[WC] William Rejchtman Vinciguerra vs Jesper de Jong (NED) First Meeting

William Rejchtman Vinciguerra | Age: 18 | World No. 1476 | Career-High No. 1450 | 2025: 0-0 | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut) > Earned 1st ranking point at age 17 in August 2024 and achieved career-high No. 1450 in September 2024.

> Made ATP Tour qualifying debut in 2024 Bastad losing to Virtanen in Q1 and is now making his ATP Tour debut at 2025 Bastad as WC.

> Yet to play an ATP Challenger match and earned best run on ITF Tour by reaching 2024 M15 Vaasa QF.

> Peaked at No. 13 in junior rankings in January this year after runs to Australian Open boys' singles quarter-final and boys' doubles semi-final w/De Marchi.

> His uncle is Andreas Vinciguerra, a former professional tennis player with career-high ranking of No. 33, who reached 1999 Bastad final at 18 years of age.

NOTE: Rejchtman Vinciguerra is playing in his 1st tour-level match, seeking the biggest win of career against No. 106 de Jong. He would be the youngest man to record a main draw win in Bastad since Rune in 2021 (d. Albot) and 2nd-youngest Swede this century after E. Ymer in 2014 (d. Kukushkin).

Jesper de Jong | Age: 25 | World No. 106 | Career-High No. 87 | 2025: 8-8 (Montpellier SF) | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut) > Broke into Top 500 in 2019, Top 200 in 2022 and Top 100 in March 2025, earning career-high No. 87 in May 2025 after advancing to 3R of ATP Masters 1000 Rome.

> Defeated countryman Griekspoor en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2025 Montpellier and No. 26 Davidovich Fokina for biggest win of career to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 3R at 2025 Rome.

> Made ATP Tour debut at 2022 's-Hertogenbosch as WC and earned 1st tour-level win at 2024 Australian Open over Cachin as Q in his Grand Slam main draw debut.

> Went 9-2 in Grand Slam qualifying in 2024, entering draw as Q at both Australian Open and Roland Garros and losing to eventual champions Sinner and Alcaraz in 2R.

> Owns 108-75 Challenger record (3-5 in finals) and came from qualifying to earn 1st final and title at 2021 Almaty-2.

NOTE: de Jong is making his tournament debut and aiming to be the first Dutchman to win a match in Bastad since de Bakker reached the SF in 2013 (I. to Berlocq). He earned 4 of 8 tour-level wins this year on clay, highlighted by run to 3R of ATP Masters 1000 Rome as LL.

Raphael Collignon (BEL) vs [6] Luciano Darderi (ITA)

First Meeting

Raphael Collignon | Age: 23 | World No. 84 | Career-High No. 81 | 2025: 1-4 (Marrakech 2R) | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut) > Broke into Top 100 in February 2025 and achieved career-high No. 81 in April after posting 1st ATP Tour win over former-World No. 9 Fognini in Marrakech 1R.

> Made his tour-level debut in 2024 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage, losing to van de Zandschulp and Fonseca.

> Defeated No. 84 van de Zandschulp to win 1st Challenger title at 2024 Luedenscheid and No. 97 Coric en route to 2nd title at Lyon (Décines-Charpieu).

> Coached by Belgium's Davis Cup captain and former World No. 38 Steve Darcis.

> Injured his thumb in Hamburg, a week before 2025 Roland Garros, to delay his Grand Slam main draw debut, before playing in his 1st Grand Slam main draw at 2025 Wimbledon (I. to Cilic).

NOTE: Collignon defeated Fognini in Marrakech in April for lone ATP Tour win of career. He now seeks biggest win of career over No. 55 Darderi to become 1st Belgian match winner in Bastad since his coach, Darcis, reached 2015 QF.

Luciano Darderi | Age: 23 | World No. 55 | Career-High No. 32 | 2025: 15-17 (Marrakech Title) | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut) > Former Top 10 junior started 2024 season as No. 128, then broke into Top 100 in February, Top 50 in May and achieved career-high No. 32 in August.

> Captured his 1st ATP Tour title in Cordoba, defeating Bagnis in 3rd final between two qualifiers since the ATP Tour was established in 1990 and won 2nd title at 2025 Marrakech.

> Also advanced to ATP Tour SFs at 2024 Houston and 2024 Lyon and to 1st Grand Slam 3R at 2025 Wimbledon.

> Owns 90-61 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning titles at 2023 Todi, 2023 Lima-2 and 2024 Perugia.

> Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings in February 2020 after earning 3 singles and 3 doubles titles to start the season.

> Born in Argentina, started tennis at age 4 with his father Luciano Enrique, a former tennis player and current coach.

NOTE: Darderi is playing in his 10th tour-level event on clay in 2025 highlighted by winning his 2nd ATP Tour title in Marrakech in April. He is 11-1 vs. players ranked outside Top 30 on the surface on tour-level this season (I. to No. 87 Faria in Santiago 1R).
