- > ATP Finals:** Debuted in 2016 by reaching final w/Klaasen (d. Murray/Soares, l. to Kontinen/Peers). First American finalist other than Bryans since 2001 champion Leach.
- > Milestones:** Captured both of his ATP singles titles at Newport - as 181st-ranked LL in 2009 (d. Querrey) and World No. 161 in 2015 (d. Karlovic 76 in 3rd). Also in 2015, saved MPs and beat both Isner and Mannarino 76 in 3rd. Winner of 10 ATP doubles titles, including 2009 Newport w/Kerr (d. 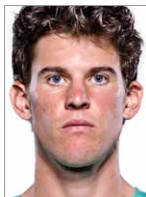

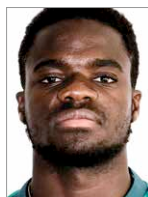
