- > **Ranking:** The Serbian player has finished 3 straight seasons in Top 100 and 6 straight in Top 200 (2011-16). Achieved career-high No. 57 on Oct. 27, 2014 after winning 1R match at Valencia (d. Sousa). Broke into Top 100 on Feb. 10, 2014 after winning 1R match at Zagreb (d. Krstin). Fell outside Top 100 for 9 weeks in summer of 2015 before returning with Challenger title at Banja Luka, BIH.
- > **Milestones:** Reached 1st 3 ATP World Tour SFs in 2016 at São Paulo (d. Paire in 2R, l. to Cuevas), Kitzbühel (l. to Basilashvili) and Los Cabos (d. Tomic in 2R, retvs. Karlovic). Lost 1st 8 ATP QFs from Oct. 2011 to Feb. 2016. Owns 1-1 record in doubles finals, winning title at 2015 Istanbul w/Albot (d. Lindstedt/Melzer) and finishing as runner-up at 2014 Umag w/Skugor (d. Cuevas/Zeballos, l. to Cermak/Rosol). Winner of 4 Challenger and 5 Futures singles titles, most recently sweeping all 10 sets at 2015 Banja Luka, BIH Challenger (d. Hanescu). After going 0-6 on tour in 2013, won 16 matches in 2014, 17 in 2015 and 19 in 2016. Made ATP debut at 2010 Belgrade as WC (l. to Karlovic) and earned 1st ATP win at 2011 World Team Cup (d. Andreev). Owns records of 85-54 at Challengers and 90-51 at Futures.
- > **Grand Slams:** Advanced to 3R and 4R of a Grand Slam event for 1st time at 2014 Roland Garros (d. Delbonis, Zopp and Sock; l. to eventual champion Nadal). After falling in Grand Slam qualifying 7 times, made main draw debut at 2014 Australian Open as Q (d. Pouille, l. to

Nishikori in 2R). Also won 1R matches at 2014 Wimbledon (d. Garcia-Lopez in 5 sets, l. to Kubot), 2015 Roland Garros (d. M. Gonzalez, l. to eventual champion Wawrinka), 2016 Australian Open (d. Querrey, l. to Bautista Agut in 5 sets) and 2016 Roland Garros (d. Kudla, l. to Troicki).
> **ATP Masters 1000:** After qualifying at 2014 Indian Wells (l. to Rosol in 1R), earned 1st ATP Masters 1000 win at 2014 Miami as LL (d. Lu, l. to Dolgoplov 76 in 3rd). Qualified at 2015 Rome (l. to Monaco in 1R) and 2015 Paris (d. Mahut, l. to Goffin in 2R). Also reached 2R at 2016 Miami (d. Novikov, l. to Cilic).

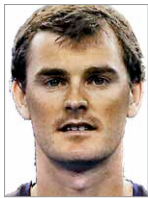

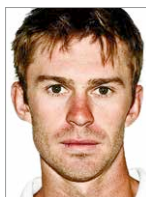
