CINCINNATI OPEN TALKING POINTS

- World No. 2 **Carlos Alcaraz** leads the ATP Tour this season in wins (48) and titles (5) and opens campaign to grab his third consecutive ATP Masters 1000 title after wins in Monte-Carlo and Rome earlier this year. Alcaraz reached **Cincinnati Open** final two years ago, the only time he advanced past quarter-finals of any ATP Masters 1000 event held post-Wimbledon, and now begins his week vs. **Damir Dzumhur**.
- American No. 2 **Ben Shelton** enters Cincinnati as a newly crowned ATP Masters 1000 champion after capturing his first title at this level in Toronto on Thursday. He now attempts to become the first Canada champion to win his opening round in Cincinnati since Medvedev in 2021. He takes on **Camilo Ugo Carabelli**, who seeks first Top 20 win to be first Argentine in Cincinnati 3R since 2022 (also Comesana).
- No. 6 seed **Alex de Minaur** takes a 5-0 **Lexus ATP Head2Head** lead vs. **Reilly Opelka**. De Minaur, who aims to record 6 tour-level wins vs. an opponent for 3rd time (7-0 vs. Goffin, 6-0 vs. Murray), leads ATP Tour in hard-court wins in 2025 (24) and bids to pass Rafter for 2nd-most hard-court wins among Australian men in Open Era. Opelka seeks ATP Masters 1000 3R for 3rd time this season after Miami and Toronto last week.
- #NextGenATP** Americans are in action on **Grandstand**, as 19-year-old **Learner Tien** seeks another win over World No. 11 **Andrey Rublev** after defeating him in Washington 2R three weeks ago. 20-year-old **Nishesh Basavareddy** seeks 1st Top 10 win vs. No. 3 **Alexander Zverev**. Zverev is one of 3 former champions still in the draw (also Medvedev, Sinner) after winning 2021 title (0-6 at the event prior to 2021, 12-2 since).

Damir Dzumhur | Age: 33 | World No. 56 | Career-High No. 23 | 2025: 18-17 (2 SFs) | Cincinnati: 1-1 (2025 2R)

> Broke into Top 100 in 2015 and Top 50 in 2017 before winning 3rd ATP Tour title at 2018 Antalya to achieve career-high No. 23.

> Earned personal-best 36 victories in 2017, highlighted by biggest wins of career over No. 3 Wawrinka at Dubai and No. 4 A. Zverev at Shenzhen.

- > Advanced to Grand Slam 3R on 6 occasions, including at 2018 Roland Garros, where he led No. 3 A. Zverev by 2 sets to 1 and held 1 MP before losing.
- > Reached ATP Masters 1000 R16 on 3 occasions, including at 2016 Miami, where he defeated No. 5 Nadal in 2R.
- > Went 6-0 in finals on ATP Challenger Tour in 2024, tying with 5 other players for 2nd-most Challenger titles in a single season behind Griekspoor (8 in 2021).

NOTE: Dzumhur is 4-20 vs. Top 10 (0-8 vs. Top-2), looking for the biggest win of career and first Top 10 win since defeating No. 4 Zverev at 2017 Shenzhen. He attempts to reach ATP Masters 1000 3R for fifth time in career after 2016 Miami, 2016 Monte-Carlo, 2018 Paris and Madrid in April this year.

Carlos Alcaraz | Age: 22 | World No. 2 | Career-High No. 1 | 2025: 48-6 (5 Titles) | Cincinnati: 6-4 (2023 Final)

- > Youngest and first teenage World No. 1 and year-end No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), making record rise from No. 32 at end of 2021 to No. 1 at age 19 in September 2022, earning total of 36 weeks.
- > Beat Ruud in 2022 US Open final for No. 1 ranking, becoming youngest men's champion at US Open since Sampras, 19, in 1990 and at any Grand Slam event since Nadal, 19, at 2005 Roland Garros.
- > Won 2024 Roland Garros to become youngest man to win Grand Slam titles on all three surfaces and saved 3 championship points in longest Roland Garros final in tournament history to defend the title at 2025 Roland Garros.
- > Defeated 7-time champion Djokovic in 2023 and 2024 Wimbledon finals to be 2nd man in Open Era to win 1st four Grand Slam finals and became youngest Olympic men's finalist since 1904, earning silver medal at Paris Olympics.
- > Youngest player to defeat both Nadal and Djokovic and 1st to do so at same clay-court event, beating them on back-to-back days en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2022 Madrid.

