- > Achieved career-high No. 23 on 29 April 2019 soon after reaching Monte-Carlo final. Posted 20+ wins and finished as No. 2 Serbian in 2 straight seasons (2018-19). Ended 6 straight years in Top 100 (2014-19).
- > Earned biggest win of career over No. 5 Thiem and did not drop a set en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2019 Monte-Carlo. As World No. 48, became lowest-ranked Monte-Carlo finalist since No. 53 Arazzi in 2001. Owns 38 Top 10 wins -- most among active players never ranked in Top 10. Defeated No. 1 Nadal in 2010 London/Queen's Club QF and No. 1 Djokovic in 2016 Dubai QF.
- > Advanced to Wimbledon QF in 2005, 2008 and 2011, as well as US Open QF in 2015. Appeared at all-time record 71 straight Grand Slam events (2002-19). Defeated No. 1 seeds and previous 3 champions to win 2016 Roland Garros doubles title w/M. Lopez. Also reached 2017 US Open doubles final w/M. Lopez.
- > Reached ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai SF in 2009, 2011 and 2014, as well as ATP Masters 1000 Toronto SF in 2014. Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 doubles finals at 2014 Rome w/ Haase and 2017 Monte-Carlo w/M. Lopez.
- > Four-time Davis Cup champion (2008-09, 2011, 2019). Clinched 2009 title by winning doubles rubber w/Verdasco in final (d.

Berdych/Stepanek) -- 1 of only 2 losses suffered by Berdych/Stepanek in Davis Cup (16-2).

>Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals in 5 straight years w/Herbert (2015-19). Did not drop a set en route to 2019 title after squandering championship point in 2018.

>Won 27 of his 28 doubles titles with countrymen, including ATP Finals, all 4 Grand Slams and 7 of 9 ATP Masters 1000s in 5 years as a team w/Herbert. Bryan/Bryan needed 9 years to accomplish same feat in 2007.
