3 opponents (2 vs. No. 1, 4 vs. No. 2, 5 vs. No. 3).

> Six-time Grand Slam semi-finalist, highlighted by runs to 2021 Roland Garros and 2023 Australian Open finals, losing to Djokovic on both occasions.

> Captured 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals title at age 20 and 2019 Nitto ATP Finals title at age 21, becoming youngest champion of latter since Hewitt, 20, in 2001.

> Won 12 ATP Tour titles, including 2021, 2022 and 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo and captured 1st ATP 500 title in 12th final at 2025 Dubai.

> Youngest of 30 players to defeat Djokovic (2018 Toronto 3R), Federer (2019 Australian Open 4R) and Nadal (2019 Madrid SF), sweeping Big 3 before turning 21.

Bonzi Leads 2-0

NOTE: Tsitsipas is unseeded at an event for the first time since 2018 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati. He won his last 8 opening-round matches since losing to Medjedovic in Doha in February and is 4-0 in Halle opening rounds.

Luciano Darderi | Age: 23 | World No. 48 | Career-High No. 32 | 2025: 13-13 (Marrakech Title) | Halle: 0-1 (2024 1R) > Former Top 10 junior started 2024 season as No. 128, then broke into Top 100 in February, Top 50 in May and achieved career-high No. 32 in August.

> Captured his 1st ATP Tour title in Cordoba, defeating Bagnis in 3rd final between two qualifiers since the ATP Tour was established in 1990 and won 2nd title at 2025 Marrakech.

> Owns 90-60 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning titles at 2023 Todi, 2023 Lima-2 and 2024 Perugia.

Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings in February 2020 after earning 3 singles and 3 doubles titles to start the season.
Born in Argentina, started playing tennis at age 4 with his father Luciano Enrique, a former tennis player and current coach.

NOTE: Darderi is 1-2 vs. Top 50 on grass after defeating No. 48 Martinez in Mallorca 1R last June and is 1-7 vs. Top 30 opponents this year, lone win over No. 29 Nakashima in Hamburg 2R last month. He missed 1 MP in 7-6(2) 5-7 6-7(10) loss vs. Struff in tournament debut last year.