NOTE: Alcaraz is on an 11-match winning streak at ATP Masters 1000 level after titles in Monte-Carlo and Rome earlier this year and is on a 33-2 run since playing his last hard-court match in March (l. to No. 55 Goffin in Miami 2R). He held 1 championship point in Cincinnati final two years ago before losing to Djokovic and to Monfils in 2R last year.

Shelton's key Insights during his win in Toronto was his significant increase in Return Quality from 6.4 to 7.1, and his much higher Steal Score, from 28% to 34%.

His 52wk Return Quality Score puts him at 50th in the world, but his score this week would have him in the world's Top 15 (if maintained across a year).

Whilst his 52wk Steal Score puts him in the bottom 10% in the world, but his score this week would have him in the Top 30 in the world (if maintained across a year).

Ben Shelton | Age: 22 | World No. 6 (Career-High) | 2025: 32-16 (Toronto Title) | Cincinnati: 6-3 (2024 QF)

- > Broke into Top 200 in August 2022, Top 100 in November 2022 and Top 20 in September 2023, achieving career-high No. 6 in August 2025 after capturing 1st ATP Masters 1000 title in Toronto.
- > Defeated countrymen Paul and Tiafoe en route to 2023 US Open SF, becoming youngest American man in US Open SF since Chang, 20, in 1992 and beat No. 4 Sinner for 1st of 3 ATP Masters 1000 QFs at 2023 Shanghai.
- > Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2023 Tokyo, joining Bryan Shelton as 4th father-son duo to win a tour-level championship in Open Era (Phil & Taylor Dent, Ramanathan & Ramesh Krishnan, Petr & Sebastian Korda).
- > Advanced to 2023 Australian Open QF at age 20 and on his 1st trip outside USA, becoming youngest American man in Aus. Open QF since Giammalva Jr., 19, in 1982, and in Grand Slam QF since Roddick, 20, at 2002 US Open.
- > Posted 65-10 singles record in 2 seasons for University of Florida, clinching 2021 NCAA team title and 2022 NCAA singles title while being coached by his father Bryan, a former World No. 55.

NOTE: Shelton is on a 6-match winning streak after capturing 1st ATP Masters 1000 title in Toronto and aims to become the fourth man this season to record 20 hard-court wins this year. 22-year-old owns 10-0 record vs. Argentines in his career. He made his ATP Masters 1000 debut at 2023 Cincinnati and beat No. 5 Ruud in 2R.

Camilo Ugo Carabelli | Age: 26 | World No. 47 (Career-High) | 2025: 17-17 (4 SFs) | Cincinnati: 1-0 (2025 2R)
 > Broke into Top 200 in January 2022 and Top 100 in August 2022 and achieved career-high No. 47 in July 2025 after reaching back-to-back ATP Tour SFs in Bastad and Umag.
 > Entered 2025 Rio de Janeiro as LL after squandering 4 MPs in qualifying and advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF, defeating Faria in second quarter-final between lucky losers since the ATP Tour was established in 1990.
 > Did not drop a set to qualify for 2022 Roland Garros, then won 5th-set TB vs. Karatsev in tour-level debut.
 > Posted 49-16 Challenger record in 2024, leading all players for most Challenger wins that year, highlighted by titles in Piracicaba, Santa Cruz and Villa Maria.

NOTE: Ugo Carabelli is 0-5 vs. Top 10, aiming to record the biggest win of career to reach an ATP Masters 1000 3R for second time after Miami 3R in March this year. He aims to join F. Cerundolo (4) and Comesana (1) as only Argentines to earn a Top 10 win this season.

Alex de Minaur | Age: 26 | World No. 8 | Career-High No. 6 | 2025: 37-14 (Washington Title) | Cincinnati: 5-5 ('19 3R)
 > Two-time Next Gen ATP Finals runner-up achieved career-high No. 6 in July 2024 before becoming 1st Australian to qualify for Nitto ATP Finals in singles since Hewitt in 2004.
 > Earned personal-best 47 victories in 2022 and 2024 and won 10 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500 championships in Acapulco in 2023 and 2024 and in Washington in 2025 after saving 3 championship points vs. Davidovich Fokina.
 > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2020 US Open immediately after winning 1st ATP Tour doubles title at 2020 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati w/Carreno Busta in team debut and at same venue.
 > Also advanced to four consecutive Grand Slam QFs at 2024 Roland Garros, Wimbledon, US Open and 2025 Australian Open and reached 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF, SF and final at 2023 Toronto.
 > Playing for Australia, he went 6-1 in Davis Cup play during 2022 season, leading Australia to its 1st final since 2003 and defeated No. 2 Nadal in 2023 and No. 1 Djokovic in 2024 at United Cup.

NOTE: de Minaur leads the ATP Tour in hard court wins this season (24) and is on a 7-1 run during this summer hard court swing after winning Washington title and advancing to Toronto QF. Australian No. 1 is the only player to reach round of 16 at all ATP Masters 1000 events this season, highlighted by run to Monte-Carlo SF (13-6 in 2025).

Reilly Opelka | Age: 27 | World No. 73 | Career-High No. 17 | 2025: 22-16 (Brisbane Final) | Cincinnati: 6-5 (2020 QF)
 > Former Wimbledon junior champion became No. 1 American in June 2021 and achieved career-high No. 17 in February 2022 before undergoing hip surgery later that year.
 > Defeated Isner for 4th ATP 250 title on American soil at 2022 Houston after beating him 7-6(7) 7-6(22) en route to 2022 Dallas title, winning longest tiebreak in ATP Tour history (since 1990).
 > At 2020 Delray Beach, saved 1 MP vs. Raonic and defeated Nishioka on same day to win 2nd title.
 > At 2019 New York, saved 6 MPs and hit 43 aces vs. Isner in SF, then hit 43 more aces vs. Schnur in final to win 1st title.
 > Upset No. 3 Tsitsipas at 2021 Toronto for biggest win of career and to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 final and defeated No. 7 Djokovic en route to 2025 Brisbane final to break Serbian's 34-match winning streak vs. Americans.

NOTE: Opelka is 8-13 vs. Top 10, including win over No. 7 Djokovic en route to Brisbane final in January. He aims to avoid losing 6 matches vs. one opponent in Lexus ATP Head2Head for first time (0-5 vs. de Minaur, 1-5 vs. Fritz, 2-5 vs. Medvedev) to reach Cincinnati 3R for 2nd time in 6th main draw appearance (2020 QF, d. No. 8 Berrettini in 3R). He earned sole win over de Minaur in 2015 Wimbledon juniors 1R (13-11 in third) before going on to take the title.

Learner Tien | Age: 19 | World No. 55 (Career-High) | 2025: 17-17 (2 QFs) | Cincinnati: 1-0 (2025 2R)

> Broke into Top 200 in August 2024, Top 100 in January 2025 and achieved career-high No. 55 in August 2025 after reaching 1st ATP Masters 1000 4R in Toronto.
 > Upset No. 5 Medvedev en route to 2025 Australian Open 4R as Q to be youngest man to defeat a Top-5 player at that event in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973) before defeating No. 2 Zverev in Acapulco.
 > Qualified for 2024 Next Gen ATP Finals, defeating Top-3 seeds, No. 1 Fils and No. 3 Mensik in RR and No. 2 Michelsen in SF to become 1st left-handed finalist in event history.
 > Went on a 28-match winning streak from May to July 2024, capturing ITF Tour titles at M15 San Diego twice, M15 Rancho Santa Fe, M15 Lakewood and biggest title of career – 1st Challenger title in Bloomfield Hills.
 > Peaked at No. 4 in juniors, highlighted by runs to junior finals of 2023 Australian Open (l. to Blockx) and US Open (l. to Fonseca) and defeated Blockx/Fonseca to capture 2023 Australian Open boys' doubles title w/C. Williams.

NOTE: Tien is 5-3 vs. Top 20 in his career, looking for third consecutive win after defeating No. 10 Shelton in Mallorca 2R and No. 10 Rublev in Washington 2R at end of July. He aims to reach ATP Masters 1000 3R for 2nd time after advancing to Toronto 4R last week. He is No. 47 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#) as he seeks Top 50 debut this week.

Andrey Rublev | Age: 27 | World No. 11 | Career-High No. 5 | 2025: 26-18 (Doha Title) | Cincinnati: 10-7 (2021 Final)
> Former No. 1 junior broke into Top 20 in January 2020, Top 10 in October 2020 and Top 5 in September 2021.
> Rallied from a set down in both SF and final for 1st time in career at 2023 Monte-Carlo to capture 1st ATP Masters 1000 title and defeated two-time defending champion No. 3 Alcaraz en route to 2nd title at 2024 Madrid.
> Defeated No. 3 Nadal at 2021 Monte-Carlo, No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Cincinnati and No. 1 Sinner at 2024 Montreal en route to ATP Masters 1000 finals and beat No. 1 Djokovic for 11th of 17 ATP Tour titles at 2022 Belgrade.
> Led tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.
> Ten-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist reached 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF and won gold medal in All-ROC mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).
> Went 9-1 in singles and 4-1 in doubles at team events during 2021 season, sweeping titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

NOTE: Rublev is 4-6 at ATP Masters 1000 level this season, including 3 wins en route to Toronto QF last week. He is making his 8th consecutive appearance at the event, highlighted by wins over No. 3 Federer in 2019 3R as No. 70-ranked Q to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF and No. 2 Medvedev in 2021 SF.

[WC] Nishesh Basavareddy (USA) vs [3] Alexander Zverev (GER) First Meeting

Nishesh Basavareddy | Age: 20 | World No. 109 | Career-High No. 99 | 2025: 5-10 (Auckland SF) | Cincinnati: 1-0 ('25 2R)
> Peaked at No. 3 in junior rankings in January 2023, then broke Top 200 in September 2024, opting to leave college and turn professional in December 2024 and achieved career-high No. 99 in June 2025.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour SF at 2025 Auckland as Q, upsetting defending champion No. 23 Tabilo for biggest win of career in 2R and countryman Michelsen in QF.
> Made tour-level debut at 2024 Next Gen ATP Finals, going 1-2 in round robin, defeating No. 50 Shang for 1st win and Grand Slam main draw debut at 2025 Australian Open, losing to 10-time champion Djokovic in 1R.
> Owns 54-25 Challenger record (2-5 in finals), capturing titles at 2024 Tiburon and 2024 Puerto Vallarta .
> Spent two seasons playing college tennis for Stanford University, where he was a two-time ITA All-American.
> Won 2022 US Open boys' doubles title w/Baris, becoming fifth all-American team to win the US Open boys' doubles title this century.

NOTE: Basavareddy defeated Vukic in 1R for 1st ATP Masters 1000 win and now attempts to record biggest win of career (0-1 vs. Top 10, l. to No. 7 Djokovic in Aus. Open 1R). He bids to be the lowest-ranked player to defeat Zverev since No. 134 Murray defeated the German No. 1 in 2020 Cincinnati 2R (held in New York).

Alexander Zverev | Age: 28 | World No. 3 | Career-High No. 2 | 2025: 39-15 (Munich Title) | Cincinnati: 12-8 (2021 Title)
> Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal.
> Led ATP Tour with 6 titles in 2021 and leads all players born since 1990 with 24 career titles, defeating No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and 2021 Nitto ATP Finals championships.
> Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.
> Earned wins over 14-time champion Nadal en route to 2024 Roland Garros final and 10-time champion Djokovic via RET to reach 2025 Australian Open final.
> Defeated Djokovic at 2017 Rome and Federer at 2017 Montreal for 1st and 2nd of his 7 ATP Masters 1000 titles.
> Joined Murray and Thiem as 3rd player to defeat Djokovic on hard (3 times), Federer on grass (2016 Halle SF) and Nadal on clay (2 times).

NOTE: Zverev aims to become the second man this year to record 40 wins (after Alcaraz - 48) and aims to pass Dimitrov for most ATP Masters 1000 wins among players born in 1990 or later (155). German No. 1 has advanced to Cincinnati SF in his three most recent appearances (2021 title, 2022 did not play, 2023 SF, 2024 SF).

Jiri Lehecka | Age: 23 | World No. 26 | Career-High No. 22 | 2025: 28-16 (Brisbane Title) | Cincinnati: 2-2 ('24 3R)
 > Achieved career-high No. 22 in February 2025 after 8-0 start to year with Brisbane title and run to Aus. Open 4R.
 > Defeated No. 5 Rublev to reach 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2023 Doha and en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2024 Indian Wells before defeating No. 4 Medvedev via RET to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF at 2024 Madrid.
 > In Australia, earned wins over No. 12 Norrie and No. 7 Auger-Aliassime en route to 2023 Australian Open QF and captured both ATP Tour titles at 2024 Adelaide and 2025 Brisbane.
 > Reached 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 Rotterdam as Q after defeating No. 12 Shapovalov in 1R for 1st ATP Tour win.
 > Celebrated 21st birthday during 2022 Next Gen ATP Finals and finished as runner-up.
